MEAC Countdown to Kickoff, presented by Coca-Cola, will be in its third season in 2023, marking the return of the first pregame football show originating from an NCAA FCS conference. The MEAC's flagship production will broadcast from the MEAC Digital Network studios in Norfolk, Va.; air dates and show format are to be determined and will be announced during the coming football season.

MEAC Players of the Week

The MEAC will name Players of the Week each Monday throughout the regular season in the following categories: Offense, Defense, Rookie, Offensive Lineman and Special Teams. Nominees are submitted to the conference office through member institutions' sports information offices, and the winners will be announced via email and the conference website each Monday.

Postseason Awards

Following the conclusion of regular-season play, the MEAC will hold a vote for all-conference teams, to be conducted by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Each body will vote on a First, Second and Third Team all-conference squad, as well as Offensive Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year and Offensive Lineman of the Year. The head coaches will also vote on a Coach of the Year. The Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year will be named during the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame's annual induction ceremony in December in Las Vegas, Nev.

MEAC Football Tiebreaker System

The MEAC's tiebreaker system is used to determine the conference's outright champion, as well as which team will receive the conference's berth to the Cricket Celebration Bowl. For a two-team or multiple-team tie, if all teams played each other, head-to-head competition will be used to determine the champion and bowl game representative. For multiple ties, the head-to-head record against all tied teams will be used.

1. If a tie still exists, then the following shall be used:

- A. Five (5) points will be awarded for a win against a non-conference Div. I FBS team;
- B. Four (4) points will be awarded for a win against a non-conference Div. I FCS team;

The team with the highest point total shall be named outright champion and receive the MEAC's berth to the Cricket Celebration Bowl.

2. If the tie still exists, then the following shall be used:

- A. The team with the highest Sagarin ranking;
- B. A coin toss by the Commissioner.

The MEAC will hold its annual Football Media Day on Friday, July 21 at the Hilton Norfolk The Main hotel in downtown Norfolk, Va. The MEAC's six head football coaches and two student-athletes from each institution will be on-hand for in-person media interviews and a live show to be streamed on ESPN+. MEAC HISTORY



The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) enters its 53rd year of intercollegiate competition with the 2023-24 academic school year. Located in Norfolk, Va., the MEAC is made up of eight outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline: Coppin State University, Delaware State University, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, Norfolk State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State University.

The MEAC sponsors 14 Division I (FCS) sports: women's bowling, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field, softball and volleyball. The MEAC receives automatic NCAA qualification bids in seven sports – men's and women's basketball, women's bowling, men's and women's tennis, softball and volleyball.

The MEAC's football champion is pitted against the champion of the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in the Cricket Celebration Bowl, which debuted in December 2015.

MEAC student-athletes excel on and off the field and several have been recognized on ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America and All-District teams. The conference sponsors All-Academic teams in each of its sports and awards two post-graduate scholarships of \$5,000 each annually to one male and one female student-athlete who have excelled academically and athletically and are in their final season of intercollegiate athletics eligibility and competition under MEAC and NCAA regulations.

HISTORY

In 1969, a bold ad hoc group of innovators long associated with intercollegiate athletics met in Durham, N.C. to discuss the feasibility of organizing a new conference. From these discussions, they formed a steering and planning committee to fully investigate the idea, presented a detailed report with recommendations to interested collegiate institutions, and constructed a workshop to outline proposals.

After selecting a proposal and adopting a program, seven institutions (Delaware State College, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, North Carolina A&T State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State College) agreed to become the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Their major objective was to establish, organize and supervise an intercollegiate athletic program among a compact group of educational institutions of high academic standards with a sound philosophy of co-curricular activities. The conference agreed to seek Division I status for its sports.

The conference was confirmed in 1970, kicking off its first season of competition in football in 1971.

In 1978, the MEAC reached a milestone when it selected Kenneth A. Free to be its first full-time commissioner. Free served the conference for 18 years before stepping down in May 1996. In July 1996, Charles S. Harris was named commissioner, and he served in that capacity until April 2002. On Sept. 1, 2002, Dr. Dennis E. Thomas was named commissioner and served in the position until Dec. 31, 2021.

On Jan. 1, 2022, Sonja Stills became the MEAC's first female commissioner and the first female commissioner of a Div. I HBCU conference.

The conference's first expansion occurred in October 1979, when Bethune-Cookman College and Florida A&M University were voted into the MEAC as new members. Original members Morgan State, North Carolina Central and Maryland Eastern Shore withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1979-80 fiscal year; Maryland Eastern Shore was readmitted in 1981 and Morgan State returned in 1984. Florida A&M opted to resign in 1984, but rejoined the conference in 1986. Coppin State College was granted admittance in 1985, becoming the ninth member institution.

The MEAC expanded again in the 1990s with the inclusion of Hampton University (1995) and Norfolk State University (1997). The conference grew once again in 2007, adding Winston-Salem State University. Winston-Salem State, a MEAC provisional member, did not meet the qualifications for Division I and withdrew from the conference following the 2009-10 academic and athletic season.

On July 1, 2010, the MEAC made its most recent expansion with the admittance of North Carolina Central and Savannah State University. On Sept. 10, 2014, the MEAC admitted Augusta University (formerly Georgia Regents University) as an associate member for men's golf. In June 2018, the MEAC added Alabama Birmingham (UAB) and Monmouth as associate members for women's bowling, effective for the 2018-19 academic year.

As of July 1, 2018, Hampton was no longer a member of the MEAC. Savannah State followed suit one year later, opting to return to the Div. II ranks.

As of July 1, 2021, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and North Carolina A&T State were no longer members of the MEAC, though North Carolina A&T State does hold associate membership with the conference for the sport of women's bowling.

Augusta University, an associate member for men's golf, also left the conference on July 1, 2021.

On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the NCAA; prior to that year, the conference had operated on the Division II level. The month after achieving Div. I status, the MEAC received automatic qualification to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship.

Currently, the conference has automatic qualifying bids for NCAA postseason play in men's basketball (since 1981), women's basketball (since 1982), softball (since 1995), men's and women's tennis (since 1998), volleyball (since 1994) and women's bowling (since 2018).

The MEAC declares champions in six men's sports – basketball, cross country, football, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field and tennis – and eight women's sports – basketball, bowling, cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, softball, tennis and volleyball.

The MEAC initiated cross country in 1980, and North Carolina A&T State earned the inaugural men's crown. The first women's cross country championship took place a year later, with Howard winning the first of its seven titles. Indoor track & field was also added in 1981, with South Carolina State winning the men's title and Howard taking the women's crown.

Tennis returned as MEAC-sponsored sports in 1981 after a five-year hiatus. South Carolina State won all seven of the conference's golf championships from 1972-83 before the sport was discontinued following the 1983 championship.

In wrestling, Morgan State won 13 of 24 conference championships before the sport was discontinued in 1995.

Baseball, which began in 1972, was discontinued following the 1977 season. It was brought back as a MEAC-governed sport, along with the addition of women's volleyball, in 1983. Women's softball became a MEAC-sanctioned sport in 1992.

Bowling was officially sanctioned as a MEAC sport in 1999. The MEAC was the first conference to secure NCAA sanctioning for women's bowling by adopting the club sport prior to the 1996-97 school year.

Men's golf returned as a MEAC-sponsored sport in 2014, with six teams participating in the conference championship. Bethune-Cookman was crowned the 2014 champion; the Wildcats also won the 2014 PGA Minority Collegiate Championship. Associate member Augusta University earned its first MEAC golf title in 2015, the institution's first year of conference competition, before repeating in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Howard claimed the 2022 MEAC championship in just its second year sponsoring the sport following a donation by the NBA's Steph Curry to fund both the men's golf programs for a six-year period beginning in 2020-21. The Bison also claimed the 2022 PGA Works title, while Gregory Odom, Jr. was the 2022 individual champion at the MEAC and PGA Works Championships.

In July 2022, four MEAC baseball teams (Coppin State, Delaware State, Maryland Eastern Shore and Norfolk State) and three men's golf programs (Howard, Maryland Eastern Shore and North Carolina Central) temporarily joined the Northeast Conference as associate members. The schools will retain primary membership in the MEAC and begin competing in the NEC in the 2022-23 academic year.

SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS

The MEAC has enjoyed tremendous athletic success over the years. In 2008, Maryland Eastern Shore defeated Arkansas State 4-2 to win the NCAA Women's Bowling National Championship, a first for both the conference and the institution. With the victory, Lady Hawks head coach Sharon Brummell became the first female head coach to win an NCAA bowling title.

The Lady Hawks repeated the feat in 2011, winning the school's second NCAA bowling title; during that same season, Maryland Eastern Shore won the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Intercollegiate Team Championship (ITC), becoming the first team to win two national championships in the same year.

In 2012, Maryland Eastern Shore captured its third NCAA bowling championship in five years with a 4-2 win over Fairleigh Dickinson. The Lady Hawks became the second team in NCAA bowling history to win three championships and the first to make four appearances in the championship finale.

In men's basketball, Maryland Eastern Shore became the first historically black college/university (HBCU) to participate in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT), doing so in 1974. The Hawks defeated Manhattan 84-81 in the first round before falling to Jacksonville in the second round. Before the Jacksonville loss, the Hawks had the nation's best record at 27-1. That same year, Morgan State won the NCAA College Division II National Championship and junior center Marvin "The Human Eraser" Webster was named the Division II Player of the Year.

Howard became the first MEAC school to play in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championships in 1981, taking on Wyoming in the first round.

Coppin State, Hampton and Norfolk State have each made history in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament with first-round victories. Coppin State, the No. 15 seed, defeated No. 2 seed South Carolina in 1997, before Hampton repeated the No. 15-over-No. 2 upset feat in 2001 against Iowa State. Both victories have been ranked among ESPN *SportsCenter's* top 10 greatest tournament upsets. In 2012, Norfolk State became the fifth team in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament history (and the third MEAC team) to upset a No. 2 seed; the Spartans upended Missouri in the round of 64 that year.

Of the eight instances in which a No. 15 seed has defeated a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the MEAC boasts three of them.

Norfolk State shined on the national postseason stage again in 2019; after the Spartans won the men's basketball regular-season title, they earned an automatic bid to the NIT – where, as a No. 8 seed, they upset top seed Alabama on the Crimson Tide's home floor, 80-79 in overtime. Norfolk State became the fourth MEAC school to win an NIT game (UMES 1974, Coppin State 1995, Delaware State 2006).

In women's basketball, South Carolina State won the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) Division II National Championship in 1979. In 1982, Howard became the first MEAC school to play in the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament. In 1983, South Carolina State won the MEAC's automatic NCAA bid and became the first conference team, male or female, to win an opening-round game in the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament.

In 2010, North Carolina A&T State defeated Wake Forest and Charlotte before falling to Miami in the third round of the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT). The Lady Aggies became the first MEAC team – and first HBCU – to win two consecutive basketball games in a national postseason tournament.

In football, the MEAC was instrumental in constructing the Celebration Bowl, the Freedom Bowl All-Star Classic, the Heritage Bowl and the Gold Bowl. Prior to Division I competition, the MEAC competed in the Gold Bowl, held in Richmond, Va., which matched the MEAC champion against the champion of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). South Carolina State represented the MEAC in 1976 and 1979, winning both outings over Winston-Salem State and Norfolk State, respectively.

The MEAC is 6-1 all-time against the SWAC in the Cricket Celebration Bowl.

In addition to the 1976 and 1979 crowns, South Carolina State won MEAC football titles in 1974-78, 1980-83, 1994, 2004, 2008, 2009 and 2021. The Bulldogs were also named co-champions along with Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M in 2010, before sharing the 2013 title with Bethune-Cookman, the 2014 title with four other teams and the 2019 title with North Carolina A&T State. During the 1981 and 1982 seasons, South Carolina State reached the second round of the NCAA Div. I-AA championships.

In 2015, the MEAC combined with the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, Ga. North Carolina A&T State defeated Alcorn State in the inaugural Celebration Bowl to determine the Black College National Champion in a game pitting the MEAC and SWAC champions. North Carolina Central represented the MEAC in the 2016 Celebration Bowl, taking on Grambling State.

North Carolina A&T State returned to the Celebration Bowl in 2017, defeating Grambling State 21-14 to complete the first undefeated season in MEAC history and claim the Aggies' second Black College National Championship in three years. North Carolina A&T State repeated in 2018, defeating Alcorn State 24-22. NCAT defeated Alcorn State again in 2019 for the Aggies' fourth Celebration Bowl win in the game's five years of existence.

In 2021, South Carolina State defeated heavily favored Jackson State 31-10 to give the Bulldogs their first Cricket Celebration Bowl title and North Carolina Central followed in 2022 with a 41-34 overtime win over the Tigers.

The MEAC a 6-1 record in the bowl game.

The MEAC also has a strong presence in the National Football League (NFL), both throughout the league's history and today. For the start of the 2022 season, there

were 12 former MEAC players on active NFL rosters – highlighted by South Carolina State's Darius Leonard.

Leonard, a two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, was taken in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts; that same season, he was named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year after leading the league in total tackles. He was also named First Team All-Pro that season, and in 2019, Leonard was named to the Pro Bowl.

In 2003, Florida A&M became the first MEAC school to win a volleyball match in the NCAA Championships with a first-round victory over Winthrop. In 2004, the Lady Rattlers became the first HBCU to rank in the Top 25 of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) national poll, coming in at No. 22.

In outdoor track & field, the North Carolina Central men won the first three MEAC titles. In addition, the quartet of Melvin Bassett, Robert Ouko, Julius Sang and Larry Black set the world record in the sprint medley relay with a time of 38.19 in the 1972 Olympics. In addition, the Eagles finished fourth in the 1974 NCAA Division I Men's Outdoor Track & Field Championship. Women began outdoor track & field competition in the MEAC in 1980 – and in 1982, South Carolina State won the AIAW Division II Outdoor Track & Field National Championship.

In 2021, North Carolina A&T State became the first HBCU to finish in the top three of the team standings at the NCAA Div. I Outdoor Track & Field Championships, finishing third in the men's team standings. The Aggies won two national titles at the meet, with Randolph Ross winning the 400 meters and the 4x400-meter relay team winning gold (to go along with the gold medal they won earlier that year in the NCAA indoor meet). On the women's side, Cambrea Sturgis gave the MEAC two more national titles, winning NCAA crowns in the 100 and 200 meters.

The MEAC has showcased over 35 athletes in the Olympics over the years, and 13 of them have earned medals during the Summer Games.

At No. 72, South Carolina State became the first MEAC women's tennis team to finish the season ranked in the 2005 Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Division I final poll. In 2012, South Carolina State's Maria Craciun became the first tennis player in school and MEAC history to receive a berth to the NCAA Individual Singles Championship.

In Augusta's seven seasons as an associate member for men's golf, the Jaguars won the conference championship in five of those years. In 2018, Augusta not only won the MEAC title and made it to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, but senior Broc Everett wrapped up his collegiate career by winning the NCAA individual national championship, defeating Auburn's Brandon Mancheno in a playoff.

In softball, Bethune-Cookman earned the MEAC's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Softball Championship in 2005. The Lady Wildcats defeated Florida, Central Florida and South Florida in the Florida Regional to become the first MEAC program to win an NCAA Division I Softball Regional. Bethune-Cookman ended the 2005 season with the conference's first-ever national ranking, reaching No. 18 in the season's final NFCA/USA Today Coaches poll and No. 23 in the USA Softball/ESPN.com poll.

Florida A&M was the first MEAC baseball team to advance to NCAA postseason play in 1994. The Rattlers took on Southeastern Louisiana in a best-of-three play-in series, falling 11-10 and 8-7 in two games. During the 2002 season, Bethune-Cookman advanced to the Gainesville Regional and became the first MEAC team to win a game in the NCAA Tournament with a 7-4 victory over Florida International. In 2017, the Wildcats became the first MEAC school to advance to a regional final, winning three games in the Gainesville Regional – including a 6-2 win over national No. 3 seed Florida.

