HEAD COACH JUAN DIXON



Coppin State University Director of Athletics Derek Carter announced on Wednesday, April 26, 2017 that Juan Dixon had been named the seventh head coach in Coppin State University men's basketball history.

In his first three seasons at the helm of the Eagles program, Dixon has helped four players receive All-MEAC accolades (Lamar Morgan; 3rd Team in 2017-18, Dejuan Clayton; 2nd Team in 2018-19 & 3rd Team in 2019-20, as well as Brendan Medley-Bacon; 3rd Team in 2019-20).

This past season, Coppin won 11 games with four non-conference Division I wins, the team's most since the 1993-94 campaign. These victories included three road games: Loyola Chicago, James Madison & East Carolina, as well as a home overtime victory over Cornell.

During the 2018-19 season, the Eagles swept the regular season series with Morgan State and also defeated the Bears in the 1st Round of the MEAC Tournament before falling in overtime to North Carolina A&T. Following the season, Morgan (Portugal) and Cedric Council (Georgia), both of whom Dixon brought to Coppin prior to his first year, signed professional contracts overseas.

Dixon returned to his hometown of Baltimore from the University of the District of Columbia, where he posted a 3-25 record in his only season with the Firebirds women's basketball team in 2016-17.

Prior to UDC, Dixon served as the Special Assistant to the Head Coach on the Men's Basketball coaching staff at his alma mater, University of Maryland. There he supported 2015 Big 10 Conference Coach of the Year, Mark Turgeon, by enhancing game plans and strategizing how to attack opponents offensively and defensively. He helped implement offensive sets and defensive principles, analyzed and broke down film, and mentored, motivated, counseled and developed student-athletes, including future NBA players Alex Len, Diamond Stone, Jake Layman and Robert Carter, Jr.

Dixon also coached DMV's Finest and Team Maryland during The Basketball Tournament (TBT) in Philadelphia, PA, and directs his own Juan Dixon Basketball Camp and Premier Basketball Camp, both in Baltimore, MD.

One of the most celebrated student-athletes in Maryland history, Dixon remains the all-time leading scorer in program history (2,269 points) after leading the Terrapins to their first national title in 2002 as a senior. He holds six different records in program history, ranging from points, games played, steals and 3-pointers.

The Most Outstanding Player of the 2002 NCAA Final Four and ACC Player of the Year, Dixon earned two All-America selections, three First Team All-ACC selections and two All-ACC Tournament selections throughout his illustrious career. He averaged 16.1 points, 4.2 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 2.4 steals in 141 games from 1998-2002.

Dixon was drafted with the 17th pick of the 2002 NBA draft by the Washington Wizards, where he spent three seasons. He signed with the Portland Trail Blazers in 2005, and he averaged a career-high 12.3 points during his first season with the team. After stops in Toronto and Detroit, Dixon wrapped up his nine-year NBA career with the Wizards in 2008-09.

Throughout his NBA career, Dixon played under Hall of Fame Player Doug Collins and Patrick Ewing (Wizards), Monty Williams and Nate McMillan (Trail Blazers), 2007 NBA Coach of the Year Sam Mitchell (Toronto Raptors), Flip Saunders (Detroit Pistons), and Eddie Jordan (Wizards). He also played alongside the following: Charles Oakley, Jerry Stackhouse, Gilbert Arenas, Antawn Jamison, Christian Laettner, Tyronn Lue, (former Maryland backcourt-mate) Steve Blake, Zach Randolph, Theo Ratliff, Chris Bosh, TJ Ford, José Calderón, Chauncey Billups, Richard Hamilton, Rasheed Wallace, Antonio McDyess and Caron Butler. During his first stint with the Wizards, he was also teammates with and mentored by NBA legend Michael Jordan.

Dixon, a graduate of Calvert Hall College High School in Towson, MD, earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Family Science in 2013 from the University of Maryland. During his student-athlete career at Maryland he earned numerous distinctions including: NCAA Senior CLASS Award (2002), Chip Hilton Award (2002), ESPN Shooting Guard of the Year (2002), Wooden Player of the Year Award candidate (2002), Third Team NABC All-American (2001) and Third Team USBWA All-American (2001). He was inducted into the University of Maryland Athletics Hall of Fame in October 2012, and he was selected as one of 75 All-Time March Madness Players in 2012.

Anthony Tarke - Lou Henson Award

On January 26, Anthony Tarke was one of 40 players to be named to the Mid-Season Lou Henson Award Watch List which is award to the Nation's top mid-major player. Tarke is the only HBCU player on the list. Previous winners dating back to the 2009-10 season include Norfolk State's Kyle O'Quinn (2011-12). Mid-major players who are named to the Lute Olson All-America Team are not eligible for the Lou Henson Award which included Damian Lillard, CJ McCollum and Doug McDermott in 2011-12 and Kelly Olynyk in 2012-13.

The Nation's Most Complete Player

Anthony Tarke is arguably the most complete player in the Nation as the only player averaging at least 16 points, 8 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals per game. Tarke is also averaging 1.9 blocks. Of all NCAA players with 50+ steals, Tarke is the only player with at least 10 blocks and he has recorded 40 blocks.

Tarke leads the MEAC in total points, rebounds, double-doubles, defensive rebounds, blocks, steals, free throws made and free throw attempts. He also ranks 2nd in minutes, 3rd in points per game and assists & 7th in both field goal percentage and assist/turnover ratio.

Anthony Tarke 5-by-5

On January 5, 2021 against Delaware State, Anthony Tarke had the most complete stat line of the season, recording the Nation's only 5-by-5 game of the season, recording at least 5 of each of the 5 main stat categories in a single game. Tarke had 13 points, 11 rebounds, 8 assists, 6 steals and 5 blocks.

Tarke Madness

On March 2, the Tarke Brothers swept the MEAC Weekly honors for the second time of the season with Anthony Tarke once again winning Player & Defensive Player of the Week and Nendah Tarke earned Rookie of the Week honors. It was the third time of the season that CSU swept the weekly honors. Anthony Tarke had 15 points, 15 rebounds, 5 assists, 4 blocks and 2 steals on Feb. 27 at Delaware State before going for 31 points on 11-of-11 shooting and 8 assists the following day. Nendah Tarke had a 21 point effort, followed by another 13 point game with 9 rebounds and 5 steals.

Dominating the MEAC Weekly Honors

Anthony Tarke won a league-high eight Defensive Player of the Week awards and a pair of Player of the Week awards. Nendah Tarke and Kenan Sarvan had the most and 2nd-most Rookie of the Week honors at five and three,

respectively. See all of Coppin's Award Winners on page nine.

