### MEAC Players of the Week

The MEAC will name Players of the Week each Monday throughout the regular season in the following categories: Offense, Defense, Rookie, Offensive Lineman and Special Teams. Nominees are submitted to the conference office through member institutions' sports information offices, and the winners will be announced via email and the conference website each Monday.

### Postseason Awards

Following the conclusion of regular-season play, the MEAC will conduct a vote for all-conference teams, to be conducted by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Each body will vote on a First and Second Team all-conference squad, as well as Offensive Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year and Offensive Lineman of the Year. The head coaches will also vote on a Coach of the Year.

### MEAC Football Tiebreaker System

The MEAC's tiebreaker system is used to determine which team will receive the conference's berth to the Cricket Celebration Bowl. For a two-team or multiple-team tie, if all teams played each other, head-to-head competition will be used to determine the representative. For multiple ties, the head-to-head record against all tied teams will be used.

1. If a tie still exists, then the following shall be used:
  - A. Six (6) points will be awarded for a win against a non-conference Div. I FBS team;
  - B. Four (4) points will be awarded for a win against a non-conference Div. I FCS team;
  - C. Four (4) points will be deducted for a loss against a non-Div. I opponent.

The team with the highest point total shall receive the MEAC's berth to the Cricket Celebration Bowl.

2. If the tie still exists, then the following shall be used:
  - A. The team with the highest Sagarin ranking;
  - B. A coin toss by the Commissioner.

# MEAC HISTORY

## Step IN

### The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC)

enters its 52nd year of intercollegiate competition with the 2022-23 academic school year. Located in Norfolk, Va., the MEAC is made up of eight outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline: Coppin State University, Delaware State University, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, Norfolk State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State University.

The MEAC sponsors 14 Division I (FCS) sports: bowling, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field, softball and volleyball. The MEAC receives automatic NCAA qualification bids in seven sports – men's and women's basketball, women's bowling, men's and women's tennis, softball and volleyball. The MEAC's football champion is pitted against the champion of the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in the Cricket Celebration Bowl, which debuted in December 2015.

MEAC student-athletes excel on and off the field, and several have been recognized on ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America and All-District teams. The conference sponsors All-Academic teams in each of its sports and awards two post-graduate scholarships of \$5,000 each annually to one male and one female student-athlete who have excelled academically and athletically and are in their final season of intercollegiate athletics eligibility and competition under MEAC and NCAA regulations.

### HISTORY

In 1969, a bold ad hoc group of innovators long associated with intercollegiate athletics met in Durham, N.C. to discuss the feasibility of organizing a new conference. From these discussions, they formed a steering and planning committee to fully investigate the idea, presented a detailed report with recommendations to interested collegiate institutions, and constructed a workshop to outline proposals.

After selecting a proposal and adopting a program, seven institutions (Delaware State College, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, North Carolina A&T State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State College) agreed to become the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Their major objective was to establish, organize and supervise an intercollegiate athletic program among a compact group of education institutions of high academic standards with a sound philosophy of co-curricular activities. The conference agreed to seek Division I status for its sports.

The conference was confirmed in 1970, kicking off its first season of competition in football in 1971.

In 1978, the MEAC reached a milestone when it selected Kenneth A. Free to be its first full-time commissioner. Free served the conference for 18 years before stepping down in May 1996. In July 1996, Charles S. Harris was named commissioner, and he served in that capacity until April 2002. On Sept. 1, 2002, Dr. Dennis E. Thomas was named commissioner and served in the position for 20 years.

On Jan. 1, 2022, Sonja Stills became the MEAC's first female commissioner and the first female commissioner of a Div. I HBCU conference.

The conference's first expansion occurred in October 1979, when Bethune-Cookman College and Florida A&M University were voted into the MEAC as new members. Original members Morgan State, North Carolina Central and Maryland Eastern Shore withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1979-80 fiscal year; Maryland Eastern Shore was readmitted in 1981 and Morgan State returned in 1984. Florida A&M opted to resign in 1984, but rejoined the conference in 1986. Coppin State College was grant-

ed admittance in 1985, becoming the ninth member institution.

The MEAC expanded again in the 1990s with the inclusion of Hampton University (1995) and Norfolk State University (1997). The conference grew once again in 2007, adding Winston-Salem State University. Winston-Salem State, a MEAC provisional member, did not meet the qualifications for Division I and withdrew from the conference following the 2009-10 academic and athletic season.

On July 1, 2010, the MEAC made its most recent expansion with the admittance of North Carolina Central and Savannah State University. On Sept. 10, 2014, the MEAC admitted Augusta University (formerly Georgia Regents University) as an associate member for men's golf. In June 2018, the MEAC added Alabama Birmingham (UAB) and Monmouth as associate members for women's bowling, effective for the 2018-19 academic year.

As of July 1, 2018, Hampton was no longer a member of the MEAC. Savannah State followed suit one year later, opting to return to the Div. II ranks.

As of July 1, 2021, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and North Carolina A&T State are no longer members of the MEAC, though North Carolina A&T State does hold associate membership with the conference for the sport of women's bowling.

Augusta University, associate member for men's golf, also left the conference as of July 1, 2021.

On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the NCAA; prior to that year, the conference had operated on the Division II level. The month after achieving Div. I status, the MEAC received automatic qualification to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship. Currently, the conference has automatic qualifying bids for NCAA postseason play in baseball (since 1994), men's basketball (since 1981), women's basketball (since 1982), men's golf (since 2014), softball (since 1995), men's and women's tennis (since 1998), volleyball (since 1994) and women's bowling (since 2018).

The MEAC declares champions in six men's sports – basketball, cross country, football, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field and tennis – and eight women's sports – basketball, bowling, cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, softball, tennis and volleyball.

The MEAC initiated cross country in 1980, and North Carolina A&T State earned the inaugural men's crown. The first women's cross country championship took place a year later, with Howard winning the first of its seven titles. Indoor track & field was also added in 1981, with South Carolina State winning the men's title and Howard taking the women's crown.

Tennis returned as MEAC-sponsored sports in 1981 after a five-year hiatus. South Carolina State won all seven of the conference's golf championships from 1972-83 before the sport was discontinued following the 1983 championship.

In wrestling, Morgan State won 13 of 24 conference championships before the sport was discontinued in 1995.

Baseball, which began in 1972, was discontinued following the 1977 season. It was brought back as a MEAC-governed sport, along with the addition of women's volleyball, in 1983. Women's softball became a MEAC-sanctioned sport in 1992.

Bowling was officially sanctioned as a MEAC sport in 1999. The MEAC was the first conference to secure NCAA sanctioning for women's bowling by

adopting the club sport prior to the 1996-97 school year.

Men's golf returned as a MEAC-sponsored sport in 2014, with six teams participating in the conference championship. Bethune-Cookman was crowned the 2014 champion; the Wildcats also won the 2014 PGA Minority Collegiate Championship. Associate member Augusta University earned its first MEAC golf title in 2015, the institution's first year of conference competition, before repeating in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019. Howard claimed the 2022 MEAC championship in just its second year sponsoring the sport following a donation by the NBA's Steph Curry to fund both the men's golf programs for a six-year period beginning in 2020-21. The Bison also claimed the 2022 PGA Works title, while Gregory Odom, Jr. was the 2022 individual champion at the MEAC and PGA Works Championships.

In July 2022, four MEAC baseball teams (Coppin State, Delaware State, Maryland Eastern Shore and Norfolk State) and three men's golf programs (Howard, Maryland Eastern Shore and North Carolina Central) temporarily joined the Northeast Conference as associate members. The schools will retain primary membership in the MEAC and begin competing in the NEC in the 2022-23 academic year.

### SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS

The MEAC has enjoyed tremendous athletic success over the years. In 2008, Maryland Eastern Shore defeated Arkansas State 4-2 to win the NCAA Women's Bowling National Championship, a first for both the conference and the institution. With the victory, Lady Hawks head coach Sharon Brummell became the first female head coach to win an NCAA bowling title. The Lady Hawks repeated the feat in 2011, winning the school's second NCAA bowling title; during that same season, Maryland Eastern Shore won the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Intercollegiate Team Championship (ITC), becoming the first team to win two national championships in the same year.

In 2012, Maryland Eastern Shore captured its third NCAA bowling championship in five years with a 4-2 win over Fairleigh Dickinson. The Lady Hawks became the second team in NCAA bowling history to win three championships and the first to make four appearances in the championship finale.

