Located in Norfolk, Va., the MEAC is made up of 11 outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline: Bethune-Cookman University, Coppin State University, Delaware State University, Florida A&M University, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, Norfolk State University, North Carolina A&T State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State University.

The MEAC sponsors 15 Division I (FCS) sports with automatic qualifying bids for NCAA postseason competition in baseball, bowling, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track and field, softball, volleyball and men's golf.

SEASON NOTES

COLLEGE FOOTBALL TURNS 150

The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference begins its 49th season of college football in 2019. College football is one of the most popular sports in the USA. Four college football stadiums, Penn State's Beaver Stadium, Michigan's Michigan Stadium, Ohio State's Ohio Stadium and Tennessee's Neyland Stadium hold more than 100,000 fans and their games are almost always sell outs. Even high school football games in some areas draw more than 10,000 fans.



The birth of football in the United States goes back to Nov. 6, 1869, when teams from Princeton and Rutgers universities met in New Brunswick, New Jersey, for the first intercollegiate football game. In the early games, each team was allowed 25 players. By 1873, this number had been reduced to 20, in 1876 it was reduced again to 15, and in 1880 to the present day number of 11.

Over the years, many changes have been made to the game. The playing field itself has been reduced in length from 120 yards, exclusive of end zones, to the present 100 yards, and in width from 100 yards, to the current 53-1/3 yards.

The first ball used was round, then became an oval shape 23 inches around the middle, and now is 20 3/4 -21 1/4 inches around the middle. Originally a touchdown was counted as two points and a field goal was five points. In the present day game, a touchdown is worth six points and a field goal three points. Changes in the rules have been made to maintain a balance between the offense and defense and to foster the safety of the players.

By 1906, the game was extremely rough and many injuries and some deaths had occurred. Educators considered dropping the sport despite its popularity on campuses. President Theodore Roosevelt, an ardent advocate of strenuous sports, declared that it must be made safer. As a result, football leaders revamped the game and many of the rougher tactics were outlawed.

One of the major changes to the rules was the legalizing of the forward pass. It was hoped, and this hope was proven correct, that by opening up the game fewer players would be injured in the mass rushing plays that were so popular and effective at the turn of the century. The rules committee also changed the downs system, requiring a team to make 10 yards, not five, in three tries for a first down. In 1912, the rule was changed to four tries, or downs, to make a first down.

After World War II, college football players began to receive athletics scholarships in such increasing numbers that today nearly every major college football player is paid room, board, tuition and other expenses, usually from donations from alumni and game profits. At the same time, the quality of the game has improved. Nearly all major college football teams are members of either the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) or the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), which implement the rules and oversee competition between teams.

MEAC OVERVIEW

The 2019 MEAC football schedule was comprised of 69 total games, including 36 conference contests, 33 non-conference games and a minimum of one postseason contest (Celebration Bowl).

The 2019 schedule will play out over 13 weeks with the conference schedule concluding on Nov. 23. The 2019 MEAC champion, North Carolina A&T State is scheduled to play against Alcorn State on national television in the Celebration Bowl on Dec. 21 in Atlanta, Ga. at the

Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Five teams on the 2019 MEAC schedule participated in 2018-19 postseason bowl games. Six of the MEAC's 18 games scheduled against Football Championship Subdivision teams were 2018 FCS Playoff participants.

The MEAC schedule also featured nine games versus Football Bowl Subdivision teams, with the first occurring on Aug. 29 and the finale' on Sept. 21.

NEW HEAD COACHES IN THE MEAC

After welcoming five new head coaches to the MEAC last year, there were three new faces walking the sideline this year as the 2019 season continues.

Ron Prince was the new man at Howard following the departure of Mike London to The College of William & Mary. Prince is the only one of the new coaches with head coaching experience, after serving as head coach at Kansas State from 2006-08. Prince joins the Bison after being at Michigan last season.