King of the North

Finishing 8-4 in the MEAC after taking all four games from Delaware State, three from Norfolk State and one from Morgan State, Coppin won its first MEAC regular season crown since the 2003-04 season when it split the regular season title with South Carolina State. It was the first time CSU finished above .500 in league play since the 2011-12 season when it recorded a 9-7 mark in the MEAC.

Not Just the Other Juan Anymore

When mentioning Juan at Coppin State, most will think of head coach Juan Dixon. That is not the case anymore with redshirt senior DeJuan Clayton. Statistically one of the best players to ever wear the Navy & Gold, Clayton is averaging a career-high in nearly every statistical category, especially in points (15.3) and assists (5.0). Clayton ranks 5th in school-history in points, 3rd in assists, 4th in free throws and is one steal from breaking the top ten.

Don't Forget About Koby

While the Tarke brothers and DeJuan Clayton have garnered the attention, Koby Thomas had another superb season and was named 3rd Team All-MEAC. Joining Anthony Tarke as the only CSU players to start in all 21 games, Thomas ranks 9th in the MEAC in points (12.4), 5th in rebounds (6.2) and 7th in steals (1.5). In four collegiate seasons, Thomas has career averages of 12.9 points and 6.6 rebounds and scored 1,213 points.

Where Yuat?!

Added to Coppin's roster on January 15, 2010, Yuat Alok started in his CSU debut the very afternoon at Morgan State and recorded 10 points and 6 rebounds. The following day, Alok put up 6 points & 6 rebounds. Alok last played during the 2018-19 season where he appeared in 10 games for TCU, averaging 3.3 points & 2.5 rebounds. Once the top JUCO prospect nationally by jucorecruiting.com, Alok averaged 12.3 points & 7.0 rebounds while shooting 55.1% from the field as a sophomore at Chipola CC. Alok was born in Kenya, moved to New Zealand where he was a member of the U19 New Zealand National Team & played his senior year of HS in Florida.

Clayton Returns to Open MEAC Play

After missing six-straight games, DeJuan Clayton returned to action as Coppin won its MEAC opener over Delaware State on January 4. Clayton posted a career-high 32 points which included a career-best 14-of-15 from the free

throw line. In the second half alone, Clayton recorded 26 of those points while making 10-of-11 free throws. Clayton was also credited with five rebounds and six steals and was named the MEAC Player of the Week. The following night, another win over the Hornets, Clayton led all players with 18 points while making 9-of-13 free throws, to go with five rebounds, six assists and three steals.

Coppin Sweeps MEAC Awards, Vol. 2

On January 5, 2021, Coppin swept the MEAC weekly awards for the second time of the season as DeJuan Clayton was named Player of the Week while Anthony Tarke and Nendah Tarke received Defensive Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively. Clayton received the award after going for a career-high 32 points and 14-of-15 from the line in a win over Delaware State on January 4. Anthony Tarke posted eight rebounds, four blocks and four steals while Nendah Tarke added 11 points, eight rebounds, two assists and five steals.

Anthony Tarke Hits the Record Books

In Coppin's victory over UNC Greensboro on December 10, Anthony Tarke notched a double-double with a career-high 34 points to go with ten rebounds. He also added career-highs in both assists (8) and blocks (4) while being credited with four steals. Tarke made 11-of-13 shots from the floor and 10-of-15 from the charity stripe, also career-highs. Tarke was the first player since the 2010-11 season to go for at least 33 points, 10 rebounds, 8 assists, 4 blocks and 4 steals in a single game.

It's Beginning to Look A Lot Like Tarkemas: Tarke Brothers Sweep MEAC Weekly Awards

The Tarke Brothers, Anthony Tarke and Nendah Tarke swept the three MEAC Weekly Honors on December 15. Anthony was named both the MEAC Player of the Week and Defensive Player of the Week while Nendah Tarke received the league's Rookie of the Week award. It was the second time this season that a pair of Eagles players received MEAC weekly honors in the same week.

A Debut to Remember at Duke

Coppin State played Duke for the first time in school-history to open the season on November 28. In that game, seven different Eagles made their CSU debut, including redshirt senior Anthony Tarke who poured in 22 points, 9 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 blocks and a career-high 5 steals. Freshman Kenan Sarvan added ten points and eight rebounds in his first collegiate game while Nendah Tarke chipped in six points. Anthony

Tarke was named the MEAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week and Sarvan received MEAC Rookie of the Week accolades.

Living by the Three

Nearly half of Coppin State's field goal attempts this season have come from behind-the-arc (611 of 1,236) and the Eagles have made 30.8% of those shots. In CSU's nine victories, Coppin has made 91-of-255 (35.7%) from 3-point range. Junior college transfer Kyle Cardaci is arguably the top 3-point shooter in the MEAC having made a league-high 54 shots from deep. Cardaci has made an impressive 40.6% from behind the arc to rank 6th in the MEAC. Of the five players ranked ahead of him percentage wise, no player has taken more than 56 attempts from deep compared to Cardaci's 133 shots.

Dying by the Three

Nearly half of Coppin State's field goal attempts this season have come from behind-the-arc (611 of 1,236) and the Eagles have made just 30.8% of those shots. Inside the arc, Coppin is making 51.4% of its shots. In defeat, CSU has made just 97-of-356 (27.2%) from deep. Outside of Kyle Cardaci, the Eagles have made just 134-of-478 (28.0%) from distance this season.

Preaching Defensive Principles

While head coach Juan Dixon was probably more known for his scoring ability at the University of Maryland, Dixon is one of the NCAA all-time leaders in steals. Dixon and his staff preach their defensive principles and the Eagles have responded by ranking among the Nation's leaders in forcing turnovers and steals. This season, Coppin ranks 4th in the MEAC (18th Nationally) in turnovers forced per game (16.38), & 2nd in steals per game (16th in NCAA; 8.7). Anthony Tarke ranks 6th nationally with 2.67 steals per game and 9th in the NCAA with 56 steals.

Tall on the Perimeter, Small Inside

While Coppin boasts eight lengthy guards between 6-foot-4 and 6-foot-7, the Eagles have just two player taller with 6-foot-10 forward Kenan Sarvan who showcases more of an outside game, and newcomer Yuat Alok who made his CSU debut on Jan. 16. With the lack of height, which also includes the absence of Justin Steers and Bryce Hunt, CSU has struggled on the boards with an -10.4 rebounding margin. At 6-foot-6, Anthony Tarke leads Coppin with 8.4 rebounds per game which leads the MEAC.

