PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Alante Fenner, G, Savannah State

Fenner had an explosive weekend for the MEAC-leading Tigers as he averaged 31.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and two steals. He opened the weekend with a SSU Division I school single game record of 46 points while grabbing seven rebounds in a win over Morgan State. Against North Carolina A&T State on Monday night, Fenner scored 17 points with two steals as the win over the Aggies gave the Tigers a two-game lead in the MEAC standings. Fenner was near-perfect from the free throw line as he nailed 24-of-27 free throws for an average of 88.9 percent.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

R.J. Cole, G, Howard

Cole averaged 27 points, six assists, 4.5 rebounds and two steals as the Bison finished with a 1-1 mark. He secured his fifth 30-point performance on Monday at Morgan State while scoring 24 points to go along with eight assists and five rebounds in Saturday's win over Florida A&M.

Mirryne Thomas, F, Maryland Eastern Shore

Thomas nearly averaged a double-double with 19.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in the past two contests for Maryland Eastern Shore. He scored 21 points with eight rebounds at Bethune-Cookman while scoring 18 points with 11 rebounds at Howard.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Shawntrez Davis, F, Bethune-Cookman

Davis averaged nine rebounds and 2.5 blocks as the Wildcats finished with a 2-0 mark. Versus Maryland Eastern Shore, Davis grabbed 11 rebounds with a blocked shot and returned to the court on Monday with a nine-rebound, four-block performance versus North Carolina Central.

Jahir Cabeza, F, Savannah State

Cabeza led the MEAC with eight total blocks in two games while averaging 5.5 rebounds. In Saturday's win over Morgan State, Cabeza swatted six shots along with six rebounds and three steals while blocking a pair of shots and five rebounds in Monday's win over North Carolina A&T State.

Topsy Turvy

Morgan State was picked to win it all entering the season but after the halfway point, the Bears' chances are slim due to the fact that they're five games behind leader Savannah State.

At this point in the standings, only one team that was picked in the top five of the preseason poll remains in the top five (Norfolk State).

Second-place North Carolina A&T State was picked 13th while leader Savannah State was picked fifth. Bethune-Cookman, which is in second, was picked ninth while North Carolina Central and N.C. Central were picked second and third, respectively. NCAT is a half-game ahead of BCU while Hampton is a half-game ahead of Norfolk State. NCCU is a half-game behind Norfolk State.

Shift In Firepower

Last season, the MEAC returned a plethora of scorers from the previous season as four of the top 10 scorers from 2015-16 returned for the 2016-17 campaign.

The 2017-18 campaign started out with more firepower as five of last year's top 10 scorers return led by Morgan State's **Tiwian Kindley** (21 ppg), Bethune-Cookman's **Brandon Tabb** (17.8 ppg), Morgan State's **Phillip Carr** (16.6 ppg), Savannah State's **Dexter McClanahan** (16.4 ppg) and Florida A&M's **Desmond Williams** (16.2 ppg).

Of the current top 10, Tabb, McClanahan and Williams are the only returnees from last year who are back in the scoring mix. Kendley would lead the league with his 25 points per game scoring average but has not played in 75 percent of his team's games.

Something About Hampton

If a coach wants to jump start a career, its best to swing by Hampton University as three coaches in the MEAC have either served or are serving as a head coach for the Pirates.

Maryland Eastern Shore's **Bobby Collins** coached there from 2002-06 while Howard's **Kevin Nickelberry** began his career there in 2006 and coached there until 2009 before giving way to current coach **Ed Joyner, Jr.**

All-Time Marks

With the exception of Florida A&M, every team in the MEAC has won a regular season title since its inception. Every team with the exception of Savannah State, Bethune-Cookman and Maryland Eastern Shore has participated in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament.

North Carolina A&T State has 11 regular season titles followed by 10 from Coppin State and seven from South Carolina State.

Non-Conference Report

Last season, the MEAC finished 42-129 (.246 pct.) versus non-conference opponents. They were a perfect 10 versus NAIA programs, 7-1 against NCAA Division II opponents and 5-0 against NCAA Division III opponents. The MEAC picked up major college wins against teams from the Big East, Pac 12 and SEC.

