## MEAC HISTORY

The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) enters its 51st year of intercollegiate competition with the 2021-22 academic school year. Located in Norfolk, Va., the MEAC is made up of eight outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline: Coppin State University, Delaware State University, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, Norfolk State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State University.

The MEAC sponsors 16 Division I (FCS) sports: baseball, bowling, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field, softball, volleyball and men's golf. The MEAC receives automatic NCAA qualification bids in nine sports – baseball, men's and women's basketball, women's bowling, men's golf, men's and women's tennis, softball and volleyball. The MEAC's football champion is pitted against the champion of the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in the Cricket Celebration Bowl, which debuted in December 2015.

MEAC student-athletes excel on and off the field, and several have been recognized on ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America and All-District teams. The conference sponsors All-Academic teams in each of its sports and awards two post-graduate scholarships of \$5,000 each annually to one male and one female student-athlete who have excelled academically and athletically and are in their final season of intercollegiate athletics eligibility and competition under MEAC and NCAA regulations.

### HISTORY

In 1969, a bold ad hoc group of innovators long associated with intercollegiate athletics met in Durham, N.C. to discuss the feasibility of organizing a new conference. From these discussions, they formed a steering and planning committee to fully investigate the idea, presented a detailed report with recommendations to interested collegiate institutions, and constructed a workshop to outline proposals.

After selecting a proposal and adopting a program, seven institutions (Delaware State College, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, North Carolina A&T State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State College) agreed to become the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Their major objective was to establish, organize and supervise an intercollegiate athletic program among a compact group of education institutions of high academic standards with a sound philosophy of co-curricular activities. The conference agreed to seek Division I status for its sports.

The conference was confirmed in 1970, kicking off its first season of competition in football in 1971.

In 1978, the MEAC reached a milestone when it selected Kenneth A. Free to be its first full-time commissioner. Free served the conference for 18 years before stepping down in May 1996. In July 1996, Charles S. Harris was named commissioner, and he served in that capacity until April 2002. On Sept. 1, 2002, Dr. Dennis E. Thomas was named commissioner and has served in the position for 18 years.

The conference's first expansion occurred in October 1979, when Bethune-Cookman College and Florida A&M University were voted into the MEAC as new members. Original members Morgan State, North Carolina Central and Maryland Eastern Shore withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1979-80 fiscal year; Maryland Eastern Shore was readmitted in 1981 and Morgan State returned in 1984. Florida A&M opted to resign in 1984, but rejoined the conference in 1986. Coppin State College was granted admittance in 1985, becoming the ninth member institution.

The MEAC expanded again in the 1990s with the inclusion of Hampton University (1995) and Norfolk State University (1997). The conference grew once again in 2007, adding Winston-Salem State University. Winston-Salem State, a MEAC provisional member, did not meet the qualifications for Division I and withdrew from the conference following the 2009-10 academic and athletic season.

On July 1, 2010, the MEAC made its most recent expansion with the admittance of North Carolina Central and Savannah State University. On Sept. 10, 2014, the MEAC admitted Augusta University (formerly Georgia Regents University) as an associate member for men's golf. In June 2018, the MEAC added Alabama Birmingham (UAB) and Monmouth as associate members for women's bowling, effective for the 2018-19 academic year.

As of July 1, 2018, Hampton was no longer a member of the MEAC. Savannah State followed suit one year later, opting to return to the Div. II ranks.

As of July 1, 2021, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and North Carolina A&T State are no longer members of the MEAC, though North Carolina A&T State does hold associate membership with the conference for the sport of women's bowling.

Augusta University, associate member for men's golf, also left the conference as of July 1, 2021.

On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the NCAA; prior to that year, the conference had operated on the Division II level. The month after achieving Div. I status, the MEAC received automatic qualification to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship. Currently, the conference has automatic qualifying bids for NCAA postseason play in baseball (since 1994), men's basketball (since 1981), women's basketball (since 1982), men's golf (since 2014), softball (since 1995), men's and women's tennis (since 1998), volleyball (since 1994) and women's bowling (since 2018).

The MEAC declares champions in eight men's sports – baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field and tennis – and eight women's sports – basketball, bowling, cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, softball, tennis and volleyball.

The MEAC initiated cross country in 1980, and North Carolina A&T State earned the inaugural men's crown. The first women's cross country championship took place a year later, with Howard winning the first of its seven titles. Indoor track & field was also added in 1981, with South Carolina State winning the men's title and Howard taking the women's crown.

Tennis returned as MEAC-sponsored sports in 1981 after a five-year hiatus. South Carolina State won all seven of the conference's golf championships from 1972-83 before the sport was discontinued following the 1983 championship.

In wrestling, Morgan State won 13 of 24 conference championships before the sport was discontinued in 1995.

Baseball, which began in 1972, was discontinued following the 1977 season. It was brought back as a MEAC-governed sport, along with the addition of women's volleyball, in 1983. Women's softball became a MEAC-sanctioned sport in 1992.

Bowling was officially sanctioned as a MEAC sport in 1999. The MEAC was the first conference to secure NCAA sanctioning for women's bowling by adopting the club sport prior to the 1996-97 school year.

Men's golf returned as a MEAC-sponsored sport in 2014, with six teams participating in the conference championship. Bethune-Cookman was crowned the 2014 champion; the Wildcats also won the 2014 PGA Minority Collegiate Championship. Associate member Augusta University earned its first MEAC golf title in 2015, the institution's first year of conference competition, before repeating in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.

### SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS

The MEAC has enjoyed tremendous athletic success over the years. In 2008, Maryland Eastern Shore defeated Arkansas State 4-2 to win the NCAA Women's Bowling National Championship, a first for both the conference and the institution. With the victory, Lady Hawks head coach Sharon Brummell became the first female head coach to win an NCAA bowling title. The Lady Hawks repeated the feat in 2011, winning the school's second NCAA bowling title; during that same season, Maryland Eastern Shore won the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Intercollegiate Team Championship (ITC), becoming the first team to win two national championships in the same year.

In 2012, Maryland Eastern Shore captured its third NCAA bowling championship in five years with a 4-2 win over Fairleigh Dickinson. The Lady Hawks became the second team in NCAA bowling history to win three championships and the first to make four appearances in the championship finale.

In men's basketball, Maryland Eastern Shore became the first historically black college/university (HBCU) to participate in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT), doing so in 1974. The Hawks defeated Manhattan 84-81 in the first round before falling to Jacksonville in the second round. Before the Jacksonville loss, the Hawks had the nation's best record at 27-1. That same year, Morgan State won the NCAA College Division II National Championship and junior center Marvin "The Human Eraser" Webster was named the Division II Player of the Year.

Howard became the first MEAC school to play in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championships in 1981, taking on Wyoming in the first round.

Coppin State, Hampton and Norfolk State have each made history in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament with first-round victories. Coppin State, the No. 15 seed, defeated No. 2 seed South Carolina in 1997, before Hampton repeated the No. 15-over-No. 2 upset feat in 2001 against Iowa State. Both victories have been ranked among ESPN SportsCenter's top 10 greatest tournament upsets. In 2012, Norfolk State became the fifth team in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament history (and the third MEAC team) to upset a No. 2 seed; the Spartans upended Missouri in the round of 64 that year.

Of the eight instances in which a No. 15 seed has defeated a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the MEAC boasts three of them.

Norfolk State shined on the national postseason stage again in 2019; after the Spartans won the men's basketball regular-season title, they earned an automatic bid to the NIT – where, as a No. 8 seed, they upset top seed Alabama on the Crimson Tide's home floor, 80-79 in overtime. Norfolk State became the fourth MEAC school to win an NIT game (UMES 1974, Coppin State 1995, Delaware State 2006).

In women's basketball, South Carolina State won the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) Division II National Championship in 1979. In 1982, Howard became the first MEAC school to play in the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament. In 1983, South Carolina State won the MEAC's automatic NCAA bid and became the first conference team, male or female, to win an opening-round game in the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament.

In 2010, North Carolina A&T State defeated Wake Forest and Charlotte before falling to Miami in the third round of the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT). The Lady Aggies became the first MEAC team – and first HBCU – to win two consecutive basketball games in a national postseason tournament.

In football, the MEAC was instrumental in constructing the Celebration Bowl, the Freedom Bowl All-Star Classic, the Heritage Bowl and the Gold Bowl. Prior to Division I competition, the MEAC competed in the Gold Bowl, held in Richmond, Va., which matched the MEAC champion against the champion of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). South Carolina State represented the MEAC in 1976 and 1979, winning both outings over Winston-Salem State and Norfolk State, respectively. In addition to the 1976 and 1979 crowns, South Carolina State won MEAC football titles in 1974-78, 1980-83, 1994, 2004, 2008, 2009. The Bulldogs were also named co-champions along with Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M in 2010, before sharing the 2013 title with Bethune-Cookman, the 2014 title with four other teams and the 2019 title with North Carolina A&T State. During the 1981 and 1982 seasons, South Carolina State reached the second round of the NCAA Div. I-AA championships.

In 2015, the MEAC combined with the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, Ga. North Carolina A&T State defeated Alcorn State in the inaugural Celebration Bowl to determine the Black College National Champion in a game pitting the MEAC and SWAC champions. North Carolina Central represented the MEAC in the 2016 Celebration Bowl, taking on Grambling State.

North Carolina A&T State returned to the Celebration Bowl in 2017, defeating Grambling State 21-14 to complete the first undefeated season in MEAC history and claim the Aggies' second Black College National Championship in three years. North Carolina A&T State repeated in 2018, defeating Alcorn State 24-22. NCAT defeated Alcorn State again in 2019 for the Aggies' fourth Celebration Bowl win in the game's five years of existence.

The MEAC also has a strong presence in the National Football League (NFL), both throughout the league's history and today. For the start of the 2020 season, there were 12 former MEAC players on active NFL rosters – highlighted by North Carolina A&T State's Tarik Cohen and South Carolina State's Darius Leonard.

Leonard, a two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, was taken in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts; that same season, he was named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year after leading the league in total tackles. He was also named First Team All-Pro that season, and in 2019, Leonard was named to the Pro Bowl.

Cohen, who was named an FCS All-American and was a three-time MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, went in the fourth round of the NFL Draft to the Chicago Bears in 2017. He was named to the Pro Bowl in his second season in the league in 2018.

In 2003, Florida A&M became the first MEAC school to win a volleyball match in the NCAA Championships with a first-round victory over Winthrop. In 2004, the Lady Rattlers

became the first HBCU to rank in the Top 25 of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) national poll, coming in at No. 22.

In outdoor track & field, the North Carolina Central men won the first three MEAC titles. In addition, the quartet of Melvin Bassett, Robert Ouko, Julius Sang and Larry Black set the world record in the sprint medley relay with a time of 38.19 in the 1972 Olympics. In addition, the Eagles finished fourth in the 1974 NCAA Division I Men's Outdoor Track & Field Championship. Women began outdoor track & field competition in the MEAC in 1980 – and in 1982, South Carolina State won the AIAW Division II Outdoor Track & Field National Championship.