Cardaci Heating Up from Deep

Since Juan Dixon took over as head coach to start the 2017-18 season, Coppin has had

arguably the top 3-point shooter in the MEAC (Lamar Morgan in 2018 & 2019 / Andrew Robinson in 2020) and this season is no exception with redshirt sophomore Kyle Cardaci. Cardaci leads the MEAC with 54 3-pointers while making 40.6% of his shots from behind-the-arc. Cardaci has made a 3-pointer in 18 of 21 games and buried a career-high six triples at Iona. In MEAC games, Cardaci has made 31-of-69 (44.9%) from downtown.

Roster Turnover

Coppin returns just three active players from last season's squad in seniors DeJuan Clayton and Koby Thomas, as well as sophomore Reggie James. Redshirt freshman Isaiah Gross and Kenan Sarvan did not play last season. With just three returning players, Coppin loses 59% of its points from last season and 69% of its rebounds.

From the City of Brotherly Love

In its heyday during the 1990s, Coppin's roster boasted a large number of players from the City of Brotherly Love. During Juan Dixon's first two years, he brought in Karonn Davis and Chad Andrews-Fulton from Philly, and last season he welcomed Koby Thomas who transferred in from Robert Morris. After leading Imhotep Charter to a Public League Championship, Thomas was the 2017-18 NEC Rookie of the Year, averaging 12.0 points and a team-high 6.9 rebounds. This season, Coppin also welcomes back Justin Steers, another Philadelphian.

Welcome Back, Steers

Coppin is bringing back a familiar face this season in junior Justin Steers. A 2018-19 MEAC All-Rookie Team selection, Steers averaged 6.0 points per game with 25 blocks as a freshman. Steers really broke out in the 2019 MEAC Tournament where he averaged 12 points, six rebounds and three blocks in two games.

More Brotherly Love

For the second-straight season, Coppin State will feature a set of brothers (Aaron & Andrew Robinson in 2019-20) in redshirt senior Anthony Tarke and freshman Nendah Tarke. Like the Robinson twins, the Tarke's grew up in Montgomery County, Maryland. The Robinson's both attended Springbrook HS before attending Putnam Science Academy. Anthony Tarke played his entire high school career at Gaithersburg HS before attending what is now Covenant College Prep. Nendah Tarke played a season at Gaithersburg HS before transferring to Bullis HS and also did a prep season at Covenant.

Greg Spurlock Signed for 2021-22

Greg Spurlock of Rock Ridge HS in Ashburn, Va., signed a NLI to play for the Eagles next season. Spurlock was named 2nd Team All-State and both 1st Team All-Region & All-Conference as a junior after averaging 18 points, 6.1 assists, 5.5 rebounds and 2.3 steals. He set school-records for assists in a game (15) and season, as well as field goal pct. (55%). He earned 2nd Team All-Conference as a sophomore after putting up 11.0 points, 3.3 assists & 3.1 rebounds.

Inside Coppin's Historic Win at Loyola Chicago in 2019-20

Coppin State's victory at Loyola Chicago on November 12, 2019 was the Eagles' first victory over a non-MEAC Division I team since they defeated UMBC on December 11, 2013. This broke a streak 74 straight losses against Division I non-MEAC teams. It was CSU's first road victory against a non-MEAC Division I team since beating Towson on December 19, 2012.

Honoring #24 Kobe Bryant in 2019-20

On January 27, 2020, the day after the tragic passing of Kobe Bryant, his daughter Gianna Bryant, and seven others, Coppin held a 24-second moment of silence prior to its game against Howard. That same night, Koby Thomas (also of Philadelphia) scored a then career-high 24 points. His 24th point of the game was the team's 81st point (Bryant's career-high) of the game.

Wins Against Non-MEAC DI Teams in a Season

Coppin won four games against Division I Non-MEAC teams (Loyola Chicago, Cornell, James Madison, East Carolina) which is a first for the Eagles since the 1993-94 season. This was tied for the second-most non-conference Division I victories for the Eagles in their history.

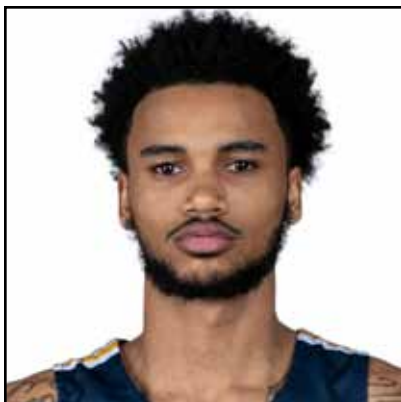

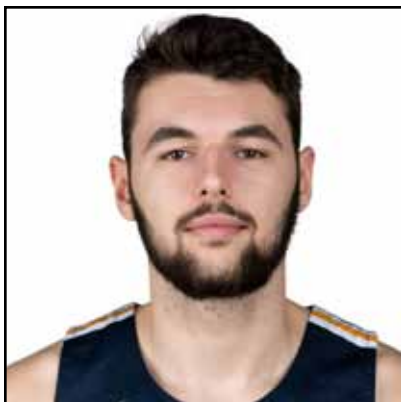

Third School's The Charm For Coppin State Men's Basketball's Anthony Tarke

Anthony Tarke and his newest coach, Coppin State's Juan Dixon, quickly found common ground. Tarke, a product of Gaithersburg, Md., previously played at the New Jersey Institute of Technology (2016-2018) and Texas El-Paso (2018-2020) before landing at Coppin. He and Dixon both thought Tarke's talents could take him far in the

game of basketball.

So, after traveling far and wide, Tarke came back closer to home to help local legend Dixon turn the Eagles' fortunes and try to follow Dixon's path to the NBA. They both feel fortunate to have each other as the precarious 2020-21 season gets rolling.

"Coach Juan had a plan for me and had a vision for me to show off what I can do," said Tarke, a grad transfer leading the team in scoring (17.3 points per game), rebounds (7.8) and steals (3.0) through six contests. "He believed in me and all my abilities. He said he believes I'm an NBA player, that I fit the mold. He played in the league and under his tutelage and with my ability, it can all come together."

"We're very fortunate to have A.T. in our family," Dixon added. "In the recruiting process we worked extremely hard as a staff to get Anthony Tarke here. He's a guy that's a game-changer, just with his freakish athleticism, his size, his guard-like skills, and right now he's playing with a lot of confidence."

Dixon hopes some of that confidence — Tarke was all-league in the Atlantic Sun Conference at NJIT — rubs off on the Eagles. Coppin began 1-5 against a demanding schedule, but the potential for the Eagles, who haven't posted a winning record since 2010-11, to take wing is still apparent.

That's Tarke's take, too, and he did something to show it, pumping in 33 points in Coppin's first win, 85-80 against visiting UNC Greensboro Dec. 10. The 6-foot-6 Tarke, a high-jumping forward with guard skills, also had 10 rebounds, hit 11 of 13 shots and had eight assists.