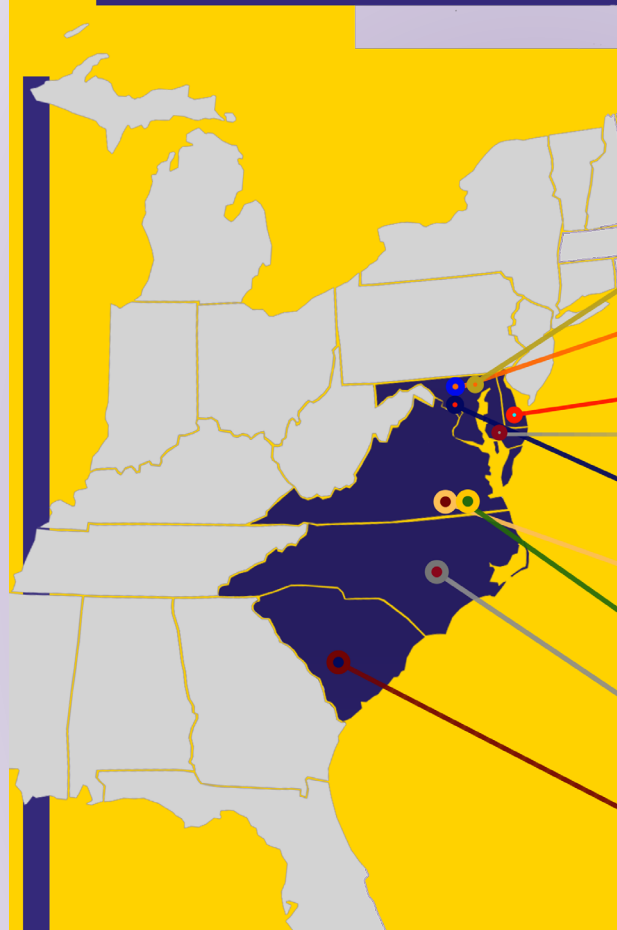

2022-23 YEAR IN REVIEW

CROSS COUNTRY

The first trophies of the year were handed out in Smyrna, Delaware at the end of October, as Delaware State University served as host for the 2022 MEAC Cross Country Championships at the Delaware State University Outreach and Research Center. The Norfolk State men again proved to be the class of the conference, winning their third straight team title as all five Spartans finished in the top 10 – including a sweep of the top three positions. Gidion Sigei won individual gold with a time of 24:38.8, earning Outstanding Performer honors, and Kenneth Giles was named the meet's Outstanding Coach as Norfolk State claimed its 15th MEAC men's cross country title of all time. On the women's side, Howard University won its first team championship since 2005, and eighth overall, as the Bison also had five runners among the top 10 finishers. Norfolk State's Mercyline Kimaiyo was the individual champion and Outstanding Performer, completing the 5K course in 18:02.03 seconds, and the Bison's Wesley Stephens was named the meet's Outstanding Coach.

VOLLEYBALL

2022 was a banner year for MEAC volleyball, as three programs – Coppin State, Delaware State and Howard – had 20-win seasons. It was the first time that had happened in the MEAC since 2005, and the season culminated in an epic MEAC Volleyball Championship, which this year was hosted by Delaware State University in the Hornets' Memorial Hall Gym. Delaware State made its second straight trip to the championship match, after dispatching of 2021 champion Howard in the semifinals, defeating Coppin State in four sets to claim the program's first MEAC title since 1986 and earn the Hornets' first-ever trip to the NCAA Volleyball Championship. Delaware State's Alondra Maldonado earned tournament Outstanding Performer honors, and Dr. Bruce Atkinson was named Outstanding Coach.

After the regular season, Howard's Rya McKinnon was named both the MEAC Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year, becoming the first player to win both awards in the same season since 2002, while Setter of the Year went to both Howard's Kayla Diaz and Coppin State's Andrea Tsvetanova, and Coppin State's Ashley Roman was once again named Defensive Player of the year. Coppin State's Tim Walsh was named the MEAC Coach of the Year for the second time in three seasons. The Hornets faced Nebraska in the first round of the NCAA Volleyball Championship, while Coppin State took on Wake Forest in a five-set thriller in the National Volleyball Invitational Championship.

FOOTBALL

2022 was another exciting year for MEAC football, with North Carolina Central and Howard University surprising pundits by sharing the conference hardware after both teams went 4-1 in league play. The Eagles, under the direction of head coach Trei Oliver – the MEAC Coach of the Year – earned the MEAC's berth to the Cricket Celebration Bowl by virtue of a 50-21 win over the Bison, where they faced back-to-back SWAC champion Jackson State. For the second straight year, the MEAC's representative came into the Celebration Bowl as the underdog, and for the second straight season, that underdog emerged victorious. North Carolina Central defeated Jackson State in overtime to win the program's first Celebration Bowl title and give the MEAC a 6-1 record all-time in the bowl game.

Delaware State running back Marquis Gillis was named MEAC Rookie of the Year, but the Eagles were well-represented in the MEAC's postseason honors; on top of Oliver's status as MEAC Coach of the Year, North Carolina Central also had the MEAC Offensive Lineman of the Year in Robert Mitchell. Quarterback Davius Richard and defensive back Khalil Baker were in Las Vegas in early December, where they were named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year, respectively, as part of the National Football Foundation and College

Football Hall of Fame's annual festivities and highlighting a partnership between the MEAC and the NFF dating back to 2016.

INDOOR TRACK & FIELD

For the second year, the MEAC Indoor Track & Field Championships were held at the Virginia Beach Sports Center in Virginia Beach, Va., and for the second straight year, the Norfolk State men and Howard women emerged as champions. The Spartans won their 12th overall indoor title, scoring 180 points to second-place Howard's 109. The Spartans' Gidion Sigei and Regan Kimtai were both named Outstanding Runner, as each won three event titles during the meet, while North Carolina Central's Jaelyn Blanc earned Outstanding Field Performer honors. Norfolk State's Kenneth Giles was once again named the meet's Outstanding Coach.

On the women's side, Howard University obliterated the meet record for team points, racking up 235 points and winning seven gold medals in running away with the championship, the fifth in program history. Second-place Norfolk State was a distant second with 116 points. The Bison's David Oliver repeated as the meet's Outstanding Coach, while Norfolk State's Mercyline Kimaiyo added to her cross country title by being named the meet's Outstanding Runner. Tia Jackson of Morgan State was named the meet's Outstanding Field Performer.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Howard University returned to the top of the MEAC on the hardwood this season, winning both the conference's regular-season title and the tournament championship. The Bison went 11-3 in MEAC play to sit atop the standings for the first time since the 1991-92 season and take the tournament's top seed. Along the way, head coach Kenneth Blakeney was named MEAC Coach of the Year and freshman Shy Odom earned Rookie of the Year honors. The regular season also saw Norfolk State's Joe Bryant, Jr., repeat as MEAC Player of the Year and North Carolina Central's Brendan Medley-Bacon named Defensive Player of the Year.

Once the tournament got underway at the Norfolk Scope Arena, Howard University flexed its muscle, blowing out opponents en route to the championship game – where the Bison came up against the two-time defending champion Spartans. The Bison emerged with a one-point win for their first MEAC tournament title since 1992. Odom was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer, while Blakeney was named Outstanding Coach. Howard earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, where the Bison took on No. 3 Kansas in the first round.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The 2022-23 MEAC women's basketball season was a long time coming for Norfolk State, as the Spartans came away with both the regular-season and tournament titles in a season for the ages. Norfolk State set a new program Division I record with 26 wins, going 11-3 in MEAC play to enter tournament play as the top seed. The Spartans' Larry Vickers was named MEAC Coach of the Year for his efforts, and Camille Downs repeated as Defensive Player of the Year. Howard University's Destiny Howell was named MEAC Player of the Year after leading the MEAC in scoring, and North Carolina Central's Jerni Kiaku was named Rookie of the Year.

The Spartans were the top seed in the MEAC Tournament at Norfolk Scope Arena, earning blowout wins in the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds to set up a championship game rematch against 2022 champion Howard. This time, Norfolk State prevailed, taking a 56-52 win to give the Spartans their first tournament title since 2002. Vickers was named the tournament's Outstanding Coach,

while Kierra Wheeler earned Outstanding Performer honors.

While the Spartans earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, taking on 2022 national champion South Carolina in the first round, Morgan State also saw postseason play by earning a bid to the Women's NIT. The Bears faced Wake Forest in the first round, giving the MEAC two teams in the postseason.