In men's basketball, Maryland Eastern Shore became the first historically black college/university (HBCU) to participate in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT), doing so in 1974. The Hawks defeated Manhattan 84-81 in the first round before falling to Jacksonville in the second round. Before the Jacksonville loss, the Hawks had the nation's best record at 27-1. That same year, Morgan State won the NCAA College Division II National Championship and junior center Marvin "The Human Eraser" Webster was named the Division II Player of the Year.

Howard became the first MEAC school to play in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championships in 1981, taking on Wyoming in the first round.

Coppin State, Hampton and Norfolk State have each made history in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament with first-round victories. Coppin State, the No. 15 seed, defeated No. 2 seed South Carolina in 1997, before Hampton repeated the No. 15-over-No. 2 upset feat in 2001 against Iowa State. Both victories have been ranked among ESPN SportsCenter's top 10 greatest tournament upsets. In 2012, Norfolk State became the fifth team in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament history (and the third MEAC team) to upset a No. 2 seed; the Spartans upended Missouri in the round of 64 that year.

Of the eight instances in which a No. 15 seed has defeated a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the MEAC boasts three of them.

Norfolk State shined on the national postseason stage again in 2019; after

the Spartans won the men's basketball regular-season title, they earned an automatic bid to the NIT – where, as a No. 8 seed, they upset top seed Alabama on the Crimson Tide's home floor, 80-79 in overtime. Norfolk State became the fourth MEAC school to win an NIT game (UMES 1974, Coppin State 1995, Delaware State 2006).

In women's basketball, South Carolina State won the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (IAIW) Division II National Championship in 1979. In 1982, Howard became the first MEAC school to play in the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament. In 1983, South Carolina State won the MEAC's automatic NCAA bid and became the first conference team, male or female, to win an opening-round game in the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament.

In 2010, North Carolina A&T State defeated Wake Forest and Charlotte before falling to Miami in the third round of the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT). The Lady Aggies became the first MEAC team – and first HBCU – to win two consecutive basketball games in a national post-season tournament.

In football, the MEAC was instrumental in constructing the Celebration Bowl, the Freedom Bowl All-Star Classic, the Heritage Bowl and the Gold Bowl. Prior to Division I competition, the MEAC competed in the Gold Bowl, held in Richmond, Va., which matched the MEAC champion against the champion of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). South Carolina State represented the MEAC in 1976 and 1979, winning both outings over Winston-Salem State and Norfolk State, respectively. In addition to the 1976 and 1979 crowns, South Carolina State won MEAC football titles in 1974-78, 1980-83, 1994, 2004, 2008, 2009. The Bulldogs were also named co-champions along with Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M in 2010, before sharing the 2013 title with Bethune-Cookman, the 2014 title with four other teams and the 2019 title with North Carolina A&T State. During the 1981 and 1982 seasons, South Carolina State reached the second round of the NCAA Div. I-AA championships.

In 2015, the MEAC combined with the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, Ga. North Carolina A&T State defeated Alcorn State in the inaugural Celebration Bowl to determine the Black College National Champion in a game pitting the MEAC and SWAC champions. North Carolina Central represented the MEAC in the 2016 Celebration Bowl, taking on Grambling State.

North Carolina A&T State returned to the Celebration Bowl in 2017, defeating Grambling State 21-14 to complete the first undefeated season in MEAC history and claim the Aggies' second Black College National Championship in three years. North Carolina A&T State repeated in 2018, defeating Alcorn State 24-22. NCAT defeated Alcorn State again in 2019 for the Aggies' fourth Celebration Bowl win in the game's five years of existence.

In 2021, South Carolina State defeated heavily-favored Jackson State 31-10 to give the Bulldogs their first Cricket Celebration Bowl title and the MEAC a 5-1 record in the bowl game.

The MEAC also has a strong presence in the National Football League (NFL), both throughout the league's history and today. For the start of the 2022 season, there were 12 former MEAC players on active NFL rosters – highlighted by South Carolina State's Darius Leonard.

Leonard, a two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, was taken in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts; that same season, he was named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year after leading the league in total tackles. He was also named First Team All-Pro that season, and in 2019, Leonard was named to the Pro Bowl.





# MEAC HISTORY

## Step IN

In 2003, Florida A&M became the first MEAC school to win a volleyball match in the NCAA Championships with a first-round victory over Winthrop. In 2004, the Lady Rattlers became the first HBCU to rank in the Top 25 of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) national poll, coming in at No. 22.

In outdoor track & field, the North Carolina Central men won the first three MEAC titles. In addition, the quartet of Melvin Bassett, Robert Ouko, Julius Sang and Larry Black set the world record in the sprint medley relay with a time of 38.19 in the 1972 Olympics. In addition, the Eagles finished fourth in the 1974 NCAA Division I Men's Outdoor Track & Field Championship. Women began outdoor track & field competition in the MEAC in 1980 – and in 1982, South Carolina State won the AIAW Division II Outdoor Track & Field National Championship.

In 2021, North Carolina A&T State became the first HBCU to finish in the top three of the team standings at the NCAA Div. I Outdoor Track & Field Championships, finishing third in the men's team standings. The Aggies won two national titles at the meet, with Randolph Ross winning the 400 meters and the 4x400-meter relay team winning gold (to go along with the gold medal they won earlier that year in the NCAA indoor meet). On the women's side, Cambrea Sturgis gave the MEAC two more national titles, winning NCAA crowns in the 100 and 200 meters.

The MEAC has showcased over 35 athletes in the Olympics over the years, and 13 of them have earned medals during the Summer Games.

At No. 72, South Carolina State became the first MEAC women's tennis team to finish the season ranked in the 2005 Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Division I final poll. In 2012, South Carolina State's Maria Craciun became the first tennis player in school and MEAC history to receive a berth to the NCAA Individual Singles Championship.

In Augusta's seven seasons as an associate member for men's golf, the Jaguars won the conference championship in five of those years. In 2018, Augusta not only won the MEAC title and made it to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, but senior Broc Everett wrapped up his collegiate career by winning the NCAA individual national championship, defeating Auburn's Brandon Mancheno in a playoff.

In softball, Bethune-Cookman earned the MEAC's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Softball Championship in 2005. The Lady Wildcats defeated Florida, Central Florida and South Florida in the Florida Regional to become the first MEAC program to win an NCAA Division I Softball Regional. Bethune-Cookman ended the 2005 season with the conference's first-ever national ranking, reaching No. 18 in the season's final NFCA/USA Today Coaches poll and No. 23 in the USA Softball/ESPN.com poll.

Florida A&M was the first MEAC baseball team to advance to NCAA post-season play in 1994. The Rattlers took on Southeastern Louisiana in a best-of-three play-in series, falling 11-10 and 8-7 in two games. During the 2002 season, Bethune-Cookman advanced to the Gainesville Regional and became the first MEAC team to win a game in the NCAA Tournament with a 7-4 victory over Florida International. In 2017, the Wildcats became the first MEAC school to advance to a regional final, winning three games in the Gainesville Regional – including a 6-2 win over national No. 3 seed Florida.

# 2021-22 SEASON IN REVIEW

## Step IN

### CROSS COUNTRY

The first MEAC hardware of the 2021-22 season was given out at the WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, N.C., where North Carolina Central served as host of the 2021 MEAC Cross Country Championships. Norfolk State swept the team championships on that sun-splashed October morning, successfully defending their titles from 2019 – the last year the MEAC held a championship in cross country. For the men, the Spartans' Evans Cheruiyot was named Outstanding Performer after winning gold with a 25-minute, 11-second time over the 8-kilometer course. Jada Banks of South Carolina State won the women's individual crown, completing the 5-kilometer course in 18 minutes, 40.6 seconds en route to being named Outstanding Performer. Norfolk State's Kenneth Giles took home Outstanding Coach honors for both the men's and women's championships. The Norfolk State men went on to compete in the NCAA Southeast Regional, hosted by the University of Kentucky.