Have To Go Through Norfolk State

The Norfolk State Spartans are the model of consistency for the MEAC as the Spartans have posted 19 consecutive seasons with a .500 or better conference record in its Division I era.

The Spartans also continued their streak of finishing no worse than tied for third each of the last six years, the only program in the league to do so. NSU is just one of 14 schools in the nation to finish in the top 3 in the league standings each of the last six years.

NSU also boasts the lone active MEAC NBA player in **Kyle O'Quinn** as he plays for the New York Knicks.

After a slow start and with the tournament approaching, the Spartans are back in the mix as they're in fifth but only 1.5 games out of second place.

Darkhorse

Hampton enters this season somewhat under the radar despite returning an experienced squad and one of the MEAC's most exciting sophomores in **Jermaine Marrow**.

The Pirates finished third last season under current coach **Ed Joyner, Jr.** and have finished no less than sixth since 2011-12.

The Pirates once again are going to have some say in the outcome of the MEAC race as they've won five of the past six games.

Sophomore Sensation

Howard's **Charles Williams** enters with high expectations as he's coming off a freshman campaign that saw him average 15.6 points per game. Williams is back to form as he's averaging 20 points per game this season.

The 2016-17 MEAC Rookie of the Year is the top rookie back from last season's all-rookie team which returns four of its five members.

Is It The Water?

While the MEAC spans seven states and Washington, D.C., one area in particular has become fertile recruiting ground for the conference as several of the MEAC's top scorers hail from this area.

The Hampton Roads and Richmond, Va. area has proven to be a productive area as three of the top 15 scorers in the MEAC from last season are from the area in **Brandon Tabb** of Bethune-Cookman (Hampton), **Charles Williams** (Howard/Richmond), **Jermaine Marrow** (Hampton/Newport News).

Threes Please

The MEAC is an exciting place to watch the long ball.

Howard's **RJ Cole** leads the way with 91 treys followed by **Donte Wright** of South Carolina State (79) and **Lamar Morgan** (79) of Coppin State. **Brandon Tabb** of Bethune-Cookman follows with 77.

As a team, Savannah State leads the way with 319 three-pointers made and 1,048 three-point attempts.

Welcome To The MEAC

The MEAC features a trio of new head coaches as **Juan Dixon** takes over at Coppin State while **Robert McCullum** assumes the reigns at Florida A&M. **Ryan Ridder** assumes command of the Wildcat basketball program in Bethune-Cookman. Out of the trio, Ridder has had the most success early on as BCU is a half-game out of second place.

Cole-Blooded Freshmen

Howard freshman **R.J. Cole** arrived to the Howard campus with an abundance of fanfare from high school and has lived up to the hype so far as he's averaging 23.7 points after 27 games and an 11-time MEAC Rookie of the Week.

While Cole has come on strong, fellow freshman **Mirryne Thomas** of Maryland Eastern Shore (11.6 ppg) and NCCU's **Reginald Gardner, Jr.'s** 11.4 points per game ranks second and third amongst freshmen followed by

Surprise, Surprise

After winning four games in 2016-17, North Carolina A&T State has surpassed its output from the previous season as the Aggies are 15-9 with two non-conference road wins at Jacksonville and East Carolina. The Aggies are 15-11 overall and second in the MEAC with an 8-3 mark.

Savannah State has emerged as a darkhorse in the MEAC standings with a 10-1 mark. The Tigers have opened up a two-game lead over North Carolina A&T State.

Double Trouble

Morgan State's **Phillip Carr** leads the MEAC with 13 double-doubles on the season while BCU's **Shawntrez Davis** and **Soufiyane Diakite** follows with 11 and nine, respectively. North Carolina Central's **Raasean Davis** has eight double-doubles on the season.

Inside Play

Based on the returns from this year's play, the MEAC looks to have solid inside play in addition to its consistent guard play with three players averaging eight or more rebounds.