ESPORTS

During the 2023 MEAC Basketball Tournament at the Norfolk Scope Arena, the MEAC made history – beginning with the conference's e-sports championship. The championship was held in-person for the first time, taking place in the Scope Arena on the Wednesday and Thursday of the tournament. Gamers from each of the conference's e-sports programs were on-hand, both in the arena and virtually, competing in a variety of games, including Super Smash Bros. Ultimate and Rocket League. Professional shoutcasters – or e-sports commentators – Ajax, Herculyse, Daramgar and Lemonkiwi called the action, and Morgan State was named the overall winner after taking first place in Overwatch 2 and Mario Kart. Howard University, the overall runner-up, was the Smash Bros. champion. Gamer tag vexel of Howard was named the top overall player.

WOMEN'S BOWLING

The MEAC once again proved itself to be one of the best conferences in the nation when it comes to women's bowling, with four programs nationally ranked throughout the season. Associate member North Carolina A&T State was top among those programs all year, including going 15-1 in conference play to earn the MEAC regular-season title. For the second straight year, Melanie Katzen was named MEAC Bowler of the Year and Kim Terrell-Kearney was named Coach of the Year, while Morgan State's Johnna Hill earned Rookie of the Year honors.

The Aggies, two-time defending MEAC tournament champions, earned the top seed for the 2023 tournament held at Pinboy's at the Beach and parlayed that into a comeback 4-3 victory over Monmouth in the championship match. Lauren Tomaszewski repeated as the tournament's Outstanding Performer and Terrell-Kearney was once again Outstanding Coach after leading North Carolina A&T State to its third straight MEAC championship. The Aggies earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Bowling National Championship, taking on Medaille and Arkansas State in double-elimination play.

MEN'S TENNIS

South Carolina State's reign as the top tennis program in the MEAC continued in 2023, as the Bulldogs went undefeated in conference play to once again claim the regular-season crown. The Bulldogs claimed three First Team honorees – including MEAC Rookie of the Year Novak Novakovic – and Hardeep Judge was named Coach of the Year for the eighth time in his career. Morgan State's Mikael Carpenter was named MEAC Player of the Year after going 13-2 on the season and a perfect 5-0 against MEAC foes.

Come tournament time – at the Cary Tennis Park in Cary, N.C. – the Bulldogs were the top seed and used a 4-1 win over Norfolk State and a 4-0 sweep of North Carolina Central to win their third straight MEAC tournament title and 18th overall. Judge was again named the tournament's Outstanding Coach, while Pedro Sasso earned Outstanding Performer honors. South Carolina State earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tennis Championships, taking on South Carolina in the first round.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Much like the men, the South Carolina State women were the class of the MEAC this season – going a perfect 6-0 in conference play to win the regular-season

title. The Bulldogs' Sofiya Chursina was named MEAC Player of the Year, while Judge was named Coach of the Year for the sixth time. North Carolina Central's Alejandra Hidalgo Vega rounded out the regular-season awards, claiming MEAC Rookie of the Year honors.

As the top seed in the MEAC Tennis Championships at Cary Tennis Park in Cary, N.C., South Carolina State moved past Howard 4-1 in the semifinals before sweeping Delaware State 4-0 in the championship match. Judge was again named the tournament's Outstanding Coach and Chursina was named Outstanding Performer. As the MEAC's automatic bid winner for the NCAA Tennis Championships, the Bulldogs drew N.C. State in the first round.

OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

The MEAC Outdoor Track & Field Championships, held at Norfolk State's Dick Price Stadium, looked a lot like the indoor meet back in February, as the Norfolk State men and Howard women took home their respective team championships. With the trophies once again handed out to the Spartans and Bison, both programs completed the season sweep – winning their respective cross country, indoor track & field and outdoor track & field titles in the same academic year.

The Spartan men claimed the outdoor crown for the second straight year and 11th time overall, racking up 188.5 points to edge past the Bison. The Spartans' Regan Kimtai was named the meet's Outstanding Runner, while North Carolina Central's Matthew Swepson repeated as Outstanding Field Performer. The Spartans' Kenneth Giles was once again the meet's Outstanding Coach.

On the women's side, Howard was once again dominant in racking up 241.5 points for its second straight outdoor title and third overall. Morgan State was a distant second in the team standings with 138 points. Norfolk State's Mercyline Kimaiyo was named the meet's Outstanding Runner, while teammate Leslie Young repeated as Outstanding Field Performer. The Bison's David Oliver was named the meet's Outstanding Coach.

SOFTBALL

The 2023 MEAC softball season saw the Morgan State Bears emerge as the regular-season champions after going 14-4 in league play, two games ahead of the Spartans of Norfolk State. The Bears boasted the MEAC Player of the Year in pitcher and infielder Victoria Fletcher, while Anaya Hunte repeated as the league's Pitcher of the Year. The Eagles of North Carolina Central took home the MEAC's other two regular-season honors, with Makiya Graves taking home Rookie of the Year honors and Cat Tarvin being named the Coach of the Year.

Once the 2023 MEAC Softball Championship got underway at Norfolk State's softball field, chaos ensued – with the top seed Morgan State and number two seed Norfolk State both being eliminated without winning a game. North Carolina Central, the number three seed, won its way to the championship round, where the Eagles took on and defeated Coppin State in a clash of programs seeking their first-ever softball championship. The Eagles' Jaden Davis was the tournament's Outstanding Performer and Tarvin was named Outstanding Coach. North Carolina Central made its NCAA softball debut in the Athens regional, taking on No. 14 national seed Georgia in the opening game of the double-elimination format.



COMMISSIONER STILLS



Sonja O. Stills has been a respected, well-known staple within the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference for the past 20 years, and on Jan. 1, 2022, she took over as commissioner -- becoming the first female commissioner in the conference's history, as well as the first female commissioner of a Division I HBCU conference.

With a proven track record of accountability, efficiency, and passion, Stills has risen through the ranks within the MEAC, beginning with her tenure at the conference in October 2002. Stills has made a name for herself among her peers and other industry professionals for her never-ending dedication to the conference and its student-athletes, ability to grow and innovate, organization, team-first mentality, and goal-achieving initiative.

In January 2021, Stills was promoted to Chief of Staff/Chief Operating Officer of the MEAC. In her new role, she ensures that the Commissioner is carrying out the strategic objectives of the Council of Chief Executive Officers and the Delegate Assembly. Stills was the lead on all hiring, strategic and long-range planning, re-branding, and marketing, NCAA Name, Image and Likeness (NIL), conference budget, the renewal of the MEAC Basketball Tournament with the City of Norfolk, and all special events and activities.

Stills also created the MEAC's Esports program, a new, cutting-edge initiative that began in the summer of 2020, as the conference and world continued to deal with the progression of the COVID-19 pandemic. She took charge as the Director of Esports, serving as the key driver in developing regulations for the MEAC Esports Community and developing the MEAC's esports strategy. Her goal has been to enhance awareness of the MEAC's esports initiative by working with industry business leaders to encourage growth.

Much like overseeing the addition of Esports to the MEAC's portfolio, Stills looks to enter a new tenure for the conference while continuing to bolster the respect, traditions, and love of the MEAC. She looks to deepen the communication with the member institutions, alumni, fans, and community, to express the strong desire and support for the success and sustainability of the Conference that transparently articulates its vision and strategy. The intention is to create a collaborative process in which the "new vision" for the MEAC is a shared vision that is all-inclusive athletically and academically.

Before her appointment to Chief of Staff/Chief Operating Officer, Stills served as the Senior Associate Commissioner for Administration and Compliance (June 2012-21), Assistant Commissioner for Administration and Compliance (July 2008-12), Executive Assistant to the Commissioner (July 2006-08), Senior Woman Administrator (June 2006-2021) and Director of Compliance (October 2002-08).

Prior to being named Commissioner, Stills elevated overall brand visibility for the MEAC. She negotiated over \$683,000 in corporate partnership monies by working with major companies such as: iHeartRadio, US Marines, Home Depot, Hampton Roads Transit, JT Fisher Funeral Home, Priority Automotive, ESI, TowneBank, Glenmede Financials, House-Autry, CurtMont Food Services and Harley Davison. She assisted in negotiating a contract with Nike that brought over \$9 million to member institutions. She operates with the financial interests of the conference; its member institutions and student-athletes are at the forefront for her. She designed and implemented the Athletic Eligibility Certification Review to assist institutions in preparing for the NCAA Academic Progress Program (APP) Data Review. She managed the budgets for the Conference Grant, Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund and Special Assistant Fund. She was instrumental in developing the MEAC Strategic and Long-Range Plan in December 2008, along with securing global creative agency 160over90 as the marketing company for the MEAC in 2020. In 2022, she oversaw the update of MEAC Strategic and Long-Range Plan.