### VOLLEYBALL

Howard University reclaimed its spot atop the MEAC volleyball standings, tying with Delaware State for the regular-season title after both teams went 12-2 in league play. Coppin State's Miajavon Coleman was named MEAC Player of the Year, while Howard's Bria Woodard took home Rookie of the Year honors. North Carolina Central's Lauren Janok was named Setter of the Year and Ashley Roman of Coppin State took home Defensive Player of the Year accolades for the second straight season. Dr. Bruce Atkinson of Delaware State was named Coach of the Year. The Bison advanced to the title match of the 2021 MEAC Volleyball Championship on their home floor, where they defeated the Hornets in four sets to win their sixth title in the last seven seasons. Howard's Cimone Woodard was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer, while Shaun Kupferberg took home Outstanding Coach honors. The Bison earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Volleyball Championship, taking on No. 9 seed Ohio State. Delaware State earned a bid to the National Invitational Volleyball Championship, where they met Boston College in the first round and giving the MEAC two postseason berths.

### FOOTBALL

South Carolina State reclaimed its status as the class of the MEAC gridiron, going a perfect 5-0 in conference play and defeating Norfolk State on the final day of the regular season to claim the Bulldogs' 18th all-time championship – and the corresponding bid to the Cricket Celebration Bowl. There, MEAC Coach of the Year Buddy Pough led the Bulldogs against Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) champion Jackson State. Despite the Tigers being decided favorites, South Carolina State came away with a 31-10 win in front of a national television audience in Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium to give the MEAC a 4-1 all-time record in the bowl game. Norfolk State took home three of the MEAC's five regular-season honors, with running back J.J. Davis and offensive lineman Justin Redd being named MEAC Rookie of the Year and Offensive Lineman of the Year, respectively. As the calendar flipped to December, the MEAC was in star-studded Las Vegas for the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame's annual induction ceremony. There, Spartans quarterback Juwan Carter was named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, while South Carolina State defensive back Decobie Durant was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year. The MEAC is the only conference to announce its Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year at the NFF's annual ceremonies, and this partnership has been in place since 2016.

### INDOOR TRACK & FIELD

The MEAC Indoor Track & Field Championships returned for the 2021-22 season and found a new venue: the Virginia Beach Sports Center in Virginia Beach, Va. The meet was a return to form of sorts for the Spartans and the Bison, as Norfolk State and Howard were the top two teams in both the men's and women's team standings. The Howard women won their first indoor title since 1989 with a dominant performance, racking up a meet-record 184 points. Coppin State's Kamillah Monroque was named Outstanding Runner, while Howard's Minyarn Small and David Oliver were named Outstanding Field Performer and Outstanding Coach, respectively. On the men's side, Norfolk State won its first indoor championship since 2013 and its 11th overall, ranking up 175 points to Howard's 125. The Bison's Gavin Williams was named Outstanding Runner after winning two gold medals and one silver, while Morgan State's Kobe-Jordan Rhooms repeated as Outstanding Field Performer and the Spartans' Kenneth Giles was the Outstanding Coach.

### MEN'S BASKETBALL

The defending champion Norfolk State Spartans served notice that they're still the class of the MEAC, going 12-2 in conference play to take the regular-season title and the No. 1 seed in the 2022 MEAC Basketball Tournament (March 9-12 at the Norfolk Scope Arena). Norfolk State won 24 games and swept its way through the tournament field, defeating Delaware State in the quarterfinals and Morgan State in the semifinals before taking care of No. 7 seed Coppin State in the championship game. The Spartans won their second straight MEAC tournament title, and MEAC Player of the Year Joe Bryant, Jr. was named the championship's Outstanding Performer – while MEAC Coach of the Year Robert Jones was the tournament's Outstanding Coach. Howard's Elijah Hawkins and Delaware State's Christopher Sodom were named MEAC Rookie of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year, respectively. The Spartans earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, taking on No. 1 seed and defending national champion Baylor in the first round. Morgan State and Maryland Eastern Shore also saw postseason play, as both teams competed in The Basketball Classic (formerly the CollegelInsider Tournament).

### WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The 2021-22 season was one of redemption for the Howard Bison, after narrowly losing the MEAC title the previous year. The preseason favorites went 11-3 in MEAC play to earn a three-way tie for the regular-season crown with Norfolk State and Morgan State, but Howard earned the top seed for the MEAC Basketball Tournament (March 9-12 at the Norfolk Scope Arena) via tiebreaker. Coppin State had the MEAC Player of the Year in Jaia Alexander and the Coach of the Year in Laura Harper, while North Carolina Central's Diamond Thomas was named Rookie of the Year and Norfolk State's Camille Downs the Defensive Player of the Year. Once the tournament started, Howard made short work of Delaware State in the quarterfinals before taking care of Maryland Eastern Shore in the semifinals to set up a championship game match-up against Norfolk State. The Bison took that game 61-44 to claim their first MEAC tournament title since 2001 and their 11th overall – most in MEAC history. Howard's Destiny Howell was named Outstanding Performer after scoring a career-high 25 points in the championship game, and Ty Grace earned Outstanding Coach honors. The Bison claimed the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, winning their First Four match-up against Incarnate Word for the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament win, before facing eventual national champion South Carolina in the first round. Norfolk State also earned a postseason bid, competing against Drexel in a defensive struggle in the first round of the Women's NIT.





# 2021-22 SEASON IN REVIEW

## Step IN

### BOWLING

The MEAC wrapped up regular-season play with five nationally-ranked teams – led by No. 5 and MEAC regular-season champion North Carolina A&T State. Delaware State ended the regular season at No. 14, with Maryland Eastern Shore No. 17, Morgan State No. 19 and Monmouth No. 24. The Aggies boasted the MEAC Bowler of the Year in Melanie Katen and the MEAC Coach of the Year in Kim Terrell-Kearney, while Delaware State had the MEAC Rookie of the Year in Sydney Reardon. North Carolina A&T State was the top seed in the MEAC Bowling Championship, which was held at Pinboy's at the Beach in Virginia Beach, and the Aggies squared off against Delaware State in the championship match. North Carolina A&T State won that match 4-0 to claim its second straight MEAC title and seventh overall. Lauren Tomaszewski was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer, while Terrell-Kearney earned Outstanding Coach honors. North Carolina A&T State earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Bowling National Championship, where the Aggies faced off against Louisiana Tech in the Arlington Regional. Delaware State competed in the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Intercollegiate Team Championships.

### MEN'S GOLF

The 2022 MEAC Men's Golf Championship was held at the Argyle Country Club in Silver Spring, Md., and though Mother Nature was not a fan for the first two days, Howard University endured en route to winning the first golf championship in program history. The Bison finished 18 shots ahead of second-place North Carolina Central, and Howard's Gregor Odom, Jr. was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer after winning the individual title with a 12-over 225. He shot in the 70s in all three rounds, including a tournament-low 72 in the final round. Bison head coach Sam Puryear was named the tournament's Outstanding Coach.

### MEN'S TENNIS

South Carolina State was again the class of the MEAC on the tennis courts, with the Bulldogs taking the regular-season crown after going undefeated in conference play. Freshman Rostislav Halfinger was named both MEAC Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year, while Bulldogs coach Hardeep Judge was again named MEAC Coach of the Year. The 2022 MEAC Tennis Championships had a new venue in 2022: the Cary Tennis Park in Cary, N.C. But even with the new surroundings, the result was the same, as South Carolina State claimed its 17th MEAC championship with a 4-0 win over Morgan State in the championship match (which was streamed live for the first time ever on HBCUGo.tv). Judge was the tournament's Outstanding Coach, while Omer Gorgun was named Outstanding Performer. The Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA Men's Tennis Championship, where they faced No. 10 seed South Carolina in the first round.

### WOMEN'S TENNIS

The 2022 MEAC women's tennis season saw Howard University emerge as regular-season champion after the Bison went a perfect 6-0 in league play – including a win over perennial conference power South Carolina State. Howard had the MEAC Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in Jordan Grayson and Nicholas Askew, respectively, while Delaware State's Kit Yi Kaye Au-Yeung was named MEAC Rookie of the Year. South Carolina State had its revenge at the MEAC Tennis Championships at the Cary Tennis Park in Cary, N.C., defeating Howard 4-0 in the title match to win their 16th championship in program history. Hardeep Judge was the tournament's Outstanding Coach and Nalanda Silva, who was perfect in both singles and doubles play during the tournament,

was named Outstanding Performer. The Bulldogs drew top overall seed North Carolina in the first round of the NCAA Women's Tennis Championship.

### OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

The MEAC Outdoor Track & Field Championships, held for the first time at Norfolk State's Dick Price Stadium, wound up looking much the same as the indoor meet in February. Norfolk State won its first men's outdoor title since 2012, racking up 192.5 points to second-place Howard's 163.5. Evans Cheruiyot was named the meet's Outstanding Runner after winning the 5,000 meters, 10,000 meters and 3,000-meter steeplechase, while North Carolina Central's Matthew Swepson placed top-three in all four throwing events to earn Outstanding Field Performer honors. Norfolk State's Kenneth Giles was named Outstanding Coach. On the women's side, Howard won its first outdoor title since 1980, tallying 226 points to run away with the trophy. South Carolina State's Jada Banks was named Outstanding Runner, while Norfolk State's Leslie Young earned Outstanding Field Performer honors and Howard's David Oliver was named the meet's Outstanding Coach.

### SOFTBALL

While the Outdoor Track & Field Championships were going on at Dick Price Stadium, the 2022 MEAC Softball Championship was being contested down the street at the NSU Softball Field. Defending champion Morgan State came into the tournament as the top seed after winning the regular season with an 18-3 conference mark. Norfolk State's Tuli Iosefa was named MEAC Player of the Year, while teammate Kenna Higa shared Rookie of the Year honors with Maryland Eastern Shore's Tatum Kresley. Morgan State's Anaya Hunte was named MEAC Pitcher of the Year, and Maryland Eastern Shore's Karla Ross was the Coach of the Year. Morgan State cruised to the championship game, where the Bears faced No. 2 seed Howard. The Bison won the first game 5-0 to force the if-necessary game – which Howard then took 5-4 to win the Bison's first MEAC softball title since 2007. Howard's Analise De La Roca was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer, while Tori Tyson was named Outstanding Coach. Howard went on to the NCAA Softball Championship, competing in the Tallahassee Region – where the Bison faced Florida State and Mississippi State.

### BASEBALL

The 2021-22 academic year wrapped up on Norfolk State's campus with the 2022 MEAC Baseball Championship at Marty L. Miller Field. The regular season saw Delaware State take the crown from Coppin State down the stretch, previewing what would become an epic championship match-up. Delaware State's Trey Paige was named MEAC Player of the Year after establishing himself as one of the best offensive players in the nation, and the Hornets' J.P. Blandin was named MEAC Coach of the Year. Coppin State's Jordan Hamberg and Josh Hankins were named Pitcher of the Year and Rookie of the Year, respectively. The Eagles and Hornets met in the championship round of the tournament, and Delaware State forced the if-necessary game by taking the first contest 4-3 thanks to a complete-game, 11-strikeout performance from Evan Harris. The second game saw a little bit of everything, and Coppin State scored 13 of its 18 runs in the last three innings – including eight in the ninth – to win 18-12 and claim its first MEAC baseball title since 1995. The Eagles' Brian Nicolas was named Outstanding Performer of the championship and Sherman Reed was named Outstanding Coach.





# COMMISSIONER SONJA O. STILLS

## Step IN



Sonja O. Stills has been a respected, well-known staple within the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference for the past 19 years. As of Jan. 1, 2022, she became the seventh commissioner of the MEAC, the fourth full-time commissioner and the first female commissioner in the league's history. Stills is also the first female commissioner of a Div. I HBCU conference.

In her first several months as commissioner, Stills has spearheaded the creation of the MEAC Nation Association, forged a new broadcast partnership with HBCUGo.TV and fostered MEAC initiatives relating to Mental Health Awareness Month, Pride Month and the celebration of Title IX's 50th anniversary.

With a proven track record of accountability, efficiency, and passion, she has risen through the ranks within the MEAC, beginning with her

tenure at the conference in October 2002. Stills has made a name for herself among her peers and other industry professionals for her never-ending dedication to the conference and its student-athletes, ability to grow and innovate, organization, team-first mentality, and goal-achieving initiative.

In January 2021, Stills was promoted to Chief of Staff/Chief Operating Officer of the MEAC. In her new role, she ensures that the Commissioner is carrying out the strategic objectives of the Council of Chief Executive Officers and the Delegate Assembly. Stills remains the lead on all hiring, strategic and long-range planning, re-branding, and marketing, NCAA Name, Image and Likeness (NIL), conference budget, the renewal of the MEAC Basketball Tournament with the City of Norfolk, and all special events and activities.

Stills also served as the Director of Esports, a new, cutting-edge initiative that began in the summer of 2020, as the conference and world continued to deal with the progression of the COVID-19 pandemic. She took charge in this new position, serving as the key driver in developing regulations for the MEAC Esports Community and developing the MEAC's esports strategy. Her goal is to enhance awareness of the MEAC's esports initiative by working with industry business leaders to encourage growth.

Much like overseeing the addition of esports to the MEAC's portfolio, Stills looks to enter a new tenure for the conference while continuing to bolster the respect, traditions, and love of the MEAC. She looks to deepen the communication with the member institutions, alumni, fans, and community, to express the strong desire and support for the success and sustainability of the Conference that transparently articulates its vision and strategy. The intention is to create a collaborative process in which the "new vision" for the MEAC is a shared vision that is all inclusive athletically and academically.

Before those appointments, Stills served as the Senior Associate Commissioner for Administration and Compliance (June 2012-21), Assistant Commissioner for Administration and Compliance (July 2008-12), Executive Assistant to the Commissioner (July 2006-08), Senior Woman Administrator (June 2006-21) and Director of Compliance (October 2002-08).

Since arriving at the MEAC, Stills has elevated overall brand visibility for the conference. She has negotiated over \$683,000 in corporate partnership monies by working with major companies such as: iHeartRadio, US Marines, Home Depot, Hampton Roads Transit, JT Fisher Funeral Home, Priority Automotive, ESI, TowneBank, Glenmede Financials, House-Autry, CurtMont Food Services and Harley Davison. She assisted in negotiating a contract with Nike that will bring over \$9 million to member institutions. She operates with the financial interests of the conference; its member institutions and student-athletes are at the forefront for her. She designed and implemented the Athletic Eligibility Certification Review to assist institutions in preparing for the NCAA Academic Progress Program (APP) Data Review. She managed the budgets for the Conference Grant, Student Athlete Opportunity Fund and Special Assistant Fund. She was instrumental in developing the MEAC Strategic and Long-Range Plan in December 2008, along with securing global creative agency 160over90 as the marketing company for the MEAC in 2020.

As the Senior Associate Commissioner, Stills provided supervision for Conference staff, including Compliance, Championship, Media Relations, Finance, Corporate Partnerships, Multimedia/Marketing, Digital & Video and administrative support staff. She took the helm and managed the operations of the Conference Office in the absence

of the Commissioner, coordinated all ancillary events of the Conference (i.e., Football Press Luncheon, Basketball Tournament Tip-Off Banquet, Cheerleading Championship, Pre-Season Basketball Press Luncheon, etc.) and Mid-Winter, Spring and Summer Conference meetings. During the conference basketball tournaments, Stills provided guidance and insight while monitoring the NCAA Academic Progress Program (APP) for member institutions to implement the APP Seminar with NCAA Academic and Membership Staff.

She also provided administrative support to the Commissioner for the Council of Chief Executive Officers and Executive Committee and conducted conference compliance workshops, reviews, and spot checks to ensure compliance with Conference and NCAA rules and regulations. She served as liaison to the conference's Compliance Coordinators, Athletics Academic Support staff, Alumni Directors and Constitution and By-laws committees, as well as assisting with other conference committees. Under Stills' guidance as the Assistant Commissioner for Administration, she coordinated the MEAC Cheerleading Championship—the only HBCU collegiate cheerleading championship.

During her time as the Executive Assistant to the Commissioner, Stills provided direct support to the Commissioner, administrative support to the Commissioner for the Council of Chief Executive Officers and Executive Committee, managed the day-to-day operations and administration of the conference office, assisted the Commissioner by executing initiatives and special projects, evaluated functions, practices and the efficiency of facilities, and evaluated staff performance while providing leadership and guidance for personnel.

Since becoming the Senior Woman Administrator in June 2016, Stills has continued to work in conjunction with the senior leadership team within the MEAC regarding women's issues and other issues that affect the membership. She coordinates the Senior Woman Administrators' Women in Athletics Professional Development Workshop, coordinates the selection of the MEAC Woman of the Year and acts as the liaison to member institutions' senior woman administrators.