Former Michigan standout athlete and Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year Tyrone Wheatley is leading the Morgan State Bears in his first time as a college head coach. Wheatley comes to the Bears after coaching running backs with the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Trei Oliver became the third football coach in the MEAC to become head

coach at his alma mater, joining Rod Milstead (Delaware State) and Buddy Pough (South Carolina State) when he was hired by North Carolina Central on Dec. 13, 2018. This is Oliver's first head coaching position and he comes back home after spending the last three seasons as defensive coordinator at Southern University.

MEAC DIGITAL NETWORK ON ESPN

As part of a multi-year agreement reached last year, the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) and ESPN will stream all of the conference's football contests on ESPN3 and ESPN+, the multi-sport, direct-to-consumer subscription streaming service from The Walt Disney Company Direct-to-Consumer & International segment and ESPN.

There will be 34 MEAC football contests available on ESPN3 and ESPN+ this season, in addition to 10 televised contests on either ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU, which gives the conference 44 total linear and digital broadcasts across the ESPN family of networks.

MEAC TO IMPLEMENT INSTANT REPLAY

This season, the MEAC implemented instant replay for all football games,

starting with the first conference game of the 2019 season, which will be Saturday, Sept. 21, when Howard visits Delaware State. The following Saturday, Sept. 28, will be the first full weekend of conference play.

Each institution had the option to utilize the instant replay during non-conference games as well.

THE CELEBRATION BOWL

For the fifth consecutive season, the MEAC champion will participate in the Celebration Bowl against the champion from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC). Last year, North Carolina A&T State defeated Alcorn State 24-22.

The 2019 Celebration Bowl will be televised live on ABC to open up the college football bowl season and played at the Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, Ga. on Saturday, December 21. The all-time bowl series is at 3-1, as North Carolina A&T State leads the MEAC with three appearances.

FCS PLAYOFFS

With the participation of the MEAC champion in the Celebration Bowl, the conference does not have an automatic

bid to the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoffs. However, the league still has an opportunity to earn an at-large bid.

North Carolina A&T State earned an at-large bid in 2016 as it marked the first time since South Carolina State earned a bid in 2013, as both them and Bethune-Cookman participated in the playoffs that season.

The last FCS playoff win for the MEAC occurred in 1999, when Florida A&M defeated Appalachian State (44-29) and Troy State (17-10) en route to a semifinal appearance against Youngstown State (L, 41-3), who lost to Georgia Southern in the Championship game. North Carolina A&T State won its opening round contest against Tennessee State, 27-24 in the same year.

MEAC IN THE RANKINGS

After being ranked for the first time since 2009, Florida A&M finished the season ranked 20th in the STATS FCS Poll and 21st in the AFCA Coaches' Poll.

North Carolina A&T is 23rd in the STATS FCS rankings and 22nd in the AFCA Coaches' Poll. South Carolina State also picked up votes in both rankings.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Co-Offensive Player of the Week:

Jah-Maine Martin, RB, NC A&T State

• Junior running back Jah-Maine Martin was named MEAC Offensive Player of the Week for his play in the Aggies' 54-0 win over rival North Carolina Central in the Aggie-Eagle Classic. He averaged 11.1 yards per carry as he recorded another 50-plus yard touchdown run, his ninth of the season. Martin finished with 11 carries for 122 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensive Player of the Week:

Leon Smalls, DE, NC A&T State

• Senior defensive end Leon Smalls was named the MEAC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Aggies' 54-0 shutout win over rival North Carolina Central. He racked up nine tackles (five solo), six tackles for a loss, and two sacks. He also helped limit the Eagles to just nine yards of total offense and -6 yards rushing.

Offensive Lineman of the Week:

Nicholas Roos, OL, Bethune-Cookman

• Senior offensive lineman Nicholas Roos was named the MEAC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance in the Wildcats' 31-27 win over rival Florida A&M. Roos helped the Wildcats win their ninth straight game over the Rattlers in the Florida Blue Florida Classic. The Wildcats put up 467 yards of total offense and Roos had two pancake blocks and no penalties.

Rookie of the Week:

Corey Fields, QB, South Carolina State

• Freshman quarterback Corey Fields was named the MEAC Rookie of the Week for his performance in the Bulldogs' 20-17 win over Norfolk State. Fields completed 20-of-35 passes for 286 yards to help the Bulldogs claim a share of the 2019 MEAC Championship.