The Eagles are starting to come together. Coppin returned two preseason all-conference picks in senior forward DeJuan Clayton from Bowie, Md., and point guard Koby Thomas from Philadelphia. If they get some help in the paint from some bigs — 6-foot-7 junior Justin Steers

hasn't played this year because of injury and 6-foot-7 shot-blocker Bryce Hunt is still sorting through an eligibility issue — there's a high ceiling in Coppin's PEC Arena this year.

"I love my guys, DeJuan and Koby, these guys they want to win," Tarke said. "They're both very gifted players and we're trying to change the mentality around here. The mindset is to be like a three-headed monster."

Tarke and his team turned heads in a hard-fought 81-71 loss at Duke Nov. 28 to open the season. Tarke's 22 points, nine rebounds, five steals and two blocks helped Coppin outscore the then-No. 9 Blue Devils, 43-36, in the second half. Then, as if to shut down doubters, Tarke poured in another 22 points at George Washington Dec. 5 and earned MEAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors.

"I felt like a lot of people were watching to see how I would do after sitting out, really, two years," said Tarke, who sat out as a transfer in 2018-19 and then just sat on the bench too much at UTEP last year. "Even for me, not knowing how I would do, it was exciting, thrown right in the fire against the No. 9 team. Coach believed in me and it freed my mind. A lot of people were shocked, 'This is the same kid from UTEP?'"

Dixon has a lot of pieces to put together under trying circumstances this season, but he knows Tarke can take the team places. In the process, Tarke will inch up NBA draft boards and leave Coppin State a better program.

"He's a very competitive young man," said Dixon, who would be the first to admire that particular trait. "We're very fortunate to have an opportunity to coach him. We're just going to continue to help him get better. A.T. has a lot of experience in college basketball and to get a grad transfer like that will hopefully propel us to land more guys like that."

Tarke was a Washington Post All-Met selection at Gaithersburg High School in 2014-15, averaging 26.3 points. Yet Tarke didn't have a lot of college offers, committing to Division II University of Charleston (W.Va) early. His AAU coach, Arty Jones, who has since passed away, saw things differently, though.

"He told me there was no difference between playing against West Virginia or playing against Shepherd [University]," Tarke recalled. "He said I could compete anywhere. So that's why I went to prep school. He made me play AAU my senior year after I already signed and then people saw me play."

Tarke would land at Coastal Academy, now Covenant College Prep, in Belmar, N.J., where he was coveted by nearby NJIT, and ultimately signed with the Highlanders. He was a human highlight there, averaging 9.9 points and 4.7 rebounds to earn A-Sun All-Freshman honors. He was first-team all-conference the following season, racking up 15.7 points and 6.2 rebounds, including a 27-point, nine-rebound game at Kennesaw State.

Tarke played through a knee injury, and ultimately, felt he could play on a still larger stage. UTEP coaches thought so, too.

"Leaving New Jersey, I had never been recruited the way I was then," he said. "It was kind of overwhelming."

Chalk it up as another learning experience, which is what college, or in this case, colleges, are all about. Tarke felt he may have rushed his decision to venture nearly 2,000 miles from his home to El Paso. Miners assistant Brian Burton was his biggest advocate, but when coaching staff

changes came and Tarke couldn't shake nagging injuries or get sufficient playing time, he finished up his degree and hit the road again.

He played 14 games, started twice and averaged 2.6 points and 4.0 rebounds in 2019-20. Again, Tarke had a lot of options but Coppin State became intriguing because the Eagles were recruiting Nendah, Tarke's younger brother. Nendah, by the way, had 20 points in Coppin's first win.

"It definitely played into it," Tarke said. "I've always wanted to play with him, and I know the type of chemistry we've had on the floor in the past. Him making that move [to commit first] and Coach Juan's belief, it was like, 'OK, you've earned my trust.'"

Tarke sees Nendah going through familiar freshman growing pains, perhaps exacerbated by Dixon's demanding doctrines on defense where the Eagles as a team are a work in progress.

"We're not as sound, not as disciplined enough to dictate the way he wants us to," said Tarke, sounding like a guy in his fifth year of college basketball. "Once we've honed in and our shots start falling, I think we're going to get on a nice little run."

Part of that may hinge on getting those big men in the lineup. Right now, Tarke is playing inside because there aren't a lot of other options.

"I think my strength is being able to guard any position, from point guard to center," he said. "And I can drive the basketball and find open teammates, get the ball to certain places. When I'm playing well and have a rhythm, it's hard to stop me."

That's apparent through a lot of miles and now three schools.

"It has been a good experience," he said, looking back and thinking about his future all at the same time.

Coppin State has a potential star in UTEP transfer Anthony Tarke

Out with the old, in with the new. This is a common refrain in the MEAC. Coppin State coach Juan Dixon only returned four players from last season's squad. HBCU coaches usually have to do some deep diving to get transfers from other Division I schools or JUCOs, but this year a potential star may have fallen right into Dixon's lap.

Anthony Tarke was a star at NJIT. In 2016-17 he won the ASUN Freshman of the Year award and followed that up with a First Team All-ASUN season the next year. Wanting to take a step up in competition, Tarke transferred to UTEP.

He did not get much playing time in El Paso and decided to put his name back into the transfer portal.

That is when former Quinnipiac and Coppin State players, Aaron and Andrew Robinson — who knew Tarke from high school — stepped in. Just like Tarke, the brothers used their last season to explore other options. Tarke's brother Nendah was working on his college decision as well. You can see where this is going.

The Robinsons now run their own college basketball podcast and website, "All Facts Media." Over the summer, they were reaching out to transfers and prospective D-I athletes, helping them through the process. Former teammates such as Kevin Marfo and Rich Kelly even announced to the world via the [All Facts Twitter](#) where they would play during the next season. All Facts ended up playing a critical role in getting the Tarkes to Coppin State.

"When we started recruiting Anthony Tarke, we were able to come across Nendah Tarke because of these two young men that just got on the camera," said Juan Dixon during a recent postgame press conference. "I know [Anthony Tarke], one of the things he wanted to do was play with his little brother. Just like those two guys did."

It appears to have worked out for all parties involved. The Tarkes have been stars, with Anthony possibly a first-team all-MEAC player and Nendah a contender for MEAC Freshman of the Year.

The Robinson brothers were in attendance for Coppin State's recent game against top-100 squad UNC Greensboro. Against all odds, the Eagles won that game 85-80, in their most impressive home victory of the Juan Dixon Era.

Anthony dropped 34 points and had a key takeover sequence down the stretch. This included a rebound, put back, blocked three, dunk, steal, and layup and-one, all in sequence. His brother had a nice game as well, scoring 20.