Before arriving at the MEAC, Stills served as Hampton University's Coordinator of Athletic Academic Support for four years, three of those years she was appointed Senior Woman Administrator. While at Hampton, she created the university's first Athletic Academic Support Program and implemented the CHAMPS/LifeSkills Program. She provided academic advising, counseling, and assistance to student-athletes in areas of course selection, registration procedures, degree requirements, career planning, university resources and other related topics associated with academic performance for all sports programs.

While serving as Senior Woman Administrator, Stills served as the highest-ranking female on the senior leadership team regarding the administration of the athletics department. She coordinated student-athlete and corporate partner banquets and events, oversaw the supervision of the cheerleading program, and assisted in coordinating event management during home football and basketball games with gameday operations, marketing, and will-call.

A 1993 graduate of Old Dominion University, Stills earned her bachelor's degree in Human Services Counseling. While a student, she earned the Virginia Campus Outreach Opportunity League (VA COOL) Catalyst Award for creating a week-long community outreach program for the university. In addition, she served on the university's President's Advisory Committee on Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action and Diversity. In 1996, she received a Master of Arts in Counseling (College Student Work Personnel) from Hampton University. She would later go on to graduate from the Sports Management Institute in 2002 and the NACWAA/HERS Institute for Administrative Advancement in 2008.

Stills holds current memberships in the National Association for Athletics Compliance (NAAC), National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics (N4A), Minority Opportunities Athletic Association (MOAA), Women Leaders for College Sports (WLS), National Association of Esports Coaches and Directors (NAECAD), and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated. She also serves as a substitute for the MEAC representative to the NCAA Division I Council.

Stills is a former member of the NCAA Legislative Council (2008-11), Coastal Collegiate Swimming Association – Policy Committee (2008-20), MEAC Senior Woman Administrators Association Chair (2002), and Touraine Condominium Association Board Member (1997-2020).

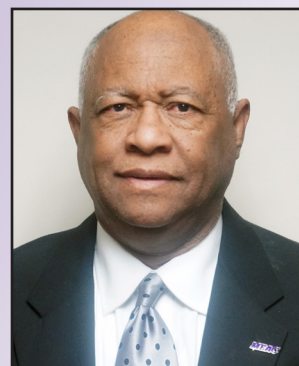

2022 MEAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year

Norfolk State running back J.J. Davis and South Carolina State defensive end Jeblonski Green have been named Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Offensive and Defensive Preseason Players of the Year, presented by Towne-Bank.

Additionally, South Carolina State is the preseason favorite to win the MEAC this season, picking up eight out of a possible 12 first-place votes.

All awards and the predicted order of finish were voted on by the MEAC's head football coaches and sports information directors.

Davis was the MEAC Rookie of the Year this past season after leading the Spartans and the conference in rushing, 80.5 yards per contest on the ground. He totaled 887 yards on 123 carries, averaging 7.2 yards per rush, and he tied for the MEAC lead with 10 touchdowns on the ground.

Davis was also seventh in the MEAC in total offense.

Green led the MEAC in tackles for loss in 2021 with 17.5 for a total of 97 yards. He averaged 1.94 tackles for loss per game, and Green was also top-10 in the conference in sacks with 2.5 per game. Green was part of a Bulldogs defense that led the MEAC in rushing defense (121.8 yards per game) and ranked second in total defense.

Joining Davis on the Preseason First Team offense are North Carolina Central quarterback Daviud Richard, South Carolina State running back Kendrell Flowers, South Carolina State wide receiver Shaquan Davis, Howard wide receiver Antoine Murray, South Carolina State tight end Yancey Washington, Norfolk State center Colby Byrd, Howard offensive linemen Darius Fox and Anim Dunkwah, North Carolina Central offensive lineman Corey Bullock and South Carolina State offensive

## HEAD COACH ROD MILSTEAD



One of the most decorated players in the history of Delaware State football, Milstead is in his fifth year as head coach of the Hornets. He was appointed to the position on Jan. 30, 2018.

Delaware State was 5-6 overall in 2021, its most wins since 2013, and 2-3 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC).

The '21 Hornets also featured 17 All-MEAC players, including five first team honorees. Three players earned Historically Black College and University (HBCU)

All-America recognition.

Delaware State was tops in the MEAC in total defense at 314.6 yards allowed per game, and in pass defense at 188.8 ypg during the 2021 season. The Hornets were tied for the MEAC lead with 14 interceptions last season.

The 2021 season was also highlighted by a 33-27 overtime victory at Wagner, the Hornets' first non-conference road win since 2011; and a thrilling come-from-behind triumph against Norfolk State after trailing by 26 points in the second half.

The abbreviated 2020 season, which was played in the spring of 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic, featured a 17-10 victory over Howard to snap the Hornets' seven skid in season openers.

In March 2021, Milstead he was inducted into the MEAC Hall of Fame.

In his second season as head coach, Milstead led the Hornets to a 16-13 victory over (then) MEAC co-leader Bethune-Cookman, snapping a six-game losing streak to the Wildcats.

Also in 2019, Delaware State was fifth in the MEAC in rushing at 140.8 yards per game, while rushing for 14 touchdowns, the most by the Hornets since tallying 17 in 2008.

During his tenure as a Hornets' player, Milstead was a three-time All-MEAC First Team selection (1989, '90, '91); and a 1991 Associated Press, Walter Camp and Sheridan Black College All-America First Team pick.

He helped lead Delaware State to the 1989 MEAC championship and a share of the conference title in 1988 and '91. In addition, he helped pave the way to the Hornets' No. 1 ranking among all Division I-AA (now FCS) teams in rushing at 300.2 yards per game in 1990.

Delaware State named Milstead as its Male Athlete of the Year and Senior Male Athlete of the Year in 1992. He was inducted into the Hornets' Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003.

Milstead earned a bachelor's in Sociology/Criminal Justice from Delaware State in 1992.

Following his collegiate career, Milstead was selected by the Dallas Cowboys in the fifth round of the 1992 National Football League (NFL) Draft. After several weeks in the Cowboys' training camp, he was traded to the Cleveland Browns, where he played two seasons.

In 1994, Milstead signed with the San Francisco 49ers, where he joined former Hornet star wide receiver John Taylor.

Milstead was a member of San Francisco's 1995 Super Bowl champion squad. The Niners captured the title with a 49-26 win over the San Diego Chargers in Super Bowl XXIX in Miami, Fla.

### HEAD COACH LARRY SCOTT



With 15 years of collegiate coaching experience that includes 10 postseason bowl/playoff game appearances and six wins, Larry Scott joined Howard University as the head football coach, the university announced on February 6, 2020.

The Sebring, Fla., native has spent a majority of his coaching career in the state of Florida, where he attended (1997-99) and coached (2006-12) at USF as well as Miami (2013-15) and most recently Florida (2018-2020). Prior to joining the Florida

coaching staff Scott was a member of Ethan Wolfe staff at the University of Tennessee (2016-17).

A graduate from the University of South Florida in 2000, Scott played offensive lineman for the Bulls. After four seasons of high school coaching experience, Scott joined the USF staff in 2005 as Director of High School Relations. During his time at USF, Scott coached the offensive line, tight ends and running backs as well as serving as a lead recruiter.

Scott helped lead the Bulls to their best recruiting class in program history in 2008 only to surpass that class with the nation's No. 21 ranked class in 2009.

During his time in Coral Gables, Scott served as the Hurricanes' tight ends coach for two-plus seasons (2013-15) prior to being named their interim head coach for the final six games of 2015. As Miami's interim coach, Scott led the Hurricanes to a 4-2 mark and a berth in the Sun Bowl.

Scott has spent the two seasons with Dan Mullen as the assistant coach and tight ends coach at Florida, where he guided his position group to multiple personal bests and better numbers than in years prior.

Scott helped devise game plans each week that allowed 11 different Gators to record a touchdown reception in 2018 and 10 in 2019.

Blocking was a huge emphasis for Scott and his student-athletes, that attention to detail throughout the offseason and practice paid off as Florida's running backs totaled 2,771 yards rushing on 526 attempts in 2018. He concluded the 2019 season with 1,956 yards rushing on 398 attempts.

Scott helped Ethan Wolf cap his career in 2017 as one of the greatest tight ends in Rocky Top history. Wolf ranked No. 2 among UT tight ends in career receptions (91) and No. 3 in receiving yards (998) and led the Vols with 47 starts.