In 2021, North Carolina A&T State became the first HBCU to finish in the top three of the team standings at the NCAA Div. I Outdoor Track & Field Championships, finishing third in the men's team standings. The Aggies won two national titles at the meet, with Randolph Ross winning the 400 meters and the 4x400-meter relay team winning gold (to go along with the gold medal they won earlier that year in the NCAA indoor meet). On the women's side, Cambrea Sturgis gave the MEAC two more national titles, winning NCAA crowns in the 100 and 200 meters.

The MEAC has showcased over 35 athletes in the Olympics over the years, and 13 of them have earned medals during the Summer Games.

At No. 72, South Carolina State became the first MEAC women's tennis team to finish the season ranked in the 2005 Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Division I final poll. In 2012, South Carolina State's Maria Craciun became the first tennis player in school and MEAC history to receive a berth to the NCAA Individual Singles Championship.

In Augusta's seven seasons as an associate member for men's golf, the Jaguars won the conference championship in five of those years. In 2018, Augusta not only won the MEAC title and made it to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, but senior Broc Everett wrapped up his collegiate career by winning the NCAA individual national championship, defeating Auburn's Brandon Mancheno in a playoff.

In softball, Bethune-Cookman earned the MEAC's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Softball Championship in 2005. The Lady Wildcats defeated Florida, Central Florida and South Florida in the Florida Regional to become the first MEAC program to win an NCAA Division I Softball Regional. Bethune-Cookman ended the 2005 season with the conference's first-ever national ranking, reaching No. 18 in the season's final NFCA/USA Today Coaches poll and No. 23 in the USA Softball/ESPN.com poll.

Florida A&M was the first MEAC baseball team to advance to NCAA postseason play in 1994. The Rattlers took on Southeastern Louisiana in a best-of-three play-in series, falling 11-10 and 8-7 in two games. During the 2002 season, Bethune-Cookman advanced to the Gainesville Regional and became the first MEAC team to win a game in the NCAA Tournament with a 7-4 victory over Florida International. In 2017, the Wildcats became the first MEAC school to advance to a regional final, winning three games in the Gainesville Regional – including a 6-2 win over national No. 3 seed Florida.

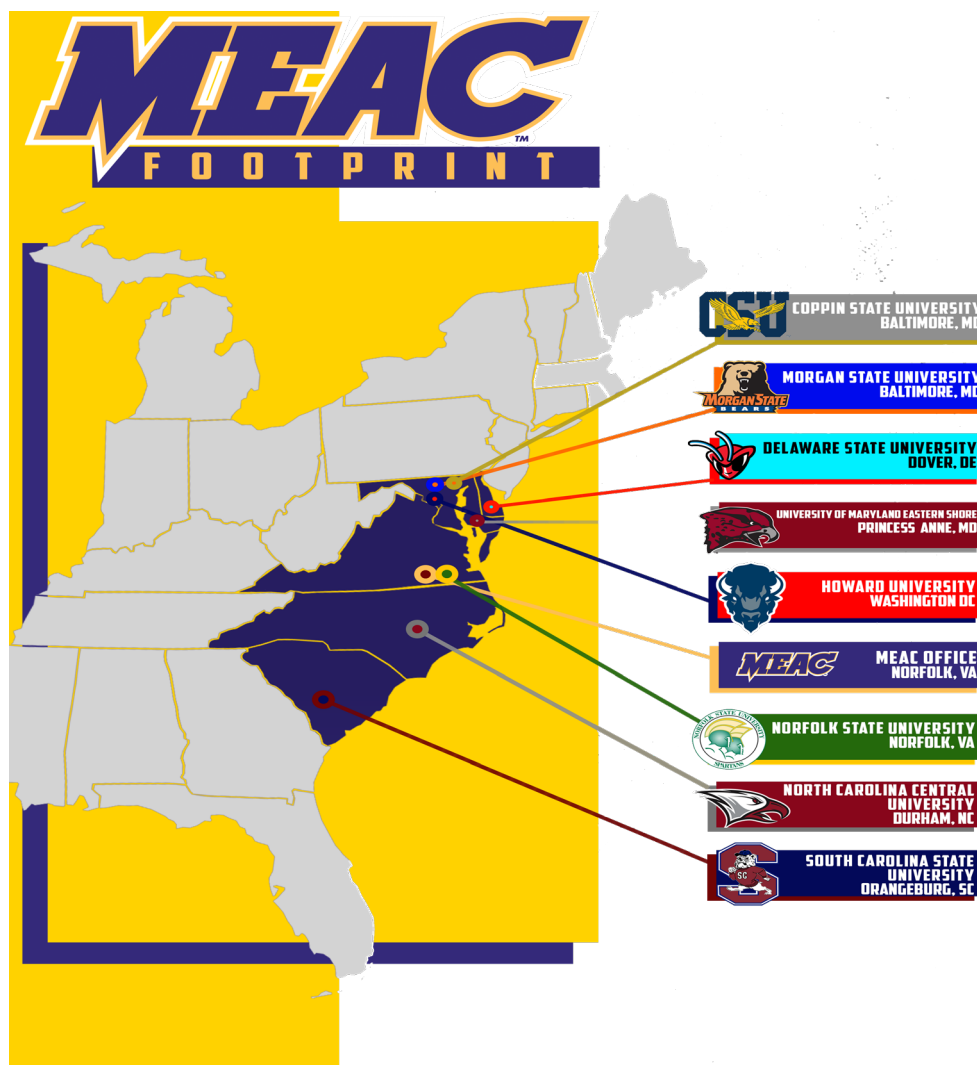

## 2020-21 YEAR IN REVIEW

*The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) celebrated its 50th anniversary during the 2020-21 academic year, reliving its golden past and looking forward to a glorious future. But the year was also unlike any other, as the MEAC's 11 member institutions continued to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Bethune-Cookman and Maryland Eastern Shore opted out of competition for the entirety of 2020-21, and the MEAC did not hold championships in for cross country, football or indoor track & field, but there was still plenty of action and outstanding performances on the fields, courts and tracks.*