Co-Specialist of the Week:

Jonathan Thomas, WR, BCU

• Junior wide receiver Jonathan Thomas was named MEAC Co-Specialist of the Week for his play in the Wildcats' 31-27 win over rival Florida A&M. He took over kicking duties as a receiver and

went 4-4 on PATS and one-for-two on field goals, connecting on a 25-yard field goal.

Dillon Bredesen, K, SC State

• Sophomore kicker Dillon Bredesen was named MEAC Co-Specialist of the Week for his play in the Bulldogs' 20-17 win over Norfolk State to claim a share of the 2019 MEAC title. Bredesen made two field goals, from 29 and 27 yards, including the game-winner in overtime.

MEAC/SWAC HEAD TO HEAD

The MEAC and SWAC have met several times this season, with the MEAC going 3-0. Bethune-Cookman defeated Jackson State, 36-15, in the MEAC-SWAC Challenge. FAMU reignited its rivalry with Southern with a 27-21 victory and Bethune-Cookman beat Mississippi Valley State, 22-6.

WINNINGEST COACH

South Carolina State head coach Buddy Pough made history with a 24-10 win over Morgan State on Homecoming on Oct. 19, 2019. Pough won his 129th game to become the winningest coach in Bulldogs' history. He passed his coach, Hall of Famer Willie Jeffries, for the school record.

"This is a surreal moment at this point in my career," said Pough. "To reach a milestone of this magnitude is an awesome feeling and I am glad I had a chance to share it with my family and friends. Thank you to all the people that played a role in me reaching this accomplishment from the fans, alumni, faculty and administration."

JERRY RICE WATCH LIST

Norfolk State running back Kevin Johnson was named to the watch list for the Jerry Rice Award, given annually to the top freshman at the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Johnson is currently tied for third in the MEAC with nine total touchdowns, six rushing and three receiving. He also ranks fourth in the MEAC in all-purpose yards (105.4 ypg) and seventh in rushing yards (49.1 ypg).

WALTER PAYTON WATCH LIST

Florida A&M quarterback Ryan Stanley and North Carolina A&T State running back Jah-Maine Martin have been added to the Watch List for the Walter Payton Award, known by many as the Heisman of FCS. Stanley is rewriting FAMU's record books as he has led the Rattlers to eight straight wins, while Martin is the nation's top rusher at the FCS level, averaging nearly 127 yards a game on the ground. His 16 rushing touchdowns are by far the most in the conference.

ALL-TIME PASSING LEADER

Ryan Stanley rewrote the the Rattlers' record books this season. Stanley concluded his career by throwing for 213 yards and three touchdowns in the 31-27 loss to rival Bethune-Cookman in the Florida Classic. Stanley threw for 8,424 yards and 67 touchdowns during his time in Tallahassee, which broke the school records set by Quinn Gray. He leaves as the Rattlers all-time leader in passing attempts (1,187) and completions (636). He is second in MEAC history in passing yards behind Howard's Ted White (9,808). He's fourth in MEAC history in passing touchdowns. For his play on the field he was selected as the 2019 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year.

FLORIDA CLASSIC

Longtime Florida rivals Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M wrapped up their seasons with the 39th annual Florida Classic at Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Fla. The Wildcats put up 467 yards of total offense to snap their longtime rival's nine game winning streak. Akevious Williams threw for 269 yards and a touchdown and ran for 21 yards and another score. Isaac Washington had 12 carries for 104 yards and a touchdown. Marcus Riley caught seven passes for 98 yards. Trevor Merritt had a pick-six. Ryan Stanley threw for 213 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Rattlers in his final game. The win marks the Wildcats' ninth straight win in the Classic.

SEASON NOTES

AGGIE-EAGLE FOOTBALL CLASSIC

North Carolina A&T claimed state bragging rights after blowing out North Carolina Central, 54-0, to wrap up the regular season. This is the third straight win for the Aggies in the Classic. The 54 points were the most ever by North Carolina A&T against the Eagles. The 54-point margin was the largest ever in the series and it was the first time either team had reached or exceeded 50 points. Elijah Bell caught three passes for 109 yards and two touchdowns. Jah-Maine Martin had 11 carries for 122 yards and two touchdowns. Tre Smalls logged nine tackles, six for a loss, and two sacks.