Tennessee's offense in 2017 saw running back John Kelly (778 rush yards,

37 catches) join Penn State's Saquon Barkley (1,271 rush yards, 54 catches) as the only two players in the Power 5 to lead their teams in rushing and receptions.

In 2016, Tennessee averaged 24.9 yards on 42 kickoff returns and 11.1 yards on 33 punt returns while punter Trevor Daniel averaged 44.6 yards per punt and kicker Aaron Medley scored 94 points (11 field goals, 61 extra points) while booting a personal-best 45 touchbacks on kickoffs.

UT's tight ends combined for 45 receptions, 499 yards and two touchdowns in 2016 and helped pave the way for 2,668 rushing yards (5.2-yard average). Scott tutored fifth-year senior Jason Croom, who made the transition from wide receiver to tight end in 2016, to 21 catches for 242 yards on the season.

Scott spent two-plus seasons as the Hurricanes' tight ends coach prior to being named their interim head coach for the final six games of 2015. As Miami's interim head coach, Scott led the Hurricanes to a 4-2 mark and a berth in the Sun Bowl.

In 2014, Scott oversaw a tight end unit that combined for 52 receptions and 833 yards receiving. He also mentored Clive Walford, who had a breakout 2014 campaign where he led the team in receptions with 44. Under Scott's watchful eye, Walford earned third team All-America and second team All-ACC honors.

Following the year, Walford was selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders.

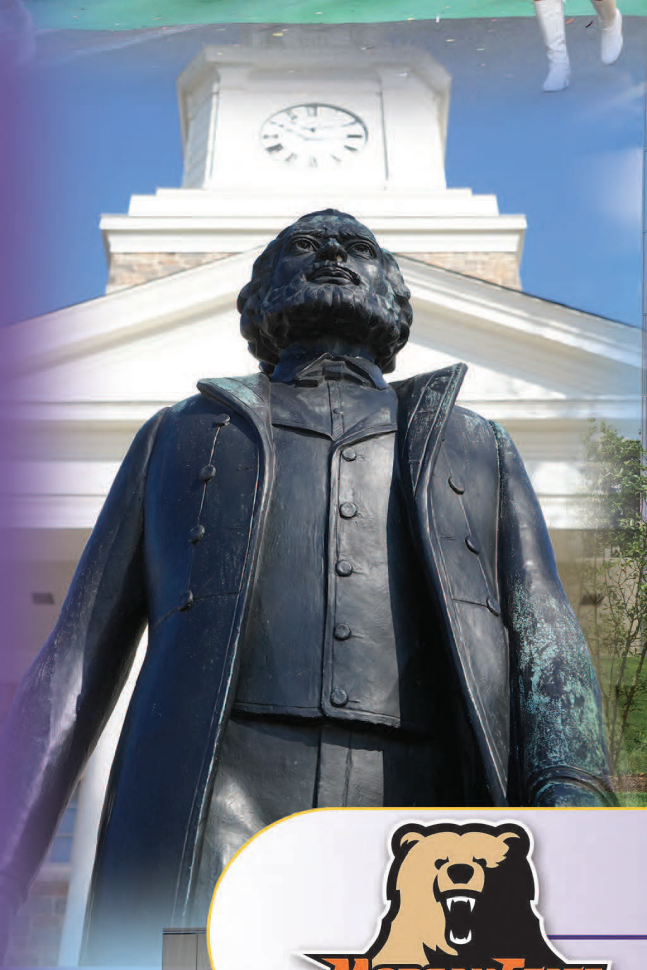

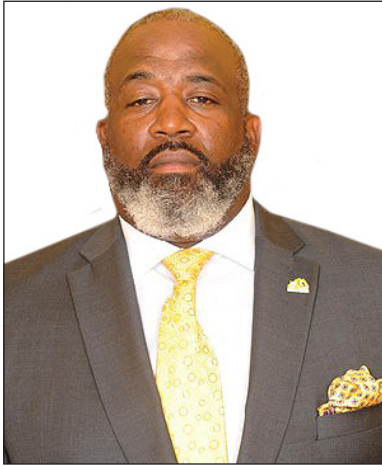

### HEAD COACH DAMON WILSON



Coach of the Year honors.

Wilson, who was an all-conference tight end for the Bulldogs (1998), did his first tour of duty as an assistant coach from 1999-2003. As the Assistant Head Coach (Running Backs and Special Teams Coordinator) during those years, BSU's special teams and running game consistently ranked at the top of the conference. During Wilson's first run at Bowie State, the Bulldogs combined an overall record of 26-24 and they were able to bring home a CIAA Eastern Division Championship in 2002.

As Wilson began to flourish in his coaching career, he would trade the comforts of home and the CIAA for the life in the south, deep in the heart of Texas. He spent three seasons on the sidelines at Texas Southern University and then Wilson took a position at Prairie View A&M University. The Panthers of Prairie View finished the 2008 season with a 9-1 record and ranked 23rd nationally in Division I-AA football polls.

As the running backs coach, Wilson helped lead the Panthers' offense to their most successful season ever. Under Wilson's guidance, they led the SWAC in rushing and broke the university's all-time record. Wilson would leave his name in the history books, having been the first coach in Prairie View history to coach a 1,000 yard running back.

Wilson began his head coaching era at Bowie State in 2009. In 2009 Wilson's Bulldogs broke the school record for Most Offensive Yards in a game, had eight players to receive All Conference honors, and four players selected to All-Rookie Team. At one point in 2009 Bowie State was ranked as high as 8th in the region, and closed the season with the #1 ranked defense in the country. While Wilson garnered Coach of the Week awards on two separate occasions during 2009, Isaac Redman was signed by the Pittsburgh Steelers of the NFL. The 2009 Eastern Division Champs also boasted an impressive 25 players with grade point averages above a 3.0.

The 2010 season would prove to be another successful campaign for Wilson and the Bulldogs. Wilson continues to put his name in the history books as his high-powered offense broke and reset many records. The

Bulldogs broke the school record for Most First Downs in a Game, Most Pass Completions in a Game and Season, Most Yards Passing, Most Touchdowns Thrown, Most Kickoff Returns in a Season and Career, Most Pass Breakups and Most Blocked Kicks. They posted a 6-1 CIAA record; the best Bowie State conference record since 1989, and had two players receive conference awards.

Wilson has had five players represent Bowie State University in Russell Athletics HBCU All-Star game and two players selected to participate in Division I All Star Game, two players in the NFL and one in the IFL (Indoor Football League), and graduated 30 players in three years. Wilson was also one of the twenty coaches selected from across the country to participate in the NCAA Expert Coaches Academy. The one-time Coach of the Week used his powers of persuasion and strong business acumen to assist the University and supporters in the installation of a million dollar synthetic turf field at the Bulldogs Stadium.

In 2011 the Bulldogs found it hard to replace the senior class from the 2010 season. Although the Bulldogs started off 3-0 they then experienced some losses in close games that they were unable to bounce back from.

While it was a challenging season on the gridiron, it did not prevent the Bulldogs from experiencing success in the classroom and in the community. There were 15 seniors to graduate from the 2011 team and seven players that received All Conference recognition.

Wilson is married to Allison (Dunn) and they have one son, Dylan. Wilson is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. In his spare time he enjoys spending time with his family, working with children, fishing, and attending sporting events.

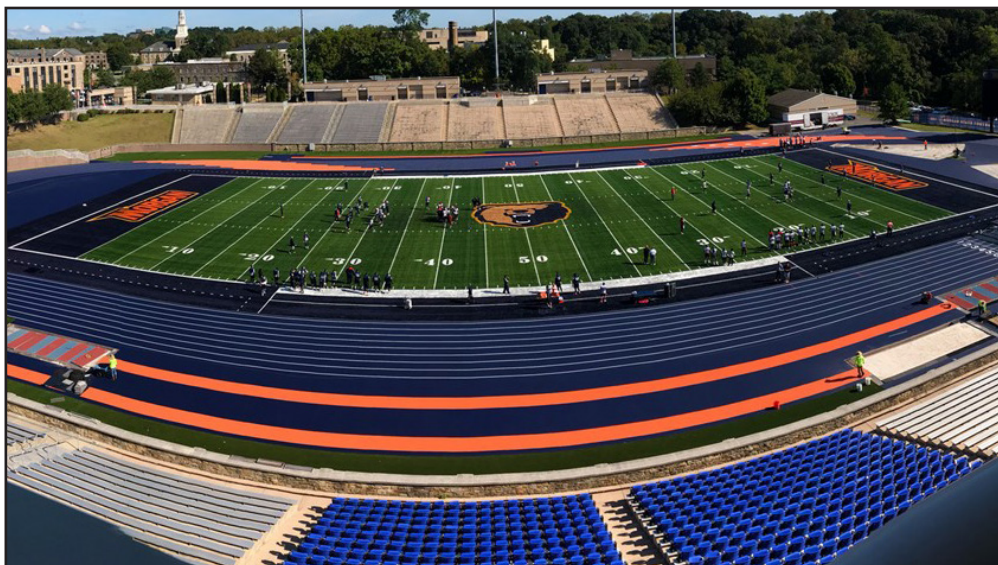

### HEAD COACH DAWSON ODUMS



Dawson Odums, a championship coach with a track record of developing student-athletes both on and off the field during his collegiate coaching career, is in his first year as the head football coach at Norfolk State University. He was named the 18th head coach in Spartan history on April 21, 2021.