### North Carolina A&T State Sweeps All-Sports Awards

North Carolina A&T State swept the Talmadge Layman Hill Men's and Mary McLeod Bethune Women's All-Sports Awards for 2020-21. It marked the second straight year in which the awards were given that NCAT swept both trophies.

No all-sports awards were handed out in 2019-20.

On the men's side, the Aggies racked up 63 points, thanks to the regular-season division championship in basketball and the outdoor track & field championship, as well as runner-up finishes in tennis and golf.

For the women, North Carolina A&T State totaled 80 points after grabbing regular-season division titles in women's basketball, bowling, volleyball and softball, while also winning the outdoor track & field championship. Overall, the Aggies also won tournament crowns in women's basketball, bowling and volleyball.

### Men's Indoor Track & Field

Even though the MEAC didn't hold an indoor track & field championship meet in 2020-21 because of how many programs opted out of the indoor season, North Carolina A&T State competed and excelled – all the way to the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. The Aggie quartet of Daniel Stokes, Elijah Young, Trevor Stewart and Randolph Ross won the NCAA championship in the men's 4x400-meter relay with the fifth-fastest time in NCAA history, a 3:03.16. It was the first national title for the Aggie men, and the first for a MEAC program since 2018, when North Carolina A&T State's Kayla White (women's 200 meters) and South Carolina State's Tyrell Richard (men's 400 meters) won NCAA titles.

### Men's Basketball

The 2020-21 MEAC basketball season saw division play in an effort to reduce travel and missed class time in light of the pandemic. Coppin State and Norfolk State split the Northern Division regular-season crown, while North Carolina A&T State was the Southern Division champion. Brothers Anthony and Nendah Tarke of Coppin State swept the MEAC's regular-season player awards; Anthony was named both Player and Defensive Player of the Year (the first to win both awards since Norfolk State's Kyle O'Quinn in 2011-12) and Nendah was named Rookie of the Year. Florida A&M's Robert McCullum was named MEAC Coach of the Year. Norfolk State won the 2021 Air Force Reserve MEAC Basketball Tournament at the Norfolk Scope Arena with a 71-63 win over Morgan State. Joe Bryant, Jr. was the tournament's Outstanding Performer, while Robert Jones was named Outstanding Coach. It was the Spartans' first MEAC Tournament title since 2012, and they went on to the NCAA First Four, where they took on – and defeated – Appalachian State before falling to top overall seed Gonzaga. It marked Norfolk State's second-ever NCAA Tournament victory, following the program's 2012 upset of No. 2 seed Missouri.

### Women's Basketball

Howard and North Carolina A&T State were the respective division winners for MEAC women's basketball in 2020-21; the Bison claimed the Northern Division title after going 10-2 in conference play, while the Aggies' 9-1 mark in the Southern Division locked up the regular-season crown and the corresponding top seed in the 2021 Air Force Reserve MEAC Basketball Tournament. Howard's Jayla Thornton, the MEAC's all-time leading career 3-point shooter, was named MEAC Player of the Year, while teammate Anzhane' Hutton took home Rookie of the Year honors and Ty Grace was named Coach of the Year. North Carolina Central's Anissa Rivera was named Defensive Player of the Year. The two top seeds met in the championship game of the tournament at the Norfolk Scope Arena, with the Aggies prevailing 59-57 thanks to a 3-pointer from Deja Winters with three seconds remaining. North Carolina A&T State won its third MEAC title in the last six years; Jayla Jones-Pack was named Outstanding Performer and Tarrell Robinson earned Outstanding Coach honors. The Aggies faced N.C. State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

### Bowling

North Carolina A&T State won the regular-season title thanks to a 7-1 mark in the MEAC's regular-season meet in Greensboro, N.C. The Aggies won six tournaments during the regular season and finished no worse than third in the Music City Classic. North Carolina A&T State's Cameron Strombeck was named MEAC Bowler of the Year after being named the Preseason Bowler of the Year before the season started, while Kim Terrell-Kearney earned Coach of the Year honors. Delaware State's Alyssa Breidegam was named Rookie of the Year. The Aggies were the top seed in the MEAC Bowling Championship, and they came from behind to defeat associate member Monmouth 4-2 in the championship match. Melanie Katen was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer, and Terrell-Kearney was named Outstanding Coach. North Carolina A&T State and Delaware State both advanced to the NCAA Bowling Championship, with the Hornets earning an at-large bid, and the Aggies also competed in the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Intercollegiate Team Championship, finishing runner-up. In the USBC's Individual Singles Championship, North Carolina A&T State's Ana Olaya was a semifinalist and Delaware State's Katie Robb won the national championship, becoming the first Hornet to do so.