As the Senior Associate Commissioner, Stills provided supervision for Conference staff, including Compliance, Championship, Media Relations, Finance, Corporate Partnerships, Multimedia/Marketing, Digital & Video and administrative support staff. She took the helm and managed the operations of the Conference Office in the absence of the Commissioner, coordinated all ancillary events of the Conference (i.e., Football Press Luncheon, Basketball Tournament Tip-Off Banquet, Cheerleading

Championship, Preseason Basketball Press Luncheon, etc.) and Mid-Winter, Spring and Summer Conference meetings. During the conference basketball tournaments, Stills provided guidance and insight while monitoring the NCAA Academic Progress Program (APP) for member institutions to implement the APP Seminar with NCAA Academic and Membership Staff.

She also provided administrative support to the Commissioner for the Council of Chief Executive Officers and Executive Committee and conducted conference compliance workshops, reviews, and spot checks to ensure compliance with Conference and NCAA rules and regulations. She served as liaison to the conference's Compliance Coordinators, Athletics Academic Support staff, Alumni Directors and Constitution and Bylaws committees, as well as assisting with other conference committees. Under Stills' guidance as the Assistant Commissioner for Administration, she coordinated the MEAC Cheerleading Championship -- the only HBCU collegiate cheerleading championship.

During her time as the Executive Assistant to the Commissioner, Stills provided direct support to the Commissioner, administrative support to the Commissioner for the Council of Chief Executive Officers and Executive Committee, managed the day-to-day operations and administration of the conference office, assisted the Commissioner by executing initiatives and special projects, evaluated functions, practices and the efficiency of facilities, and evaluated staff performance while providing leadership and guidance for personnel.

As the Senior Woman Administrator, Stills continued to work in conjunction with the senior leadership team within the MEAC regarding women's issues and other issues that affect the membership. She coordinated the Senior Woman Administrators' Women in Athletics Professional Development Workshop, coordinated the selection of the MEAC Woman of the Year and served as the liaison to member institutions' senior woman administrators.

AT HAMPTON UNIVERSITY

Before arriving at the MEAC, Stills served as Hampton University's Coordinator of Athletic Academic Support for four years, and for three of those years, she was appointed Senior Woman Administrator. While at Hampton, she created the university's first Athletic Academic Support Program and implemented the CHAMPS/LifeSkills Program. She provided academic advising, counseling, and assistance to student-athletes in areas of course selection, registration procedures, degree requirements, career planning, university resources and other related topics associated with academic performance for all sports programs.

While serving as Senior Woman Administrator, Stills served as the highest-ranking female on the senior leadership team regarding the administration of the athletics department. She coordinated student-athlete and corporate partner banquets and events, oversaw the supervision of the cheerleading program, and assisted in coordinating event management during home football and basketball games with gameday operations, marketing, and will-call.

A 1993 graduate of Old Dominion University, Stills earned her bachelor's degree in Human Services Counseling. While a student, she earned the Virginia Campus Outreach Opportunity League (VA COOL) Catalyst Award for creating a week-long community outreach program for the university. In addition, she served on the university's President's Advisory Committee on Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action and Diversity. In 1996, she received a Master of Arts in Counseling (College Student Work Personnel) from Hampton University. She would later go on to graduate from the Sports Management Institute in 2002 and the NACWAA/HERS Institute for Administrative Advancement in 2008.

Stills holds current memberships in the National Association for Athletics Compliance (NAAC), National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics (N4A), Minority Opportunities Athletic Association (MOAA), Women Leaders for College Sports (WLS), National Association of Esports Coaches and Directors (NAECAD), and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated. She also serves as a substitute for the MEAC representative to the NCAA Division I Council.

Stills is a former member of the NCAA Legislative Council (2008-11), Coastal Collegiate Swimming Association - Policy Committee (2008-20), MEAC Senior Woman Administrators Association Chair (2002), and Touraine Condominium Association Board Member (1997-2020).

Davius Richard -- QB, North Carolina Central
2023 MEAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year

North Carolina Central quarterback Davius Richard and North Carolina Central defensive back Khalil Baker have been named Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Offensive and Defensive Preseason Players of the Year, presented by The Home Depot.

Additionally, the defending co-champion Eagles are the preseason favorite to win the MEAC this season, racking up 124 points and nine out of a possible 12 first-place votes in a poll conducted by the league's head coaches and sports information directors.

2022 co-champion Howard (one first-place vote) was picked to finish second, while South Carolina State came in the third spot.

Rounding out the predicted order of finish were Morgan State (one first-place vote), Norfolk State and Delaware State (one first-place vote).

Richard was the 2022 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year and a finalist for the Walter Payton Award (given to the top offensive player in all of FCS) after leading the Eagles to a 10-win season, MEAC championship and an overtime win over Jackson State in the Cricket Celebration Bowl. He ranked 10th in the nation in total offense (287.4 ypg), 15th in passing touchdowns (25) and 28th in passing yards (2,661 / 221.8 ypg).

With Richard behind center, the Eagles led the MEAC in both scoring offense (38.6 ppg) and total offense (445.3 ypg).

Baker was the MEAC Defensive Player of the Year for the Eagles in 2022, and he was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, given out to the nation's top FCS defensive player. He tallied four interceptions and five pass break-ups last season, and he returned one of those picks for a touchdown in a win over nationally-ranked New Hampshire. He tied for the team lead with 61 total tackles, including two for a loss and a fumble recovery.

Baker led an Eagles defense that ranked second in the MEAC in scoring (21.5 ppg) and total defense (333.7 ypg).

HEAD COACH LEE HULL



Lee Hull was introduced as the 24th head coach in Hornets history on Dec. 20, 2022. A former MEAC champion head coach, Hull brought more than 25 years of coaching experience at the professional and NCAA Division I levels to the position.

Hull most recently served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at rival Howard University since 2020. This past season, Howard was co-champion of the MEAC for the first time since 1993, posting a 4-1 league record during the 2022 season to share the title with

North Carolina Central. Nine Bison offensive players earned All-MEAC honors last season, including quarterback Quinton Williams, a Second Team selection after leading the conference in completion percentage (64.8%) and ranking second in the league in passing average at 190.6 yards per game.

Hull's MEAC experience also includes a two-year stint as head coach at Morgan State during the 2014 and 2015 seasons. In 2014, he led the Bears to a share of the conference championship with a 6-2 league record and a berth in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoffs for the first time in team history. The MEAC title was Morgan State's first since 1979. Hull was selected as the MEAC Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award as the top FCS coach during the 2014 season.

Following his two years at Morgan State, Hull joined the Indianapolis Colts of the NFL as wide receivers coach before the 2016 season. That year, Colts' receiver T.Y. Hilton led the NFL with 1,448 receiving yards and was selected to the Pro Bowl.

Hull was educated on professional football coaching during two years at the Bill Walsh Minority Coaching Fellowship. He was also a part of the NFL and NCAA Coaches Academy and Bowl Championship Series (BCS) Minority Future Head Coaches Forum.

Hull was a three-year starting receiver at College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass. from 1984-87. He was a 1986 Preseason All-American for the Crusaders, the New York Times number one ranked team in NCAA Division I-AA and Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) that season. In 1987, Holy Cross was ranked number one by the NCAA and ECAC and captured its second straight Lambert Cup and Colonial Conference championships.

Following his college playing career, Hull was invited by the New England Patriots to attend their 1988 rookie mini-camp and preseason camp.

From June 1990 to August 1992, Hull competed as a wide receiver and kick returner for the Winnipeg Bombers of the professional Canadian Football League and was a member of the team's 1990 Grey Cup CFL championship squad. Hull joined the CFL's Toronto Argonauts later in the 1992 season.

He began his college coaching career at his alma mater, College of the Holy Cross, as a volunteer assistant in 1996 and was later promoted to linebackers coach, receivers coach, and passing game coordinator during his seven years on the staff.