ALL-TIME LEADING RECEIVER

Howard receiver Kyle Anthony finished his career as the all-time leader in receptions at Howard. He caught two passes for 21 yards and a touchdown in his final game. He finished his career with 203 catches, which is sixth all-time in MEAC history.

LEADING RUSHER IN THE COUNTRY

North Carolina A&T running back Jah-Maine Martin has been the next great back out of "Running Back U" this season. Martin carried the ball 11 times for 122 yards and two touchdowns in the Aggies' 54-0 win over rival North Carolina Central. He was named the MEAC Offensive Player of the Week for the fifth time this season. The 122 yards marked his sixth 100-yard game of the season. Martin finished the regular season with 171 carries for 1,336 yards and 21 touchdowns. The 21 touchdowns broke the school record, which was previously set by Tarik Cohen. Martin averaged 7.8 yards per carry, which led the nation, and 121.5 yards per game. He was second in scoring, third in rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns, and was fourth in yards per game. He finished sixth in rushing yards.

ELIJAH CUMMINGS TRIBUTE

Throughout the 2019-20 season, the Morgan State Bears student-athletes will celebrate the life of longtime Baltimore Congressman Elijah Cummings, who passed away on October 17, 2019, at

the age of 68. In honor of Congressman Cummings and all of his many positive contributions to the University and his district, all Morgan State athletic teams will wear a special commemorative "EC" patch on their jerseys throughout the season. The Bears football team helmets will also be adorned with an EC decal. "Our department wanted to do something to recognize the many important contributions of the Honorable Elijah Cummings to the country, the City of Baltimore, and Morgan State University," said Director of Athletics Edward Scott, Ph.D. "In speaking with our student athletes, coaches, and staff, we felt that the patches and decals would be the most appropriate way of demonstrating our appreciation to Regent Cummings and his family.

NATIONAL LEADERS

In addition to Martin, several other MEAC players and teams are nationally ranked in respective categories. Keenan Black (Delaware State), Jayden Brunson (South Carolina State), Manassah Bailey (Morgan State) and Deondre Daniels (South Carolina State) are all tied for second in punt return touchdowns. Marcus Williams (Florida A&M), Jimmie Robinson (Bethune-Cookman), and Brandon Codrington (North Carolina Central) are second in the nation in kick return touchdowns. Noel Ruiz (North Carolina A&T) is first in field goals per game and sixth in field goal percentage. Chris Faddoul (Florida A&M) is second in punting. Corey Fields (South Carolina State) and Deandre Harris (Morgan State) are second and third in passing yards per completion. De'Montrez Burroughs (South Carolina State) is sixth in receiving touchdowns. Xavier Smith (Florida A&M) is ninth in receiving yards and fifth in receiving yards per game. Joseph Stuckey (North Carolina A&T) is tied for second in fumbles recovered. Jimmie Robinson (Bethune-Cookman) is fourth in kickoff returns.

North Carolina A&T led the country in total defense and was 11th in scoring defense. South Carolina State is tied for first in the nation in blocked kicks, third

in blocked punts, and second in team tackles for a loss. Bethune-Cookman is tied for fifth in defensive touchdowns. Bethune-Cookman, Morgan State, Howard, and Delaware State are all in the top 10 in blocked kicks.

North Carolina Central is fifth in the country in fourth down conversion percentage defense.

BIG RINGS

North Carolina A&T State will make its third straight trip to the Celebration Bowl after embarrassing rival North Carolina Central. This will be the Aggies fourth trip in five years. The game itself is just five years old. Additionally, the Aggies claimed their 11th MEAC Championship. It will be their fifth conference title in six years. The Aggies are on the best run of any MEAC school since South Carolina State won six of seven titles from 1977-83. South Carolina State won a share of the title after defeating Norfolk State, 20-17 to claim their 17th championship and seventh of the Buddy Pough era.