### Volleyball

With the 2020 volleyball season pushed to the spring because of COVID-19, teams competing found themselves focusing primarily on conference play and jockeying for position in a smaller postseason tournament field. Coppin State and North Carolina A&T State won their respective divisions; the Eagles won the Northern Division for the first time in program history, while the Aggies went a perfect 8-0 to claim the Southern Division. North Carolina A&T State's Edie Brewer earned MEAC Player of the Year honors for the second straight season, while Coppin State boasted the Rookie of the Year (Chudear Tut), Setter of the Year (Kareemah Hopkins), Defensive Player of the Year (Ashley Roman) and Coach of the Year (Tim Walsh). With Norfolk State hosting the MEAC Volleyball Championship, Coppin State, Delaware State, North Carolina A&T State and North Carolina Central made up the tournament field. The top seeds advanced to the championship match, where the Aggies defeated Coppin State in four sets for their first-ever MEAC volleyball title. Brewer was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer, while Hal Clifton earned Outstanding Coach honors. North Carolina A&T State advanced to the NCAA Volleyball Championship in Omaha, Neb., where they faced nationally-ranked Penn State in the second round after COVID protocols knocked out their first-round match-up against Rice.

## 2020-21 YEAR IN REVIEW



### Men's Golf

The 2021 MEAC Men's Golf Championship shifted venues, heading to Bryan Park Golf Club in Greensboro, N.C. Five-time defending champion and men's golf associate member Augusta University was not able to compete due to COVID protocols, opening the tournament to the other four teams in the field – Florida A&M, first-year program Howard, North Carolina A&T State and North Carolina Central. The Rattlers took advantage of the opportunity in front of them, winning the tournament by 19 strokes for their first-ever MEAC title in the sport. Ethan Mangum was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer after winning the individual title – a strong performance that included him shooting under par in the first round, making him the only player in the field to do so. Mike Rice was named the tournament's Outstanding Coach, leading the Rattlers to three of the top four positions on the leaderboard. Florida A&M, which also finished third in the PGA WORKS Collegiate in May, advanced to compete in the NCAA regional tournament in Tallahassee, Fla., hosted by Florida State.

### Men's Tennis

Norfolk State and South Carolina State were the class of the MEAC field in men's tennis this past season, with both teams going undefeated in conference play to win the Northern and Southern Divisions, respectively. The Spartans' Andres Alcaraz was named MEAC Player of the Year, while North Carolina Central's Stipan Madzar earned Rookie of the Year honors. Norfolk State's Larry Holmes and South Carolina State's Hardeep Judge split Coach of the Year honors, and the two coaches ended up squaring off for the MEAC tournament title, as the Spartans and Bulldogs advanced to the championship match at Old Dominion's Folkes-Stevens Tennis Center. South Carolina State defeated Norfolk State 4-0 for the title, the program's 16th title overall and 13th in the last 16 years. The Bulldogs' Elyes Marouani was named Outstanding Performer after earning the clinching point, and Judge was named Outstanding Coach. The Bulldogs made yet another NCAA appearance, going up against Wake Forest in the first round.

### Women's Tennis

Norfolk State and South Carolina State both went undefeated in the regular season to claim their respective division regular-season titles and corresponding No. 1 seeds in the MEAC Tennis Championships. South Carolina State's Rachida Berjane was named MEAC Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year, becoming the first player to win both awards in the same season since Bethune-Cookman's Mina Matsuba in 2014. Larry Holmes of Norfolk State was named Coach of the Year after leading the Spartans to the Northern Division title in his first season at the helm. South Carolina State squared off against Florida A&M in the championship match of the conference tournament, winning 4-0 for their 15th overall title and the 14th in their last 16 years. Lasya Patnaik was named Outstanding Performer and Judge was again named the tournament's Outstanding Coach. The Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA Women's Tennis Championship, taking on top overall seed North Carolina in the first round.

### Men's Outdoor Track & Field

With nine of the MEAC's 11 member institutions competing, North Carolina A&T State dominated its way to a fourth straight MEAC outdoor championship with a meet-record 288 points at Irwin Belk Track. Norfolk State was second with 174 points while Morgan State, Delaware State and Howard rounded out the top five in the team standings. The Aggies won every race on Saturday's round of finals, and Javonte Harding was named the meet's Outstanding Runner after winning the 100 meters, 200 meters and having a hand in winning gold in both the 4x100- and 4x400-meter relays. Morgan State's John Purvis was named the meet's Outstanding Field Performer and Duane Ross was the Outstanding Coach.

### Women's Outdoor Track & Field

Eight of the MEAC's 11 member institutions converged on Irwin Belk Track in Greensboro, N.C., and North Carolina A&T State took advantage of the de facto home meet to win their third outdoor title in the last four years. Norfolk State was second with 144 points, and the rest of the top five comprised of Howard, Morgan State and Delaware State. The Aggies racked up a meet-record 290 points to win the title, dominating championship Saturday to the tune of winning all but three races on the day and sweeping the podium in the 800 meters and 100-meter hurdles. The Aggies' G'Jasymne Butler, who won the 3,000-meter steeplechase and 800 meters, was named Outstanding Runner, while teammate Loren James earned Outstanding Field Performer honors and Duane Ross was again named Outstanding Coach.