From 2005-08, Hull was wide receivers coach at Oregon State University. During his tenure, Mike Hass was the recipient of the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's best receiver in 2005. That season, Hass was a First Team Associated Press, First Team Walter Camp, and *Sports Illustrated* Midseason All-America First Team selection. He was number one in the nation in receiving yardage, setting Oregon State and PAC 10 single-season records with 1,532 yards.

Hull was a member of the University of Maryland staff as wide receivers coach from 2008-14. Among the players he helped develop with the Terrapins is current NFL star receiver Stefon Diggs of the Buffalo Bills.

The University of Maryland also produced seven other NFL receivers during Hull's tenure with the program, including All-America and All-ACC selection Torrey Smith, a Super Bowl champion with the Philadelphia Eagles and former Baltimore Ravens star. Darius Heyward-Bey was the first wide receiver selected in the 2009 NFL Draft, taken seventh overall by the Oakland Raiders after a standout career with the Terps. Maryland product Kevin Dorsey was a seventh-round pick by the Green Bay Packers and Tony Logan was a free agent signee with the New England Patriots. LaQuan Williams (Baltimore Ravens), Adrian Cannon (San Diego Chargers) and Isaiah Williams (Baltimore Ravens) also launched NFL careers after being coached by Hull with the Terrapins.

From 2019-20, Hull was offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach at Wagner College in Staten Island, N.Y.

A native of Vineland, N.J., Hull earned a Bachelor's degree in Economics from Holy Cross in 1988 and a Master's in Secondary Education from Worcester State College (Mass.) in 1995.

HEAD COACH LARRY SCOTT



On Feb. 6, 2020, Howard University announced Larry Scott as its football head coach. Scott joined the Bison Family with more than 15 years of collegiate experience, including six postseason bowl/playoff game victories (10 appearances overall).

The Sebring, Fla., native has spent a majority of his coaching career in the state of Florida, where he attended (1997-99) and coached (2006-12) at South Florida as well as Miami (2013-15) and most recently Florida (2018-2020). Prior to joining the Florida coaching

staff, Scott was a member of Ethan Wolfe staff at the University of Tennessee (2016-17).

A 2000 graduate from the University of South Florida (USF), Scott played offensive lineman for the Bulls. After four seasons of high school coaching experience, Scott joined the USF staff in 2005 as Director of High School Relations. During his time at USF, Scott coached the offensive line, tight ends and running backs as well as serving as a lead recruiter.

In 2008, Scott helped lead the Bulls to their best recruiting class in program history, only to surpass that class with the nation's No. 21 ranked class in 2009.

During his time in Coral Gables, Scott served as the Hurricanes' tight ends coach for two-plus seasons (2013-15) prior to being named their interim head coach for the final six games of 2015. As Miami's interim coach, Scott led the Hurricanes to a 4-2 mark and a berth in the Sun Bowl.

In only his second full season at the helm at The Mecca, Scott led the program to a share of the 2022 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) regular-season title, its first championship since 1993. Additionally, he saw 17 Bison earn All-MEAC honors, including defensive back Kenny Gallop, Jr., who received BOXTOROW HBCU All-American honors.

After playing a pair of games during the 2021 COVID-19 spring season, Scott coached 10 Bison to the All- MEAC Team following the 2021 fall campaign.

On Oct. 2, 2021, Scott earned his first win as Bison head coach, knocking off FCS powerhouse Sacred Heart at Greene Stadium.

Before each home game throughout the 2021 fall season, the program implemented "The Bison Walk," featuring the Howard University Showtime Band, Cheerleaders and football team marching through campus towards Greene Stadium.

In Dec. 2021, Scott signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history.

During his time in Coral Gables, Scott served as the Hurricanes' tight ends coach for two-plus seasons (2013-15) prior to being named their interim head coach for the final six games of 2015. As Miami's interim coach, Scott led the Hurricanes to a 4-2 mark and a berth in the Sun Bowl.

Scott has spent the two seasons with Dan Mullen as the assistant coach and tight ends coach at Florida, where he guided his position group to multiple personal bests and better numbers than in years prior.

Scott helped devise game plans each week that allowed 11 different Gators to record a touchdown reception in 2018 and 10 in 2019.

Scott helped Ethan Wolf cap his career in 2017 as one of the greatest tight ends in Rocky Top history. Wolf ranked No. 2 among UT tight ends in career receptions (91) and No. 3 in receiving yards (998) and led the Vols with 47 starts.

Tennessee's offense in 2017 saw running back John Kelly (778 rush yards, 37 catches) join Penn State's Saquon Barkley (1,271 rush yards, 54 catches) as the only two players in the Power 5 to lead their teams in rushing and receptions.

Scott spent two-plus seasons as the Hurricanes' tight ends coach prior to being named their interim head coach for the final six games of 2015. As Miami's interim head coach, Scott led the Hurricanes to a 4-2 mark and a berth in the Sun Bowl.

In 2014, Scott oversaw a tight end unit that combined for 52 receptions and 833 yards receiving. He also mentored Clive Walford, who had a breakout 2014 campaign where he led the team in receptions with 44. Under Scott's watchful eye, Walford earned third team All-America and second team All-ACC honors.

Following the year, Walford was selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders.

HEAD COACH DAMON WILSON



Damon Wilson is a 24-year coaching veteran, where he began his coaching journey immediately after hanging up his cleats as an All-CIAA tight end at Bowie State University. There, he began his collegiate coaching career as a running back coach and special teams coordinator.

That experience, paired with his exposure to coaching Pop Warner as a teen alongside his father and uncle, fueled his passion for coaching the game. Even as a teenager, he was driven to develop young men on and off the field. He continues to pride himself in seeing his players graduate and succeed in life after football.

In 2004, he had the opportunity to develop his career in Division I FCS football in the SWAC for five (5) years in Texas, first at Texas Southern University and later at Prairie View A&M University. The Panthers of Prairie View finished the 2008 season with a 9-1 record and ranked 23rd nationally in Division I-AA football polls.

As the running backs coach, Wilson helped lead the Panthers' offense to their most successful season ever. Under Wilson's guidance, they led the SWAC in rushing and broke the University's all-time record.

In 2009, Wilson had the unique opportunity to begin his head coaching era at his alma mater, Bowie State University. In his inaugural season he broke the school record for Most Offensive Yards in a game, had eight (8) players receive All-CIAA Conference honors, and four (4) players selected to the CIAA All-Rookie Team. Wilson closed his 1st season as the 2009 Eastern Division Champs and had the #1 ranked defense in the country.

The 2018 season was memorable for Bowie State football, as the Bulldogs claimed the school's first-ever CIAA championship, defeating Fayetteville State by a score of 30-10. The victory allowed the Bulldogs to host the first round of the NCAA Super Region 2 Playoffs for the second consecutive season. In the opening round game, Bowie State took down West Alabama 41-35 in a true battle on the gridiron that advanced the Bulldogs to the Second Round of Super Region 2 for the first-time in school history.

Bowie State's 2019 season was even more remarkable as the Bulldogs recorded the school's first-ever undefeated regular season and became back-to-back CIAA champions.

In 2020, COVID-19 put a pause on the record-breaking Bulldogs' reign due to cancellation of the season. However, Wilson and the Bowie State Bulldogs returned to claim the Northern Division title and the CIAA championship for a third year in a row in 2021. The Bulldogs hosted two NCAA playoff games and closed their season setting yet another BSU record by earning a spot in

NCAA Elite 8.

They were ranked No. 6 in the country that season.

Wilson's coaching season did not end there, as he was later named co-head coach in the Inaugural HBCU Legacy Bowl in 2022.

Alongside four of his assistant coaches, four of his senior players, and a host of coaches and players from the CIAA and the MEAC, Wilson's team won the first-ever HBCU Legacy Bowl. Earning Wilson two championships in one season.

Wilson closed out a historic championship season by being named the 2021 AFCA Division II National Coach of the Year. The award was the first for Bowie State and the conference, as he became the first CIAA coach to win this prestigious award.

Throughout his time at Bowie State, Wilson has had tremendous success, not only breaking and resetting school records, but he has been recognized nationally for his ability to not only win but to cultivate athletes and coaches to move on to the next level. Wilson has had four (4) players and two (2) coaches in the National Football League (NFL), one (1) player in the Arena Football League (AFL) and several players in numerous professional leagues around the world.