A native of Shelby, N.C., Odums has more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience. Most recently, Odums enjoyed a stellar 10-year run in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) at

Southern University in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Odums directed Southern to a winning record in each of his eight full seasons at the helm of the program, including a 5-1 mark in the abbreviated 2021 spring season. In his last five seasons, the Jaguars posted a 29-6 SWAC record. His overall record with the Jaguars was 63-35.

After joining the Jaguars as defensive line coach in 2011, Odums was elevated to interim head coach two games into the 2012 season before earning the permanent head coach position following the year. On the field, Odums led Southern to a 53-17 SWAC mark over the last nine seasons. His ledger includes one SWAC championship (2013), one SWAC Coach of the Year honor (2013) and four SWAC West Division titles (2013, '14, '18, '19).

Odums' teams at Southern excelled in all three phases of the game. In the 2021 spring season, Southern ranked first nationally in blocked punts, second in third-down conversions, fifth in sacks and eighth in scoring offense. Southern finished the year ranked 20th in the FCS Top 25 Coaches Poll. Defensive end Jordan Lewis brought distinction to the Jaguars by winning the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the top defensive player in the Division I FCS. Lewis, who led the country in sacks and tackles for loss, also won SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Southern posted top-20 total offenses in 2015 and 2016 and a No. 13 mark in rushing offense en route to a SWAC West title in 2019. Odums' squads ranked in the top 10 in the FCS in punt return average four times, including leading the country in 2017, and also ranked top-10 in kickoff return average twice.

The 2013 season was a special one for Odums. His first full year as head coach at Southern culminated in a double-overtime SWAC championship game victory over Jackson State. The win made Odums just the second coach in Southern history to win a SWAC divisional title, outright SWAC championship and SWAC Coach of the Year honors in his first year as head coach.

The Jaguars went 9-4 that year, one of four seasons in which they won

at least eight games on Odums' watch. They also won nine games and captured the divisional title the following year, 2014.

Six players coached by Odums have signed with teams in the NFL or CFL. That list includes SWAC all-time leading rusher Lenard Tillery and Southern's all-time leader in receiving yards and return touchdowns, Willie Quinn. Former Jaguars defensive back Danny Johnson is on the roster of the Washington Football Team.

Jaguar student-athletes have also performed well in the classroom. Fifty-seven Southern players earned Dean's List honors during the fall 2020 semester. Under Odums' guidance, Southern's APR score has steadily risen, reaching a multi-year rate of 952 in the last NCAA report of his tenure there.

Odums' other coaching stints include a pair of stops in the MEAC. He spent three seasons at North Carolina A&T (2008-10), serving first as defensive line coach and special teams coordinator and then as defensive coordinator. The Aggies' special teams units thrived under his leadership, returning four kicks for touchdowns and blocking three kicks in 2010. That came on the heels of a 2009 season in which the Aggies blocked five kicks.

In 2010, Brandon Jackson became the first Aggie in five seasons to record more than 100 tackles in a season, finishing with 106. D'Vonte Graham led the MEAC in interceptions with seven. The year prior saw Jarrell Herring earn first-team All-MEAC honors at defensive end.

Odums' first stint in the MEAC came as defensive line coach at Bethune-Cookman from 2005-07. Over Odums' three-year span there, the Wildcats run defense was among the stingiest in the MEAC. In 2007, the Wildcats defense ranked third in the conference in rush defense and third in total defense. Odums also worked with the Wildcats special teams units and scouted opposing teams' special teams personnel.

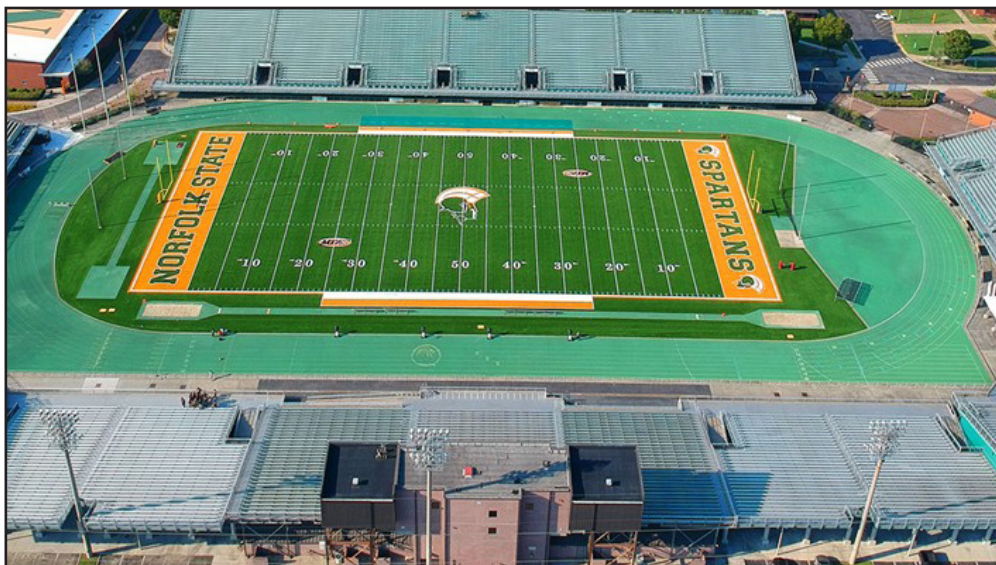

## HEAD COACH TREI OLIVER



With more than 20 years of college coaching experience that includes five conference championships and three black college football national titles, Trei Oliver returned to his alma mater as North Carolina Central's 24th head football coach.

A native of Yorktown, Va., Oliver earned all-conference and all-region honors as a defensive back and punter during his four-year playing career at NCCU from 1994-97. The 1998 graduate later returned to NCCU as an assistant coach from 2003-06,

helping the Eagles to back-to-back Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) championships in 2005 and 2006.

Oliver returned to NCCU as head coach after spending the previous three seasons (2016-18) as the defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Southern University. The Jaguars are coming off a Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) West division championship and a trip to the SWAC championship game.

In the prior 15 seasons (2004-18) as a coach at four different universities, Oliver has been a part of only one season with fewer than seven wins. During that time, he has celebrated 124 victories for an average of more than eight triumphs per year and a winning percentage of .725.

Prior to Southern University, Oliver served as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at North Carolina A&T State University from 2011-15, when the Aggies shared consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) championships in 2014 and 2015, and were declared the black college football national champions in his final campaign in Greensboro as winners of the Celebration Bowl with a 10-2 overall record.

In four seasons at Grambling State University from 2007-10 as the outside linebackers coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coordinator, the Tigers earned two SWAC West division crowns, and won the SWAC championship game and a black college football national title in 2008 with an 11-2 record.

Oliver's first coaching stint at NCCU was as a defensive backs and wide receivers coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coordinator from 2003-06. The Eagles captured back-to-back CIAA championships with consecutive trips to the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2005 and 2006, and were crowned as the black college football national champions following an 11-1 season in 2006.

Oliver started his college coaching career at Delaware State as defensive

backs coach and assistant special teams coordinator from 1999-2002. As a student-athlete at NCCU, Oliver twice led the CIAA in punting, including a 41.7-yard average in 1997, which ranks fifth on the Eagles' all-time single season list. As a junior in 1996, he was part of a defensive backfield that led the nation (NCAA Division II) in pass defense efficiency. As a senior, he landed two positions on the All-South Region Team, earning First Team honors as a defensive back and a Second Team selection as a punter.