### Softball

Softball was one of several sports to see a smaller postseason tournament field this past season, with teams fighting for four spots instead of eight. Morgan State and North Carolina A&T State were the regular-season champions in the Northern and Southern Divisions, respectively, and the tournament field consisted of Morgan State, tournament host Norfolk State, North Carolina A&T State and North Carolina Central. Howard's Camille Navarro was named MEAC Player of the Year, with teammate Kiana Carr earning Pitcher of the Year honors. North Carolina A&T State's Kendall Macauley was named Rookie of the Year and Norfolk State's James Inzana was named Coach of the Year. The Bears and Eagles met in the championship game, with Morgan State coming from behind to win the game 10-5 and claim its first-ever MEAC softball title. Stephanie Rundlett of Morgan State, who won all three tournament games in the circle, was named Outstanding Performer, and Larry Hine-line was named Outstanding Coach. The Bears advanced to the NCAA Softball Championship, going to the Norman Regional to face top overall seed Oklahoma and Texas A&M.

### Baseball

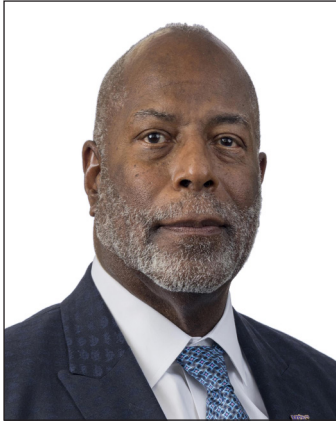
Six of the MEAC's eight baseball-playing institutions took to the diamond in 2021, with four spots in the postseason tournament on the line. Norfolk State and North Carolina Central won the Northern and Southern Divisions, respectively, and were the top seeds in the double-elimination tournament at Norfolk State's Marty L. Miller Field. Norfolk State two-way player Danny Hosley was named MEAC Player of the Year, while North Carolina Central earned Rookie of the Year (Chet Sikes), Pitcher of the Year (Ryan Miller) and Coach of the Year (Jim Koerner) honors. The Spartans and Eagles met in a championship game for the ages; North Carolina Central led 4-2 after seven innings, but Norfolk State scored in the eighth and ninth innings to force extras. Then, with the bases loaded in the 11th inning, Alsander Womack hit a walkoff single to center that gave Norfolk State its first-ever MEAC baseball championship. Womack was named the tournament's Outstanding Performer and Keith Shumate was named Outstanding Coach. Norfolk State earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Baseball Championship and competed in the Greenville Regional, taking on No. 13 national seed East Carolina and Maryland.

## COMMISSIONER DENNIS E. THOMAS



Dr. Dennis E. Thomas enters his 20th year as Commissioner of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) on Sept. 1, 2021, spearheading a period of two decades that has seen the conference remain financially stable, strengthen institutional compliance and improve student-athlete graduation rates. In the process, he has gained the distinction as one of leading collegiate athletics administrators in America.

Being progressive, Commissioner Thomas has still been able to give fans an avenue for wholesome sports participation by inking a deal with GYO Score to create the conference's Esports Community.

In 2010, Commissioner Thomas realized one of his goals with the purchasing of the conference's first office complex. The official headquarters, located in Norfolk, Va., marks the first time an FCS conference has owned its headquartered property without as-

sessing MEAC institutions. A revolutionary, one year later, Commissioner Thomas accomplished another first as he led the MEAC to become the first NCAA Division I FCS conference to institute instant replay during its televised regular-season football games, a feat that was accomplished in 2011.

Thomas' mission to increase the conference's corporate resources has led to multi-year partnerships with Cricket Wireless, Russell Athletic Corporation, Coca-Cola, State Farm Insurance, Nike, Wells Fargo, ESPN, Jostens, United States Marines, Home Depot, Geico, Colgate Palmolive, Delta Airlines and the National Football League (NFL). Commissioner Thomas was instrumental in forging a partnership with the NFL to improve officiating and provide access for MEAC officials to advance to the next level. In May 2016, Commissioner Thomas also helped broker an off-the-field partnership between the NFL and the MEAC to boost opportunities for non-playing careers in professional football.

In 2017, the MEAC partnered with Collegiate Sports Management Group (CSMG), entering into a multi-year agreement in an effort to increase the conference's corporate partnerships and branding. The relationship focuses on marketing and sponsorship rights, as well as helping to develop more national strategies across all avenues to assist with generating revenue for the conference and MEAC institutions.

Under Commissioner Thomas' leadership and financial awareness, MEAC member institutions have received end-of-the-year financial distributions for 19 consecutive years.

In 2004, Commissioner Thomas recommended to ESPN the development of the Celebration Bowl, pitting the champions of the MEAC and the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) together in a bowl game. The first two editions were played in the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Ga., with the MEAC winning the inaugural contest in 2015 when North Carolina A&T State defeated Alcorn State 41-34. Beginning in 2017, the Celebration Bowl shifted venues, as the new Mercedes-Benz Stadium opened in downtown Atlanta.

Committed to equal opportunities, Commissioner Thomas has bolstered the conference's television footprint when it comes to the Olympic sports. In February 2017, the conference broadcast the MEAC Indoor Track & Field Championships, for the first time ever, on ESPN3. ESPN3 also broadcast the league's Bowling Championship and Outdoor Track & Field Championship for the first time in 2018. In addition, the conference's Volleyball Championship final has been broadcast on ESPNU every year since 2014; that initial broadcast marked the first time in the conference's history that the volleyball championship had been televised.

During his tenure, Commissioner Thomas has been a proponent of MEAC student-athletes being strong on the field as well as in the classroom. His vision to reward academic excellence was implemented with the start of the Highest Graduation Award for member institutions with the best graduation rate for the academic year. The institution that achieves that honor is awarded \$25,000.