Wilson is married to Allison (Dunn) and they have one son, Dylan.

Wilson is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. In his spare time, he enjoys spending time with his family, working with children, fishing, and attending sporting events.

Dawson Odums, a championship coach with a track record of developing student-athletes both on and off the field during his collegiate coaching career, is in his third year as the head football coach at Norfolk State University.

Odums led NSU to a successful campaign in his first season in charge. The Spartans went 6-5 in 2021, which included a six-game winning streak that was the program's longest since 1984. Officially, the 2021 season marked NSU's first winning ledger since 2007.

A balanced, high-powered offense was NSU's calling card in 2021. NSU averaged 33.2 points per game, most in its Division I history and third-most in school annals, while averaging a MEAC-high 440.5 yards per game – another school D-I record. That included 212.2 rushing yards per game, second-best in program history and the most since 1984.

The Spartans had a school-record 18 players earn All-MEAC honors following the 2021 season. That included NSU capturing three of the MEAC's top awards – Offensive Player of the Year (Juwan Carter), Rookie of the Year (J.J. Davis) and Offensive Lineman of the Year (Justin Redd).

Norfolk State landed 31 student-athletes on the MEAC All-Academic Football Team and nine on the MEAC Postseason team. Linebacker Daylan Long received first-team honors, while wide receiver Da'Quan Felton, linebacker Marquis Hall and defensive back R.J. Coles were named to the second team.

A native of Shelby, N.C., Odums has more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience. Most recently, Odums enjoyed a stellar 10-year run in the Southwestern Athletic Conference at Southern University in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Odums directed Southern to a winning record in each of his eight full seasons at the helm of the program, including a 5-1 mark in the abbreviated 2021 spring season. In his last five seasons, the Jaguars posted a 29-6 SWAC record. His overall record with the Jaguars was 63-35.

After joining the Jaguars as defensive line coach in 2011, Odums was elevated to interim head coach two games into the 2012 season before earning the permanent head coach position following the year. On the field, Odums led Southern to a 53-17 SWAC mark over the last nine seasons. His ledger includes one SWAC championship (2013), one SWAC Coach of the Year honor (2013) and four SWAC West Division titles (2013, '14, '18, '19).

Odums' teams at Southern excelled in all three phases of the game. In the 2021 spring season, Southern ranked first nationally in blocked punts, second in third-down conversions, fifth in sacks and eighth in scoring offense. Southern finished the year ranked 20th in the FCS Top 25 Coaches Poll. Defensive end Jordan Lewis brought distinction to the Jaguars by winning the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the top defensive player in the Division

I FCS. Lewis, who led the country in sacks and tackles for loss, also won SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Southern posted top-20 total offenses in 2015 and 2016 and a No. 13 mark in rushing offense en route to a SWAC West title in 2019. Odums' squads ranked in the top 10 in the FCS in punt return average four times, including leading the country in 2017, and also ranked top-10 in kickoff return average twice.

The 2013 season was a special one for Odums. His first full year as head coach at Southern culminated in a double-overtime SWAC championship game victory over Jackson State. The win made Odums just the second coach in Southern history to win a SWAC divisional title, outright SWAC championship and SWAC Coach of the Year honors in his first year as head coach. The Jaguars went 9-4 that year, one of four seasons in which they won at least eight games on Odums' watch. They also won nine games and captured the divisional title the following year, 2014.

Seven players coached by Odums have signed with teams in the NFL or CFL. That list includes SWAC all-time leading rusher Lenard Tillery and Southern's all-time leader in receiving yards and return touchdowns, Willie Quinn. That list includes two-time All-MEAC defensive end De'Shaan Dixon, who signed as an undrafted free agent with the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars after finishing his career as a Spartan.

Odums' first stint in the MEAC came as defensive line coach at Bethune-Cookman from 2005-07. Over Odums' three-year span there, the Wildcats run defense was among the stingiest in the MEAC.

Odums played linebacker and quarterback at Crest High School in Boiling Springs, N.C., before competing collegiately at North Carolina Central. A defensive lineman, Odums was a team captain and All-CIAA selection as a senior. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1997.

Odums and his wife, Audrey, have two daughters, Jasmine and Jaiden.

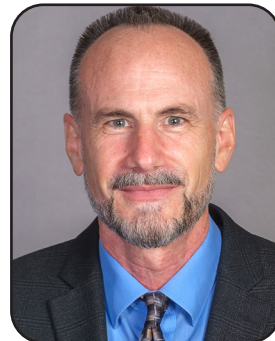

HEAD COACH TREI OLIVER



Trei Oliver returned to his alma mater as North Carolina Central University's 24th head football coach on Dec. 13, 2018.

A native of Yorktown, Va., Oliver earned all-conference and all-region honors as a defensive back and punter during his four-year playing career at NCCU from 1994-97. The 1998 graduate later returned to NCCU as an assistant coach from 2003-06, helping the Eagles to back-to-back CIAA championships in 2005 and 2006.

In 2022, his third season as head coach, Oliver led his alma mater to a thrilling 41-34 overtime victory over No. 5 Jackson State University in the Cricket Celebration Bowl, earning the title as HBCU national champions, becoming just the third team in school history to win 10 games in a season, and securing the program's highest FCS national ranking at No. 17 in the final AFCA Coaches' Poll. He was voted as the 2022 MEAC Football Coach of the Year after guiding the Eagles to their first conference championship in six years. The historic campaign featured non-conference FCS victories over North Carolina A&T, No. 25 New Hampshire, Tennessee Tech, and No. 5 Jackson State.

Having started his coaching career in 1999, Oliver boasts coaching experience that includes six conference championships and four black college football national titles.

Oliver returned to NCCU as head coach after spending the previous three seasons (2016-18) as the defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Southern University. The Jaguars were coming off a Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) West division championship and a trip to the SWAC championship game.

In the prior 15 seasons (2004-18) as a coach at four different universities, Oliver was a part of only one season with fewer than seven wins. During that time, he has celebrated 124 victories for an average of more than eight triumphs per year and a winning percentage of .725.

Prior to Southern University, Oliver served as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at North Carolina A&T State University from 2011-15, when the Aggies shared consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) championships in 2014 and 2015, and were declared the black college football national champions in his final campaign in Greensboro as winners of the Celebration Bowl with a 10-2 overall record.

In four seasons at Grambling State University from 2007-10 as the outside linebackers coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coordinator, the Tigers earned two SWAC West division crowns, and won the SWAC championship game and a black college football national title in 2008 with an 11-2 record.

Oliver's first coaching stint at NCCU was as a defensive backs and wide receivers coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coordinator from 2003-06. The Eagles captured back-to-back CIAA championships with consecutive trips to the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2005 and 2006, and were crowned as the black college football national champions following an 11-1 season in 2006.

Oliver started his college coaching career at Delaware State University as defensive backs coach and assistant special teams coordinator from 1999-2002.

Trei Oliver, NCCU Football 1994-97As a student-athlete at NCCU, Oliver twice led the CIAA in punting, including a 41.7-yard average in 1997, which ranks fifth on the Eagles' all-time single season list. As a junior in 1996, he was part of a defensive backfield that led the nation (NCAA Division II) in pass defense efficiency. As a senior, he landed two positions on the All-South Region Team, earning First Team honors as a defensive back and a Second Team selection as a punter.

Among NCCU's career leaders, Oliver ranks 13th with 234 tackles (126 solo), 12th with 31 passes defended (24 pass break-ups and seven interceptions), and fourth with a 39.3-yard punting average. He garnered All-CIAA first or second team honors in each of his four seasons.

Oliver graduated from NCCU in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned a master's degree in criminal justice from Grambling State University in 2010.

Both of his parents, Colon and Evelyn Oliver, are also NCCU graduates. His father played football as a wide receiver at NCCU from 1963-66.

He and his wife Yvette, also an NCCU graduate, are the proud parents of a son, Reggie.

Oliver "Buddy" Pough, the all-time winningest coach in program history, wrapped up his 21st season as head football coach at South Carolina State, his alma mater.

During his 21-year tenure at the school where he earned a bachelor's and a master's, as well as All-MEAC honors as an offensive lineman, Pough has compiled an overall record of 146-87 and a 112-42 MEAC worksheet.