"It was a heck of a game for the Tarkes, but we've got to keep building." Dixon said postgame.

Anthony's scored double-digits in three of the four games since and had quite possibly his best effort in a season-opening loss at Duke. He scored 22 against the mighty Blue Devils, picking up nine rebounds.

Coppin State now enters MEAC play with a huge target on its back. After being picked fourth in the East division of the league, it's clear the Eagles have the talent to do more than that.

‘It’s everything’: Brothers Anthony and Nendah Tarke relishing time on court together at Coppin State

Sometime in late May, Nendah Tarke was playing video games in his parents’ home in Gaithersburg in Montgomery County, relishing the nonchalance that came after committing two weeks earlier to begin his college basketball career playing for the Coppin State men’s basketball program. The scene was briefly interrupted by older brother Anthony, who had left the University of Texas El Paso

with one more year of eligibility remaining.

“He just said, ‘It’s time,’” Nendah Tarke recalled of his brother’s decision to commit to the Eagles. “I was like, ‘What does that mean?’ He said he had prayed about it and thought about it, and this was the decision he was going to make. I was just like, ‘Let’s go, let’s do it.’”

Said Anthony Tarke: “I knew that I wanted to play with him for my final year. I knew the chemistry that we would have on the floor. So that was definitely big for me.”

The arrival of the Tarke brothers has been a boon for Coppin State. In their first season in Baltimore, Anthony Tarke, a 6-foot-6, 220-pound redshirt senior shooting guard/small forward, leads the team in rebounds (7.0 per game), total steals (36) and total blocks (18) and ranks second in scoring (15.8). Nendah, a 6-4, 190-pound freshman shooting guard, ranks third in total steals (16), fourth in rebounds (4.7) and sixth in scoring (6.6).

“They’re tremendous athletes, they’re capable shooters who are getting better every day,” said Eagles coach Juan Dixon, the former University of Maryland standout who propelled the Terps to their first and only NCAA Division I championship in 2002. “They just bring something to our program that we haven’t had since I’ve been the head coach at Coppin, and that’s just crazy length and athleticism and toughness. They’re physical basketball players, and we’re just going to continue to push these guys hard and help them to have success.”

Of the two brothers (there is a third, Roniel, nicknamed “Mandela,” who is a senior point guard at Gaithersburg High School in Montgomery County), Nendah, who turns 20 on Jan. 31, is considered the more naturally talented one. As a seventh grader, he scored 24 of his recreation league team’s 42 points in an 18-point victory over an opponent.

“I think there was another middle school game when he scored something like 40 points,” Anthony Tarke, 22, said. “I was like, ‘How do you score 40?’ I couldn’t even score 10. He just had that ability to play, and he’s still super talented.”

If the elder Tarke has one advantage, it’s his height. Between eighth and ninth grade, he grew four inches to 6 feet. The following year, he grew another two inches and then another two inches to 6-4 between his sophomore and junior years. He is now 6-6, and Nendah Tarke said his brother uses his size to his advantage, especially on defense.

“I consider myself a good defender, but I think he’s a crazy good defender just because of that length and his activity,” Nendah Tarke said, adding that his brother has the versatility to mark opposing players on the perimeter or in the paint. “If I could have that kind of defense, that’s what I steal from him the most — just being able to be in position, contest shots, guard different positions.”

The Tarke brothers said they were convinced to play for the Eagles by their trust in Dixon to help them develop their skills in college and for the next level professionally. Anthony Tarke, who was recruited by Cal State Fullerton, Coastal Carolina, Hartford, Kent State, Rhode Island, and Virginia Tech, said he also was encouraged by Aaron and Andrew Robinson, who played for Coppin State last winter.

Aaron Robinson, who with his twin brother [broke the news of several high-profile college basketball transfers in the spring via their sports news website All Facts Media and their Twitter account](#) and has since started and hosted a podcast called “The Auto Bid” on the Bleav Podcast Network, said they emphasized to Anthony Tarke how he could refine his resume for a future in professional basketball if he chose the Eagles.

“We were telling him, ‘You have one last chance to get this right. You have one last year to put your best foot forward and try to go and get some stats so that you can play overseas or in the NBA,’” Aaron Robinson said. “We basically told him that if the goal is to put up numbers, then there’s no better place to do that than Coppin State because he’s going to have the ball in his hands and he’s going to have the freedom to show his full arsenal.”

Anthony and Nendah Tarke agree that their best performances occurred during an 86-80 victory against UNC Greensboro on Dec. 10. In that game, Anthony Tarke racked up 34 points, 10 rebounds, eight assists, four blocks and four steals, becoming the first Division I player since at least the 2010-11 season to compile those numbers. Nendah Tarke collected 20 points and four rebounds.

“That game just showed a glimpse of what we can do, and I wouldn’t even say it was just about the scoring,” Nendah Tarke said. “Just having an impact on the game, I think it just showed that when we’re together, we’re all locked in, and we can definitely have a strong impact on every single game.”

For that showing, Anthony Tarke earned the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference’s Player and Defensive Player of the Week awards, and Nendah Tarke was named the league’s Rookie of the Week. The elder Tarke has taken home two more MEAC Defensive Player of the Week honors, and the younger Tarke was the Rookie of the Week once more.

“I don’t think I would’ve gone to school with my brother if I didn’t think he’d get a chance to really play and show what he can do,” he said. “As a freshman, I didn’t play nearly as much as he did. So I’m telling him that he should be grateful about the opportunities that he’s had and that he should continue to make the most of them because in a lot of places, it’s hard for

freshmen. And I know him. He thinks he can do even more. But I'm telling him, 'Hey, you're doing well, and you can only get better.'"

Dixon acknowledged that if there is one area of the brothers' games that has surprised him, it's their field-goal efficiency with Nendah Tarke shooting a team-best 48.5% and Anthony Tarke following him closely at 44.8%.

"Nendah's first college game was against Duke University [an 81-71 loss on Nov. 28], and we all know what that program means to college basketball, and he just went out and whapped two threes to help us get back into the game in the second half," Dixon said. "Anthony is a much better shooter since he's been here at Coppin State, and we're going to continue to work on their shooting. Both of them are great passers. Didn't know they had the ability to make plays for their teammates up until now, and I'm confident that they're going to continue to do so."

Anthony Tarke said he has tried counseling his brother on the peaks and valleys associated with college basketball that players frequently encounter. For instance, after a 1-8 start, the Eagles have won two straight, picking up back-to-back wins against MEAC foe Delaware State on Monday and Tuesday.