Among NCCU's career leaders, Oliver ranks 13th with 234 tackles (126 solo), 12th with 31 passes defended (24 pass break-ups and seven interceptions), and fourth with a 39.3-yard punting average. He garnered All-CIAA first or second team honors in each of his four seasons.

Oliver graduated from NCCU in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned a master's degree in criminal justice from Grambling State University in 2010.

### HEAD COACH OLIVER “BUDDY” POUGH



Oliver “Buddy” Pough, the all-time winningest coach in school history, is entering in his 21st season as head football coach at South Carolina State, his alma mater. During a 20-year tenure at the school where he earned a bachelor’s and a master’s, as well as All-MEAC honors as an offensive lineman, Pough has compiled an overall record of 140-79 and a 107-38 MEAC worksheet.

His teams captured three MEAC titles (2008, 2009, 2022) outright, shared four others (2004, 2010, 2013, 2014 and 2019),

and made four trips to the prestigious FCS playoffs (2008, 2009, 2010 and 2013). The 2022 Bulldogs won their first-ever Cricket Celebration Bowl, winning 31-10 over heavily favored Jackson State.

S.C. State had its best turnaround in 2013 with a 9-4 overall, 7-1 MEAC record after suffering their first losing season under Pough at 5-6 overall and 4-4 in the MEAC in 2012. In 2011, the Bulldogs compiled a 7-4 overall worksheet and were 6-2 in the MEAC. During the 2010 season, Pough’s team finished 9-3 and was 7-1 in the MEAC to tie for the championship after winning the title outright in both 2009 and 2008. His squad also earned its third straight berth to the FCS playoffs and finished the 2010 campaign ranked high in all of the HBCU and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) polls.

Pough’s 2009 squad finished 10-3 overall, captured its second consecutive MEAC crown with an unblemished 8-0 record and made back-to-back appearances in the FCS playoffs. The Orangeburg native reaped Coach of the Year honors in the MEAC -- his second in as many seasons -- and also earned the accolade from The (Columbia, SC) State newspaper, the Washington Pigskin Club, the 100 Percent Wrong Club of Atlanta and the Orangeburg Touchdown Club.

His 2008 squad was just as impressive, finishing 10-2 and winning the MEAC title with an 8-0 mark, the team’s first outright title in 14 seasons, and returning to the FCS playoffs for the first time since the 1982 campaign.

Pough became the 14th head football coach at South Carolina State, while posting a 7-5 overall record and a 4-4 mark in the MEAC in his inaugural season in 2002. In 2003, he guided S.C. State to an 8-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in MEAC play, losing only to Hampton and Bethune-Cookman. The 2004 season can be considered another one of the team’s best under Pough, as the Bulldogs produced the first-of-two consecutive 9-2 seasons. SC State was 6-2 in MEAC play that season, tying the Hampton Pirates for the 2004 championship.

In 2005, Pough’s team duplicated the 9-2 record of the previous year and improved to 7-1 in the MEAC, with the lone league loss coming at the hands of eventual champion and nationally-ranked Hampton.

Followed by a couple of 7-4 records in 2006 and 2007, the Bulldogs had 10 win seasons in each of the next two campaigns -- 2008 (10-3) and 2009 (10-2).

Pough has coached a number of players who have gone on to play in the National Football League, including nine who are currently on NFL rosters -- Joe Thomas (Houston), Javon Hargrave (Philadelphia), Temarrick Hemingway (Washington), Alex Taylor (Cleveland), Antonio Hamilton (Tampa Bay), Alex Brown (Detroit) and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year Darius Leonard (Indianapolis).

## NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION

Norfolk State quarterback Juwan Carter and South Carolina State defensive back Decobie Durant were officially named the MEAC Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year, respectively, as part of the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Football Hall of Fame's induction ceremony on Dec. 7, 2021 in Las Vegas, Nev.

Carter put a period on his stellar career at Norfolk State by leading all MEAC quarterbacks in passing yards (2,511), touchdown passes (21), completion percentage (63.8) and pass efficiency (150.4). He also ran for 390 yards and six touchdowns.

A four-time MEAC Offensive Player of the Week in 2021, Carter leaves Norfolk State as the school's all-time leader with 9,271 career passing yards, 10,249 total yards, 749 completions and 1,270 attempts. For much of the 2021 FCS season, he ranked among the NCAA's Top 25 in passing efficiency, passing touchdowns, points responsible for, yards per completion and yards per game.

Durant, considered one of the MEAC's top pro prospects and taken in the fourth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the defending Super Bowl champion Los Angeles Rams, earned MEAC Defensive Player of the Year following a final season that saw him accumulate 37 tackles, including 29 solo stops. He led the league in passes defended with 14 and tied for second in interceptions with three. Two of his interceptions came against nationally-ranked Clemson on Sept. 11.

Named a Preseason All-American and Preseason MEAC Defensive Player of the Year in 2021, Durant was a key part of the Bulldogs winning the MEAC title and the Cricket Celebration Bowl, 31-10 over heavily-favored Jackson State. He also competed in the East/West Shrine Bowl on Feb. 3, 2022 in Las Vegas.

The MEAC has partnered with the NFF each year since 2016 to announce the conference's Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year during College Football Hall of Fame festivities. The MEAC is the only conference, FBS or FCS, to have such a partnership. Presented annually since 1971, the MEAC Players of the Year awards are voted on by the MEAC head football coaches and sports information directors.

Typically held in New York City, 2021's festivities were held at the ARIA Resort and Casino in Las Vegas.

After North Carolina Central opened the 2021 season with a win over Alcorn State in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge Kickoff, South Carolina State reclaimed its spot as the conference's top program, going undefeated in MEAC play to claim its 18th title -- 11th outright -- to earn a berth to its first-ever Cricket Celebration Bowl.

The Bulldogs then defeated heavily favored Jackson State 31-10 in Mercedes-Benz Stadium to claim their first Cricket Celebration Bowl title and earn the title of Black College Football National Champions. The MEAC is now 5-1 all-time against the SWAC in the history of the bowl game.

Norfolk State quarterback Juwan Carter was named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, while South Carolina State defensive back Decobie Durant earned Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Both players were named and recognized in Las Vegas as part of the MEAC's ongoing partnership with the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

Norfolk State running back J.J. Davis and the Spartans' Justin Redd were named Rookie of the Year and Offensive Lineman of the Year, respectively, while the Bulldogs' Buddy Pough earned Coach of the Year honors for the fourth time.

### MEAC HOSTS THE PLAYOFFS

Bethune-Cookman (10-2) served as host for the second time in MEAC history when the Wildcats welcomed the New Hampshire Wildcats to Daytona Beach, Fla. in 2010. The Wildcats had previously hosted Florida Atlantic in the 2003 playoffs. Hampton also served as a host in 2006 to the New Hampshire Wildcats while Florida A&M hosted Troy State in the first round in 1998. The 2010 season marked the fourth time in MEAC history that two teams competed in the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs. The MEAC has enjoyed five at-large bids to the NCAA FCS (formerly I-AA). Playoffs including Bethune-Cookman (Hampton-automatic berth) in 1993 and Florida A&M in 1997, 1998, and 1999 (Hampton-automatic berth in 97 and 98 (North Carolina A&T-automatic berth in 1999) and South Carolina State in 2010 (Bethune-Cookman-automatic berth). The inaugural I-AA Championship was won by Florida A&M in 1978, a year before the Rattlers joined the MEAC. Prior to 1996, the MEAC only qualified for the NCAA I-AA playoffs in 1978, 1981, 1982, 1986 and 1992.

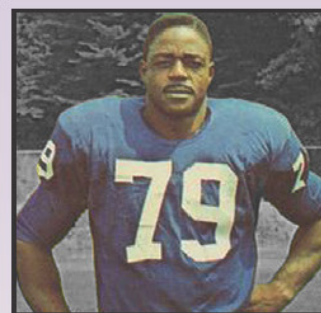

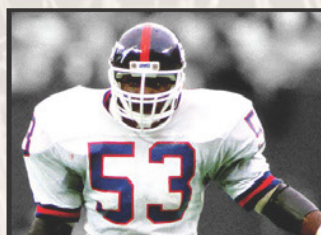