In 2006, Commissioner Thomas implemented the MEAC Woman of the Year honor. The award celebrates the achievements of female senior student-athletes who have excelled in academics, athletics, community service and leadership. In 2012, the MEAC introduced and recognized the MEAC Man of the Year award in conjunction with the women's top honor.

The 2019-20 academic year saw Thomas inducted into the Black College Football Hall of Fame, and he was also named to the Board of Directors for the National Football Foundation (NFF).

Commissioner Thomas has brought a wealth of collegiate administrative and higher education experience to the MEAC. Prior to becoming Commissioner, he served as Director of Athletics at Hampton University in Hampton, Va. In his 12 years of service, Hampton excelled on and off the field of competition. In addition to guiding Hampton from the NCAA Division II level to Division I, he demonstrated a strong commitment to student-athletes during his tenure by developing the Athletic Academic Support unit to increase graduation rates.

Under Commissioner Thomas' leadership, Hampton won 17 Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) Division II championships between 1990 and 1995 and 11 MEAC championships between 1996 and 2002. Hampton was awarded the MEAC's top honors with the 1999 Talmadge L. Hill All-Sports Award and the 2002 Mary McLeod Bethune Women's All-Sports Award, symbolizing the overall strength of the athletics program.

Commissioner Thomas' term at Hampton also marked the Pirates men's basketball team's remarkable win over Iowa State University, 58-57, in the first round of the 2001 NCAA Tournament. The historic win was accentuated when the Pirates returned to the NCAA Tournament the following year. No other No. 15 seed winner had returned to the tournament in consecutive years after accomplishing the feat.

Commissioner Thomas served as the head football coach at South Carolina State University from 1986-88, where he compiled a record of 15-18.

Commissioner Thomas' leadership and managerial skills among national organizations has not gone unnoticed. He was awarded the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) Athletics Director of the Year Award for the Southeast Region (I-AA/AAA) in 2002. In 2001, he served as Chair of the NCAA Division I-AA (now FCS) Football Committee. He also served on the NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee and is a former member of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Board of Directors.

Commissioner Thomas has served as a member of the NCAA Division I Leadership Council and the NCAA I-FCS Governance Committee, and he was a member and chair of the NCAA Division I Committee on Infractions and the NLI Policy and Review Committee. He has also served as the chair of the NCAA Division I-AA (FCS) Commissioners Association and he served on the NACDA Executive Committee and the Walter Byers Scholarship Committee.

Commissioner Thomas was inducted into Hampton University's inaugural Athletics Hall of Fame Class in 2009. He has also been enshrined into the Alcorn State University (Miss.) Hall of Fame (2010), the Southwestern Athletic Conference Hall of Fame (2003) and the Black College Football Hall of Fame (2020).

A native of Heidelberg, Miss., Commissioner Thomas was a four-year letterman in football and track and field in high school, and at the age of 16, he embarked upon a collegiate career that is still in the SWAC's record books. In 1973, he made history as the first and only offensive lineman to be named the conference's Offensive Player of the Year. He finished his collegiate career as a three-year letterman at Alcorn State, a two-time Pittsburgh Courier First Team All-American (1972-73), First Team Black Mutual Sports Network All-American (1973) and the Outstanding College Athlete of America (1974).

While at Alcorn State, Commissioner Thomas coached and played under the legendary coach Marino "The Godfather" Casem. During his playing and coaching tenure at Alcorn State, the Braves won SWAC football championships in 1970 as a player and 1976, 1979 and 1984 as an assistant coach.

In 1978, the state legislature in Mississippi proclaimed April 8 as the "Dennis and Johnny Day" in the state, recognizing Commissioner Thomas and his brother for their achievements in scholarship, athletics and leadership.

Commissioner Thomas earned his Bachelor's degree from Alcorn State University. He later earned his Master's from the University of Louisiana at Monroe and his doctorate degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo.

Commissioner Thomas is a proud lifetime member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.

## PRESEASON AWARDS/HONORS

Coppin State junior libero/defensive specialist Ashley Roman was selected as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Volleyball Preseason Player of the Year, presented by TowneBank, the conference announced. The Eagles were also selected as the preseason favorite to win the conference.

All awards were voted on by the conference's head coaches and sports information directors.

Roman, the 2020 MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, was key in Coppin State winning the Northern Division regular-season title and advancing to the title match of the MEAC Volleyball Championship this past season. She led the conference and ranked 19th nationally in digs with 5.54 per set.

In conference play, that average was 5.31 per set.

Roman had 32 digs twice this past season, matching the program record for most digs in a single match, and she recorded at least 20 digs in 10 of the Eagles' 16 matches.

A First Team All-MEAC selection in 2020, Roman was also recognized by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA), which named her All-East Region Honorable Mention.

Coppin State, which at 11-5 notched its first-ever winning season in 2020 and made its first MEAC title match appearance since 2013, was chosen as the preseason favorite with eight first-place votes and 115 points.

Howard (three first-place votes, 100 points) was picked to finish second, while Delaware State, with 99 points and one first-place vote, was picked to finish third. Morgan State and Maryland Eastern Shore were tied for fourth with one first-place vote and 72 points each, with North Carolina Central (one first-place vote, 59 points) coming in sixth.

Norfolk State and South Carolina State rounded out the predicted order of finish.

Joining Roman on the Preseason All-MEAC team were fellow Eagles Miajavon Coleman and Kareemah Hopkins, Delaware State's Sydney Lewis and Valeria Otero, Howard's Tamar Wells and North Carolina Central's Ammaarah Williams.