"We understand that every game and every day is not going to be great," he said. "But there can be consistency in your effort on the defensive end, and I think we have a new team with a lot of new guys, and for me and Nendah to be able to come in here and do what we can do while learning from our coaching staff, it's not easy, but we know that it can only continue to get better moving forward."

Aaron Robinson, the former Eagle and now basketball analyst, said the Tarke brothers know their ability to play defense can fuel their chances on offense.

"Both of those guys are really savvy on the defensive end of the floor," Robinson said. "Offensively, both of those guys have had multiple games in double figures. So I think those two guys have been absolutely paramount to the success of the team so far."

That the Tarke brothers get to play together as teammates for the first time since Anthony's senior year and Nendah's freshman season at Gaithersburg High School is the cherry on top. Anthony Tarke called his brother "my favorite player" and said playing with him gives him "peace."

"A lot of experiences in life aren't going to be like this one because it's something we've always wanted to do and talked about," he said. "We thought in the back of our heads that it wasn't going to happen, but now that it's happening, it's everything."

High-Flying Anthony Tarke Of Coppin State Is A Bonafide Superstar

One player in all of Division I basketball ranks in the top 40 for both blocked shots and steals per game: [Coppin State](#)'s Anthony Tarke. Tarke — who is No. 38 at 1.9 blocks per and sixth with 2.67 steals — just might be the most impacting defensive player in college basketball. He blocks shots with the consistency of a 7-footer, yet at 6-foot-6 is the shortest

player ranked in the NCAA's top 50 in the category.

He anticipates and moves with the quickness of a point guard on the ball and jumping into passing lanes.

No matter where Tarke falls in a conversation of the best defenders in the nation, he is inarguably one of the most unheralded stars in the game.

Despite producing defensive numbers no one in the country can match, Tarke was not named a semifinalist for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year.

Tarke fuels the Coppin State defense, which leads the MEAC in adjusted defensive efficiency per KenPom.com, ranks No. 44 nationally in 3-point defense (30.7 percent allowed) and No. 43 in percentage of defensive possessions resulting in steals (10.9 percent).

With the MEAC Tournament to come and a spot in the NCAA tournament at stake, the Eagles concluded the regular season tied atop the North division with Norfolk State and winners of three straight — including a win at Norfolk State.

Awards or no, Tarke is having one of the most impressive individual seasons of any college hooper.

But those who know, know — like Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski. In his postgame press conference following the season opener between the Blue Devils and Eagles, Coach K

referenced Coppin State coach Juan Dixon, who in his own playing career at Maryland, built a reputation as one of the single greatest defenders in college basketball history.

“In the history of me being here, he is one of the greatest competitors we’ve ever faced and one of the great guys with his Maryland teams,” Krzyzewski said. “They played with that toughness.”

The Eagles gave Duke all it could handle in Cameron Indoor Stadium, with Tarke’s five steals and two blocks setting the defensive tone.

And it wasn’t even for his defensive numbers that Coach K shouted him out, but rather Tarke’s ability to go to work offensively against Duke defenders. His 22-point, nine-rebound effort gave a blue-chip-filled class of Blue Devils an introduction to a higher level of basketball.

“It’s your first collegiate game and all the sudden, [Anthony Tarke] backed you down. He’s 230, 6-foot-6, and if you don’t use your forearm and use your hand, it’s a foul,” Krzyzewski said. “There’s so much to learn from.”

Balancing his defensive prowess with scoring punch, Tarke is uniquely well-rounded and capable of feeding one side of his game with the other.

In one prime example against Morgan State, he closes out to block a 3-point attempt on the wing and creates a fast-break opportunity.

“He’s a game-changer for us,” Dixon said following the Duke game, Tarke’s debut after transferring in from UTEP. “When we started this recruiting process in April with Tarke, it’s a guy we knew could take this program to a level where it’s never been.”

Considering the 2021 season marks the 24th anniversary of legendary coach Fang Mitchell leading Coppin State to the first-ever MEAC NCAA Tournament win, a defeat of second-seeded South Carolina in the 1997 Southeast Regional, Tarke helping take the Eagles to levels they’ve never reached is quite high praise.

But also, not unrealistic.

‘The cornerstone’: How DeJuan Clayton helped Coppin State men’s basketball build a champion

After the Coppin State men’s basketball team’s 94-74 win over Delaware State on Sunday night that secured the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Northern Division title — the program’s first regular-season championship in 17 years — the celebration inside the locker room involved an impromptu shower of coach Juan Dixon and a lot of cheers and applause.

The redshirt senior point guard last enjoyed a championship during his

senior year of high school in 2015-16, when he and future Maryland star Anthony Cowan Jr. propelled St. John’s College to the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference crown. So the 6-foot-2, 185-pound guard relished Sunday’s emotional display.

“I feel great,” Clayton said Monday. “It’s been a long journey with different coaches. I’ve been the point guard on different teams every year. So I’ve had to get used to my players and get used to how they played and how to talk to them. It’s been a long journey, but I’m just blessed to be here with them now.”

In his five years with the Eagles, Clayton has endured a coaching change, a season-ending shoulder injury and a revolving door of teammates. Despite those obstacles, he is tailoring his finest season.

Clayton leads the team in assists (4.9 per game) and minutes played (36.9) and ranks second in points (15.3) and third in steals (1.6). He ranks in the top 10 in school history in assists (third, 412), free throws (fourth, 430), points (fifth, 1,509), field goals (ninth, 469) and games (10th, 115) and joined Tywain McKee as the only Eagles players with at least 1,500 points and 400 assists.

“He’s been through the gauntlet for five years,” said Dixon, the former NBA player who powered Maryland to its first and only NCAA championship in 2002. “This is a kid that could have played at some Power Five schools, but he decided to see it through. He believed in our vision as a staff from Day One. We told him, ‘It’s not going to be easy. It’s going to be tough. But we’ll continue to build our program year in and year out, and you’re going to be a big reason why we win a championship.’”

Clayton’s career might not have unfolded with the Eagles if not for Dixon. Clayton, who chose the university over Howard, Morgan State, Mount St. Mary’s, Florida Gulf Coast and Robert

Morris, was an immediate contributor in his freshman year, amassing 12.4 points and 3.1 assists in 32 games, including 23 starts.

But shortly after the end of the 2016-17 season, coach Michael Grant's contract was not renewed. Even after Dixon was announced as the next head coach on April 26, 2017, Clayton considered putting his name in the transfer portal.

"My freshman year, I could have transferred," he recalled. "But Juan Dixon came in serious. He recruited me every day. He treated me as if I was in high school all over again. There was a trust that he built from the start."