Morgan State's **Philip Carr** and Bethune-Cookman's **Soufiyane Diakite** and rank 1-2 with 9.7 and 9.3 rebounds per game, respectively. Fellow BCU teammate **Shawntrez Davis** follows with 8.8 rebounds.

North Carolina Central's **Raasean Davis** ranks third nationally in field goal percentage with a 69.4 percent clip. **Brandon Tabb** of BCU ranks 3rd with a 93.2 percent free throw average.

Howard's **RJ Cole** stands first in total field goal attempts (504, sixth with 23.7 points per game, 17th in total assists with 159, first in total minutes and 12th in free throws made (134).

Charles Williams of Howard ranks seventh in total field goals made with 206 and seventh in total field goal attempts (460).

It's Early But....

Even though its early, this year's MEAC race has the potential to come down to the final buzzer in early March. In the first week alone, nine of the first 15 games played in the MEAC have been decided by six points or less. In week two, five of the 12 games played that weekend were decided by six points or less. Week three featured another close bout of games with seven games decided by six or less points while week four had four games decided by the aforementioned span. Week five had four games decided by five points or less while week six had four games.



Oh So Close

Howard University has been on the rough end of the ledger in MEAC play as the Bison have lost four games by eight points or less, including consecutive overtime games. The Bison finally stepped into the winner's column in typical Bison fashion with a pair of overtime wins over North Carolina A&T State and North Carolina Central on the weekend of Jan. 20. Howard has played five overtime games as of Feb. 12.

Maryland Eastern Shore has also struggled towards the end as the Hawks have lost seven league games by a combined 39 points.

Coppin State has quietly emerged after a slow start with wins in four of the past seven games.

Over, Over and Over

MEAC fans have received plenty of free action this season with a total of 17 overtime games in conference contests. Howard leads the way with five OT games.

We Can Score & Share Also

A pair of high scorers in the MEAC also have done a solid job of distributing the ball as Howard's **R.J. Cole** leads the MEAC with 5.9 assists per game along with Hampton's **Jermaine Marrow** (5.6). North Carolina Central's **Jordan Perkins** and North Carolina A&T State's **Kameron Langley** are tied for third with 4.9 assists. Bethune-Cookman's **Malik Maitland** is fifth with 4.7 while Maryland Eastern Shore's **Logan McIntosh** ranks sixth (4.6).

Return With a Vengeance

Morgan State's **Tiwian Kendley** has returned to the court with a vengeance as he's averaging 25.8 points in 14 games played. He has scored 30-plus points during a four-game span this season.

Don't Count Them Out

Last year's MEAC runner-up Norfolk State had to make adjustments on the fly entering the start of the 2017-18 campaign. The Spartans best two returnees in point guard **Zaynah Robinson** and forward **Jordan Butler** are red-shirting coupled with the loss of their top scorer due to graduation.

In Our Prayers

South Carolina State suffered an unfortunate setback on Dec. 2 when guard **Ty Solomon** collapsed at North Carolina State. Solomon was released from the hospital several days later and visited the team the same day he was released.

2018 ESPN TV Schedule

Four regular season games and 23 tournament games on the ESPN family of networks highlights the 2018 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference men's basketball TV schedule.

The schedule tipped off on Monday, Feb. 5 as defending MEAC regular season and tournament North Carolina Central hosts Hampton for a 7 p.m. start. Despite losing the core of last year's team to graduation, the Eagles look to have offset the departures with solid play in non-conference action. The second week of action features Delaware State at 2016-17 MEAC regular season and tournament runner-up Norfolk State on Feb. 12 at 7 p.m.

North Carolina Central is back on the tubes once again two weeks later as they'll welcome Howard to Durham, N.C. on Feb. 19. The final ESPNU regular season contest tips off on Monday, Feb. 26 as Norfolk State travels to Howard.

The entire 2018 MEAC Tournament (men's & women's) will be shown live on ESPN3. In addition to the ESPN3 broadcast, the men's championship game will broadcast live on ESPN2 at 1 p.m. on Saturday, March 11 while the women's contest will rebroadcast on ESPNU at 12 p.m. on Sunday, March 12.