- Stanley was also named the 2019 BOXTOROW Offensive Player of the Year
- North Carolina A&T linebacker Jacob Roberts is a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, awarded to the top rookie.

- South Carolina State head coach Buddy Pough is a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, awarded to the top coach.

YEARLY AWARDS

- Florida A&M's Ryan Stanley was named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year after shattering the Rattlers' record books. He threw for 2,566 yards and 23

touchdowns this season. He is second in MEAC history in passing yards behind Howard's Ted White (9,808). He's fourth in MEAC history in passing touchdowns.

- North Carolina Central's Darius Royster was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year after tying for the MEAC lead in sacks and tackles for a loss. He's just the second MEAC DPOY from North Carolina Central, since Alexander Jones won it in 1971.

- North Carolina A&T's Marcus Pettiford was named MEAC Lineman of the Year after helping pave the way for Jah-Maine Martin to be the lone 1,000-yard rusher in the MEAC. Martin leads the nation in rushing yards per carry and is second in scoring. Pettiford is three-time MEAC Lineman of the Week winner.

- South Carolina State's Corey Fields was named MEAC Rookie of the Year after throwing for 1,652 yards and 15 touchdowns and helping the Bulldogs to a share of the MEAC title. Fields was third in the MEAC in passing efficiency (138.7). He threw a school record seven touchdown passes against Howard.

- South Carolina State's Buddy Pough was named MEAC Coach of the Year after guiding the Bulldogs to an 8-3 (6-2 MEAC) record and a share of the MEAC title. The Bulldogs claimed their 17th title and the seventh of Pough's tenure.

MILESTONES

- Florida A&M finished unbeaten at home and had nine wins for the first time since 2009.

- Florida A&M coach Willie Simmons joins Rattler legends Rudy Hubbard (9-2 in 1975) and Billy Joe (9-3 in 1995) in reaching nine wins in their second season as head coach.

- Florida A&M's Xavier Smith finished the season with 77 receptions for 1,159 yards and 11 touchdowns. He's the lone MEAC player to finish with 1,000 yards.

- Morgan State's Manasseh Bailey finished the season with 54 catches for 996 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 996 yards is second in school history behind Clarence Holzendorf (1,702). He finishes his career 14th in receptions, ninth in receiving yards, and second in touchdowns. His 10 touchdowns this season are a school record.

- North Carolina A&T's Elijah Bell became just the sixth player in MEAC history with 200 career receptions.

THOMAS TO BE HONORED

MEAC Commissioner Dr. Dennis E. Thomas will be inducted into the Black College Football Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2020 on Saturday, Feb. 22, 2020. Dr. Thomas, who is in his 18th year as Commissioner of the MEAC, was the Director of Athletics at Hampton University from 1990-2002 and led the Pirates' transition from Division II to Division I. During his time as Commissioner, the conference office has seen nearly two decades of financial stability, strengthened institutional compliance and improved student-athlete graduation rates. The conference is also the 100 percent owner of its headquarters building in Norfolk, Va.

Dr. Thomas presented to ESPN the idea of a postseason bowl game between the MEAC and Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) champions that evolved into the Celebration Bowl. During his tenure, the MEAC became the first FCS conference to institute instant replay for all TV games. He also played a major role in creating the MEAC/SWAC Challenge, which along with the Celebration Bowl bookends the black college football season.

The MEAC has also launched the MEAC Digital Network under Dr. Thomas' leadership, streaming every conference football game not broadcast on a linear (TV) platform on ESPN3 and ESPN+. The MEAC has also produced a series of first-of-its-kind documentaries interviewing and highlighting HBCU football coaching legends.

Dr. Thomas was a standout at Alcorn State, twice earning First Team All-America honors from the Pittsburgh Courier (1972, 1973), and he was the first and only offensive lineman to win the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year award in 1973. Dr. Thomas was enshrined into the Alcorn State Hall of Fame in 2010 and the SWAC Hall of

Fame in 2003. He was also inducted into the Hampton University Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009.

Dr. Thomas will also receive the SWAC Alumni Association's Distinguished Service Award during the association's Legends Awards and Roast in Atlanta, Ga. on Friday, Dec. 20.