"When we did our research on DeJuan and we looked at his freshman year, we realized that we had a point guard that could be the cornerstone of our program for many years to come, but we knew we had to recruit DeJuan, his parents, his grandparents in order for us to get an opportunity to coach him," he said. "So we brought his family in, we showed him film, we discussed our vision and our plans for DeJuan Clayton, and since that day, we've built an unbelievable relationship."

After a shoulder injury limited Clayton to six games in 2017-18, he started all 62 games over the next two seasons, averaging 13.2 points and 3.7 assists. And despite a 0-3 start this season, Clayton averaged 13.7 points and 3.3 assists, including a 22-point performance in an 81-71 loss at perennial powerhouse Duke on Nov. 28.

But after a 69-54 setback at Drexel on Dec. 6, Clayton approached Dixon and asked for a temporary leave from the team. Clayton — who last May earned a bachelor's degree in social science and is studying for a master's in criminal justice — declined to specify the details behind his departure, but said he needed "a mental break."

"There was just a lot of stuff, mainly personal stuff that had built up," he said. "COVID was a part of it, and I just needed a couple games off. He trusted me, and I trusted him, and it worked out."

Dixon, who said he received permission from Clayton's father Derrick to call the younger Clayton "my son," granted the request. Dixon said he knew Clayton was ready to return after a six-game absence when he wrote a letter to the coach.

"It was an unbelievable note — well written, well put together, well thought out," Dixon said. "He just finally opened up and articulated what he was feeling, what he thought we could possibly do better as a staff. He hit the nail on the head in his note. He was right, and we've tried to be more understanding as a staff when it comes to understanding what the players are dealing with while helping them grow and helping them reach their full potential."

Since his return, Clayton has meshed well with redshirt senior shooting guard Anthony Tarke (16.4 points, 8.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists, 2.7 steals and 1.9 blocks), senior small forward Koby Thomas (12.4 points, 6.2 rebounds and 1.5 steals) and redshirt junior center Yuat Alok (8.7 points and 5.4 rebounds). As the point guard, Clayton is relied on by Dixon to direct the offense and stand as the first line of the defense.

"As a point guard, it's whatever we need at that moment in the game," he said. "If my teammates are rolling and if my teammates are clicking, then it's always a blessing as a point guard to see my teammates happy. And if I need to score at the moment and that makes my teammates happy, then I'll do that."

Dixon said the change in Clayton since returning to Coppin State is palpable. The biggest thing he has noticed is Clayton's evolution into a more outspoken leader with his teammates and coaches.

"He was in a shell, but now he's more open," Dixon said. "He's letting teammates in, he's letting coaches in. We communicate at a much higher level. He lets us know what he's feeling. He's been our quarterback since we've been at Coppin State.

"Everything we did was predicated on helping DeJuan reach his full potential and putting a team around him that could help us win, and we've been able to do that year after year with crucial pieces to our puzzle."

Clayton's focus isn't limited to the present. He has taken it upon himself to groom freshman Kaelon Harkema, who said it was evident how much the team missed Clayton when he was gone for six games.

"DeJuan's not a very vocal person, but you can tell that he's a great leader," said Harkema, who lives in the same suite with Clayton and called him "a big brother." "He might not yell at you and tell you this and that, but he'll come up to you and let you know in the best way what you need to do better. As a team as a whole, we just flowed together way better when he's on the court."

With an 8-4 record in the MEAC's Northern Division, the Eagles (9-12 overall) have clinched a share of the regular-season championship with Norfolk State (14-7, 8-4). They, the Spartans, Morgan State (11-6, 6-4), as well as North Carolina A&T (11-10, 7-1) and Florida A&M (7-10, 6-4) from the Southern Division, figure to jockey for the tournament championship when the postseason begins March 7. An automatic spot in the NCAA tournament — and perhaps a chance to play potential No. 1 overall seed Gonzaga in the first round — awaits the winner.

Clayton would love nothing more than helping Coppin State win its first league tournament crown since 2008. But his attention is on the present, and that includes gaining a sense of appreciation for his path to this stage.

Former Imhotep Charter star Koby Thomas continues rich Philly basketball legacy at Coppin State

When Coppin State had some of its greatest basketball teams under legendary head coach Ron

“Fang” Mitchell, the Eagles had several terrific players from Philadelphia. These players include Larry and Stephen Stewart (brothers), Antoine Brockington, Phil Booth, Tywain McKee and others.

Koby Thomas, an Imhotep Charter product, is continuing the Philly basketball tradition at Coppin State. Thomas, a 6-foot-6, 190-pound senior guard, has put together a great season averaging 12.4 points, 6.2 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game. His efforts have helped Coppin State (9-12 overall, 8-4 league) clinch a share of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Northern Division title with Norfolk State for the first time since the 2003-04 season. He credits the Eagles’ coaching staff for a good part of his success.

“Honestly, it’s just fun playing down here,” Thomas said. “The coaching staff down here let you be yourself. They help you get better. I could see relationship with the Philly connection. It’s a hard nose coaching staff. They want to compete as hard as they can.”

Juan Dixon, Coppin State head basketball coach, has been very impressed with the overall of the contributions from Thomas this season. Dixon feels talents have helped the Eagles climb to the top of the division.

“Kobe has been huge,” Dixon said. “Koby is a kid we got two years ago. We felt like he would be a big part of the direction of our program as far as being able to perform at a high level on both ends of the floor. Koby’s length and athleticism gives him an opportunity to be an elite defender.

“For the last two years, I’ve been stressing to Kobe that he can have a lot of success with the game of basketball predicated on what he can do on the defensive end alone. I’m so proud of his growth not just on the floor, but off the floor.”

Thomas started his first two seasons of his college career at Robert Morris prior to transferring to Coppin State. He has eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for his career, which includes his first two years at Robert Morris. Thomas has the ability to score, but is also a great defender. Defense is a big part of his game.

“My role is pretty simple,” Thomas said. “I just try to be a vocal leader and lead by defense if anything. That’s what is helping us win. We got a defensive team. It’s just easy. We got a lot of talented guys on our team.

“I just try to play defense. I usually try to guard the best player on the [other] team every game. I just try to shut down my opponent on defense. I just blend in offense and let the game come to me.”

Thomas is looking forward to competing in the MEAC Basketball Tournament, which will be held at the Norfolk Scope Arena in Norfolk, Va. from March 10-14. If Coppin State can win the tournament, they will get a chance to play in the NCAA tournament.

“We haven’t played our best basketball at all yet,” Thomas said. “We’re a great defensive team. We’re a great team overall. I’m really confident in my guys.”

Thomas will be a player to watch for Coppin State in the conference tournament.

Tarke brothers, Anthony and Nendah, win MEAC Player and Rookie of the Year awards

On Friday, Anthony Tarke won two awards — the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year — and was also named first-team All-MEAC. His younger brother, Nendah, was named the league's Rookie of the Year while also being named third-team All-MEAC.