Did You Know?

- The MEAC was founded in 1970 kicking off its first season of competition in football in 1971.

- On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the NCAA; prior to that year, the conference had operated on the Division II level.

- The MEAC has enjoyed tremendous athletic success over the years. In 2008, Maryland Eastern Shore defeated Arkansas State 4-2 to win the NCAA Women's Bowling National Championship, a first for both the conference and the institution. With the victory, Lady Hawks head coach **Sharon Brummell** became the first female head coach to win an NCAA bowling title. The Lady Hawks repeated the feat in 2011, winning the school's second NCAA bowling title; during that same season, MDES won the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Intercollegiate Team Championship (ITC), becoming the first team to win two national championships in the same year. Eastern Shore won its third NCAA title in 2012.

- In the annual NCAA men's basketball tournament, the No. 15 seed has defeated the No. 2 seed a total of seven times. The MEAC has three of those wins in Coppin State (1997), Hampton (2001) and Norfolk State (2015).

- In 2003, Florida A&M became the first MEAC school to win a volleyball match in the NCAA Championships with a first-round victory over Winthrop. In 2004, the Lady Rattlers became the first HBCU to rank in the Top 25 of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) national poll.

- In 2015, the MEAC combined with the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) for the Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, Ga. The MEAC leads the bowl 2-1.

- The MEAC has showcased over 30 athletes in the Olympics over the years, and 13 of them have earned medals during the Summer Games.

- In softball, Bethune-Cookman earned the MEAC's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Softball Championship in 2005. The Lady Wildcats defeated Florida, Central Florida and South Florida in the Florida Regional to become the first MEAC program to win an NCAA Division I Softball Regional. Bethune-Cookman ended the 2005 season with the conference's first-ever national ranking, reaching No. 18 in the season's final NFCA/USA Today Coaches poll and No. 23 in the USA Softball/ESPN.com poll.

2017-18 PRESEASON ALL-MEAC TEAM / PREDICTED ORDER OF FINISH

Morgan State senior forward Phillip Carr was selected as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Men's Basketball Preseason Player of the Year, the conference announced today. Morgan State was selected as the preseason favorite to win the MEAC this coming season.

All awards are voted on by the conference's head coaches and sports information directors.

Carr was named the 2016-17 MEAC Defensive Player of the Year and was named All-MEAC First Team. He was the MEAC's top rebounder with 9.5 rebounds per contest and ranked seventh in scoring averaging 16.6 points. Carr was also named to the BOXTOROW Division I All-America Team, the ABC All-District First Team, and the ECAC All-Star Second Team last season. He ended his junior campaign leading the league with 11 double-doubles (points and rebounds) and recorded 22 blocks and 15 steals on the season for the Bears. A two-time MEAC Player of the Week, Carr becomes the first Bear to be named the MEAC Preseason Player of the Year since Kevin Thompson before his senior season in 2010. Reggie Holmes is the last Bear to win the regular-season award, when he received the award in 2009.

Morgan State, which finished 11-5 in conference play season, picked up 13 first-place votes as this marks the first time since 2011-12 that the Bears were predicted to win the MEAC. Under the guidance of 12th year head coach Todd Bozeman, the Bears were also selected to capture first place in the MEAC during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons. Norfolk State was picked to finish second, while defending MEAC regular season and postseason champions North Carolina Central was picked to finish third.

Rounding out the rest of the preseason poll are Hampton, Savannah State, Maryland Eastern Shore, S.C. State, Howard, Bethune Cookman, Delaware State, Florida A&M, Coppin State, and North Carolina A&T State.

Joining Carr on the Preseason All-MEAC First Team are Norfolk State's Zaynah Robinson, Bethune Cookman's Brandon Tabb, Howard's Charles Williams and Morgan State's Tiwian Kindley.

The 2017-18 season begins on Friday, Nov. 10 while the 2018 MEAC Basketball Tournament will be held March 5-10 at the Norfolk Scope Arena in Norfolk, Va.