His teams captured four MEAC titles (2021, 2008, 2009 and 2021) outright, shared four others (2004,

2010, 2013, 2014 and 2019), and made four trips to the prestigious FCS playoffs (2008, 2009, 2010 and 2013).

Pough captured his first Celebration Bowl Championship in 2021 knocking off top-ranked Jackson State to win his fifth (5th) HBCU national crown.

S.C. State had its best turnaround in 2013 with a 9-4 overall, 7-1 MEAC record after suffering its first losing season under Pough at 5-6 overall and 4-4 in the MEAC in 2012. In 2011, the Bulldogs compiled a 7-4 overall worksheet and were 6-2 in the MEAC. During the 2010 season, Pough's team finished 9-3 and was 7-1 in the MEAC to tie for the championship after winning the title outright in both 2009 and 2008. His squad also earned its third straight berth to the FCS playoffs and finished the 2010 campaign ranked high in all the HBCU and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) polls.

In 2009, S.C. State was named Black national champion by the Sheridan Broadcasting Network, the 100 Percent Wrong Club of Atlanta, the Washington (DC) Pigskin Club and the Box-to-Row /BASN. In addition, the Bulldogs finished number seven in all three major FCS polls – The Sports Network, the FCS Coaches Poll and Any Given Saturday.

Pough's 2009 squad finished 10-3 overall, captured its second consecutive MEAC crown with an unblemished 8-0 record and made back-to-back appearances in the FCS playoffs. The Orangeburg native reaped Coach of the Year honors in the MEAC -- his second in as many seasons -- and also earned the accolade from the (Columbia, SC) State newspaper, the Washington Pigskin Club, the 100 Percent Wrong Club of Atlanta and the Orangeburg Touch-down Club.

His 2008 squad was just as impressive, finishing 10-2 and winning the MEAC title with an 8-0 mark, the team's first outright title in 14 seasons, and returning to the FCS playoffs for the first time since the 1982 campaign.

Pough became the 14th head football coach at South Carolina State, while posting a 7-5 overall record and a 4-4 mark in the MEAC in his inaugural season in 2002. In 2003, he guided the Bulldogs to an 8-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in MEAC play, losing only to Hampton and Bethune-Cookman.

The 2004 season can be considered another one of the team's best under Pough, as the Bulldogs produced the first-of-two consecutive 9-2 seasons. SC State was 6-2 in MEAC play that season, tying the Hampton Pirates for the 2004 championship.

Pough has coached several players who have gone on to play in the National Football League, including nine who are currently on NFL rosters – Joe Thomas (Chicago Bears), Pro Bowl nose tackle Javon Hargrave (San Francisco 49ers), Alex Taylor (Dallas Cowboys), Antonio Hamilton (Arizona Cardinals), Decobie Durant (L.A. Rams) and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and Pro Bowl linebacker Darius Leonard (Indianapolis Colts).

Prior to taking the reins at South Carolina State, Pough spent five seasons as an assistant at the University Of South Carolina, the last three as running backs coach under Lou Holtz. During his stint at USC, he helped build the Gamecocks into one of the top offensive teams in the SEC. USC made back-to-back appearances in the Outback Bowl in 2000 and 2001.

Before going to USC, Pough was one of the top high school coaches in the Palmetto State, leading Fairfield-Central to a perfect 15-0 record in 1996 and claiming the Class AAA state title. He earned South Carolina High School League (SCHSL) Coach-of-the-Year honors for his efforts, the first of such three honors. Pough also had coaching stints at Keenan High in Columbia, where he built the Raiders into one of the top-Class AAA teams in the state.

In his final two seasons (1973 and 1974) as a player for S.C. State, the Orangeburg native helped the Bulldogs to a 15-7-1 record, a league crown and back-to-back postseason appearances seasons. After graduating in 1975, he joined the staff at nearby Orangeburg-Wilkinson High (1976-79), before returning to his alma mater as an assistant coach in 1979.

Pough and his wife, Josie are the parents of two sons: Oliver "Bud" IV and Lee Judson and a daughter-in-law, Dr. Natalie Odom Pough. He also has two granddaughters: Taylor Michelle and Olivia Grace.

North Carolina Central quarterback Davius Richard and defensive back Khalil Baker were named the 2022 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year, respectively, on Tuesday, Dec. 6, 2022.

The MEAC's top football honors were bestowed upon the two Eagles during the 64th annual National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Football Hall of Fame Press Conference, which was aired live on ESPN3.

MEAC Commissioner Sonja Stills made the announcement with both players in attendance.

This season marks the first time since 2005 that the MEAC's Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year have come from the same institution.

"Congratulations to both Davius and Khalil on being named our Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year," MEAC Commissioner Sonja Stills said. "They have earned every accolade they receive through their success on the field and they are fine representatives of both North Carolina Central University and the MEAC. I'm proud to honor them as the first Players of the Year during my tenure as commissioner."

Richard (QB, Jr., 6-3, 215, Belle Glade, Fla.) helped the Eagles win nine games in 2022 and claim their first MEAC football championship – and berth to the Cricket Celebration Bowl – since 2016. He currently ranks fifth in all of NCAA FCS in points responsible for with 20.4 points per game, and he is 12th in total offense, accounting for 288.8 yards per game. The seven-time MEAC Offensive Player of the Week also leads the conference in passing yards (2,486), passing touchdowns (24) and rushing touchdowns (13). With Richard at quarterback, the Eagles averaged a MEAC-best 38.4 points per game this season and scored 40 points or more in a game six times (including three 50-point efforts).

Baker (DB, Jr., 6-0, 185, Winston-Salem, N.C.) was second in the conference with four interceptions, including a touchdown return in a road win over nationally-ranked New Hampshire in September. A leader of the MEAC co-champion Eagles, he ranks third on the team with 51 tackles (38 solo), including 2.0 stops for a loss, while also recording five pass break-ups and recovering a fumble during his junior campaign. Baker is also fifth in the MEAC in passes defended with nine.

2022 was another banner season for the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference on the gridiron, with the Eagles of North Carolina Central proving to be the class of the league in winning nine regular-season games -- including non-conference victories over rival North Carolina A&T State, Tennessee Tech and nationally ranked New Hampshire.

The Eagles also went 4-1 in MEAC play, earning a share of the conference title and winning the league's bid to the Cricket Celebration Bowl by virtue of a 51-20 win over Howard during the regular season.

North Carolina Central then won its first-ever Celebration Bowl title in its second appearance, defeating favored Jackson State, champion of the SWAC, 41-34 in overtime.

North Carolina Central, led by MEAC Coach of the Year and Eagle alum Trei Oliver, finished the season ranked No. 17 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 21 in the STATS Perform FCS Top 25 Poll.

The Eagles won their first MEAC title since 2016, while the Bison, under the direction of head coach Larry Scott, earned a share of their first MEAC championship since 1993.

MEAC HOSTS THE PLAYOFFS

Bethune-Cookman (10-2) served as host for the second time in MEAC history when the Wildcats welcomed the New Hampshire Wildcats to Daytona Beach, Fla. in 2010. The Wildcats had previously hosted Florida Atlantic in the 2003 playoffs. Hampton also served as a host in 2006 to the New Hampshire Wildcats while Florida A&M hosted Troy State in the first round in 1998. The 2010 season marked the fourth time in MEAC history that two teams competed in the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs. The MEAC has enjoyed five at-large bids to the NCAA FCS (formerly I-AA). Playoffs including Bethune-Cookman (Hampton-automatic berth) in 1993 and Florida A&M in 1997, 1998, and 1999 (Hampton-automatic berth in 97 and 98 (North Carolina A&T-automatic berth in 1999) and South Carolina State in 2010 (Bethune-Cookman-automatic berth). The inaugural I-AA Championship was won by Florida A&M in 1978, a year before the Rattlers joined the MEAC. Prior to 1996, the MEAC only qualified for the NCAA I-AA playoffs in 1978, 1981, 1982, 1986 and 1992.

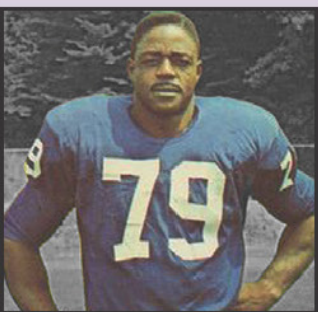