The tally of the MEAC award votes sent league officials scrambling to see if brothers had ever swept the top awards in any league in Division I men's basketball.

It appears, according to league officials, that this is a first.

"My mother is ecstatic," Anthony Tarke said, shortly after being told of his honor. "I'm definitely going to enjoy that moment with her. But while I feel blessed, I'm not in the mood to really celebrate because I know that we still have work to do."

The continued work, for Anthony Tarke and Coppin, is to earn a trip to the NCAA tournament that would come by winning the MEAC tournament, which starts March 11. While Coppin has an overall losing record (9-12), the Eagles finished first in the league's North Division and with a top seed has earned a place in Friday's MEAC semifinals.

With 6-foot-6 Anthony Tarke being named the league's player of the year, it marks the eighth time in Coppin State history that a player has won that honor, and the first time since the 2008-09 season. He averaged a team-leading 16.4 points and 8.4 rebounds a game this season (he also led the team in steals and blocks). In the regular-season finale, he hit all 11 of his shots from the field while scoring 31 points against Delaware State.

The honors add to the hardware of the well-traveled Tarke, who played his first two years of college basketball at the New Jersey Institute of Technology where he was named the Atlantic Sun Conference Rookie of the Year as a freshman, and named first-team all-conference as a sophomore when he led the team in scoring (15.7 points per game) and rebounding (6.2 per

game). Anthony Tarke transferred to the University of Texas at El Paso, but after facing difficulty finding minutes with the Miners, he decided to transfer, which led him to Coppin State.

"The whole year, my brother pushed me to be the best me I could be," Nendah Tarke said. "We motivate each other every time we step on the court, and I'm just glad he's here alongside me to share in this experience."

Anthony Tarke is also a nominee for the Lou Henson Award, which honors the nation's top mid-major player.

Coppin State guard DeJuan Clayton joined Anthony Tarke on the All-MEAC first team. Florida A&M coach Robert McCullum was named Coach of the Year.

'Something special': Anthony and Nendah Tarke enjoy path from pick-up games to Coppin State

On the little basketball court at their house in Gaithersburg, Md., Anthony and Nendah Tarke pretended they played on some larger, grander stage.

The then 8-year-old and 5-year-old would set the kitchen microwave's timer to 12 minutes, emulating an NBA quarter, keeping score for a full 48-minute game. Or they'd play first to 100 points, going for hours, fueled by their love of basketball and a competitive spirit that didn't lend itself to quitting or losing.

"I always lost, though," admitted Nendah, Anthony's younger brother. "Not gonna lie."

All these years later, that brotherly competition still goes strong. Now centerpieces for Coppin State's basketball program, Anthony and Nendah still make time before every practice for a one-on-one showdown, harkening back to when their basketball skills first took form.

And as Anthony and Nendah drive each other to improve each day, they also prod the Eagles forward, helping lead the Baltimore college to its first regular-season MEAC championship since the 2003-04 season.

Getting to this point wasn't a guarantee, though. As Nendah described it, the stars had to align just right for he and his brother to compete together for the first time since high school. But the product — a regular-season title, a No. 1 seed in the conference tournament and individual awards for both players — has been beyond anything they could've imagined.

"Anthony and Nendah have been nothing short of amazing in their first year together at Coppin State," coach Juan Dixon said. "They're both elite defenders. They're both very unselfish on the offensive end. They make the right plays. They both have a ton of confidence in their shooting ability. And it's just simply going out there and being the Tarkes."

Dixon, the former Maryland star who's in his fourth year at the helm of Coppin State, loved what he saw from Nendah when he watched tape of the 6-foot-4 guard playing at Covenant College Prep in New Jersey.

To Dixon's surprise, Nendah didn't have any other scholarships at the time. He soon convinced Nendah of what he could achieve with the Eagles, and then Nendah's work on Anthony began. Anthony planned to transfer from UTEP for his final year of eligibility, and his younger brother reminded him of what they once deemed a far-fetched dream: playing together in college.

"He was convincing, man, throughout the whole decision process, he was like, 'Dude, come on,'" Anthony said. "And at first, I had my reservations with the whole situation, moving down a conference or whatever. But then, I just felt so comfortable being with him, and I felt like we could do something special."

But it didn't start off as planned. Coppin State lost eight of its first nine games and Nendah missed two through injury. Anthony said losing a five-point game to Towson on Dec. 26 might've been the team's nadir; he said he was in a "tough place mentally," frustrated by losses stacking up.

Once the MEAC slate began, though, the Eagles found their stride.

"It just seemed like everything just started clicking," Nendah said. "Something clicked in conference where everyone just started to play their best basketball."

That's when Nendah returned from injury, and he and his brother combined to score 25 points in the conference-opening win against Delaware State. Down the stretch, Coppin State posted an 8-4 record in the MEAC, securing a share of the title.

Guard DeJuan Clayton — who averaged 15.3 points — and the Tarkes helped lead that charge. Nendah finished the season averaging 9.6 points per game and 4.7 rebounds. His brother, Anthony, made a statement in his graduate senior season: 16.4 points, 8.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.7 steals per game.

Even as those tallies helped Coppin State battle near the top of the conference, the sibling rivalry between Anthony and Nendah pushed each other more. Their mom got in on it, too.

"Nendah had a 15-point game, you only had 13 points," Anthony recalled his mom joking. "She'll throw little nuggets out there. And again, it's just healthy competition."

The progression through the season for Nendah was especially apparent, finishing with double-digit point tallies in seven of his last nine games — securing him MEAC Rookie of the Year honors as well as a third-team All-MEAC place.

"If you would've told me I'd win that at the beginning of the season," Nendah said, "I probably would've called you a liar."

Anthony outdid his younger brother, though, taking home both the conference's Player of the Year award and Defensive Player of the Year honor. The MEAC thinks it's the first time brothers have swept the postseason awards in any Division I conference.

But Coppin State isn't done, and the Tarkes aren't resting on those laurels. The Eagles play the winner of the Morgan State and Florida A&M game on Friday in the semifinal of the MEAC tournament.

"Our mentality through this whole process has been to get to the NCAA tournament," Anthony said. "From the time in May when I committed with my brother, we knew that was the plan, that was the goal. So, we're glad we're North Division champions, we're glad we have the No. 1 seed. But we're not done, and I think we're starting to play our best basketball at the best time."

Reaching this point, however, was years in the making, first envisioned while two kids played one-on-one for hours at their house — dreaming that one day this would all be possible.

"Sometimes you really gotta take a step back and appreciate where you are," Nendah said. "I think it's surreal, and I think it's something I'm never going to forget."