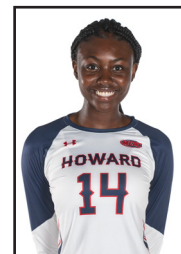

### HEAD COACH TIM WALSH



Tim Walsh enters his fifth season at the helm of the Coppin State volleyball program in 2021 and is the winningest coach in Eagles' history. In just four seasons at Coppin, Walsh, the 2020 MEAC Coach of the Year, has won 40 matches while guiding four MEAC major award winners, nine All-Conference selections and the program's first AVCA All-Region recipient.

This past season, one of the most challenging in NCAA history due to CoVID-19, Walsh led the Eagles to its first-ever winning season and Northern Division Championship due to a program-record ten-match winning streak and nine conference victories. Before falling in just their second trip to the

MEAC Championship match, the Eagles placed a league-high five players on All-Conference Teams with Ashley Roman, an AVCA All-Region selection and the MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, as well as Miajavon Coleman earning First Team recognition.

Paola Caten, along with Kareemah Hopkins and Chudear Tut, who earned MEAC Setter of the Year and Rookie of the Year, respectively, were all named to the Second Team.

Following the historic 2020-21 campaign, Walsh's Eagles swept the school's major Departmental awards as Salma Gonzalez highlighted the ceremony by being named the President's Eagle Award recipient. Roman was named the CSU Athlete of the Year, Tut the school's Newcomer of the Year, and Rebekka Hauri, the Department's Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Walsh arrived on campus just before the start of the 2017 season and guided the Eagles to a 4-26 mark in which all four victories came in conference play. Despite the quick turnaround, Walsh tutored five players to Academic All-MEAC accolades and graduating senior Glorines Rosado set school and personal-best marks in digs and service aces.

The Eagles made a big turnaround in 2018 with 12 victories and its first trip to the MEAC Tournament since 2015 as Walsh guided the youngest team in the Nation with 11 freshmen. Miajavon Coleman was named the MEAC Rookie of the Year while earning All-Conference accolades while her classmate Brianna Lang set a school-record with 62 assists against NC Central. Lang joined Coleman on the MEAC All-Rookie Team with one of the team's highlights was a road victory at UMES.

### HEAD COACH DR. BRUCE ATKINSON



Dr. Bruce Atkinson is in his third year as head coach of the Hornets. He joined the Delaware State University staff on Feb. 11, 2019.

The Hornets' second season under Atkinson's guidance saw the team post an 11-5 overall record and go 7-3 in MEAC play to finish second in the Northern Division and make the MEAC Championship field for the first time since 2010. Delaware State then gave eventual champion North Carolina A&T State fits, falling in a five-set semifinal epic.

Sydney Lewis was a First Team All-MEAC honoree for the 2020 season, while Mayah Ngundam and Valeria Otero

were both named Second Team.

In his first season at DSU, Atkinson led a team that featured 11 freshmen and just one senior to the most wins by the program in nine years. The Hornets' 12 wins in 2019 (12-18) were the most by the team since posting an

18-12 mark in 2010. Delaware State posted just 12 wins combined in the previous six seasons.

Delaware State's seven MEAC wins last season were also the most by the team since tallying eight (8-2) in 2010. In addition, DSU had a three-game win streak, its longest in nine years, in 2019.

Among the other highlights of Atkinson's first season with the Hornets was the eclipsing of a string of 15 consecutive losses to Morgan State, the eventual 2019 MEAC Tournament runner-up. DSU's 3-2 victory was its first against the Bears since a 3-1 triumph in 2011.

The Hornets also posted non-conference Division I victories over Texas Southern, Siena, Fairleigh Dickinson and Hampton in 2019.

Also, three players, each a freshman, were named to the MEAC All-Rookie Team in Atkinson's first year with the team.

Lewis, along with outside hitters Anadys Chemelis Valentin (Vega Baja, P.R.) and Jordan Vang (Ontario, Canada) are among the seven all-rookie team honorees.

### HEAD COACH SHAUN KUPFERBERG



In 2012, Shaun Kupferberg was named Howard University women's volleyball head coach. In nine seasons, he has turned the Bison program into one of the conference's elite.

Kupferberg and the Bison went from winning one game and missing the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Tournament in 2012 to winning the conference five consecutive years (2015-19). During that span, Kupferberg, three-time MEAC Coach of the Year ('14, '16, '18), has led Howard to five 20-win seasons, at least a share of the MEAC Northern Division title in five of the last seven years (2014-16, '18-19), over two dozen All-MEAC and MEAC All-Academic honors and five

straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2015-19).

Prior to Kupferberg's appointment at HU, the Miami University (Ohio) graduate was the head women's volleyball coach at Jacksonville University in Jacksonville, Fla., for five seasons (2006-11). During his tenure there, he

led the squad to four consecutive winning seasons (2006-09). Kupferberg guided the Dolphins to the title match of the Atlantic Sun conference tournament on two occasions.

In 2008, Kupferberg's team notched a program-best 20-10 record. He followed with a 19-9 mark the following year. In the process, eight of his student-athletes were named to the all-conference teams.

Equally impressive was Kupferberg's academic leadership. Fifty-two of his student athletes were selected to the academic all-conference team and garnered a team grade point average of 3.5 or higher (on a 4.00 scale).

Prior to his coaching tenure with the Dolphins, Kupferberg spent five seasons at Northwest University in Kirkland, Wash., as the head women's volleyball coach. Over the course of that period, Kupferberg increased the school's winning percentage.

He started his career at Northwest with a record of 12-14 and gradually showed progress, leading the team to a 28-4 mark during his last season there.

### HEAD COACH TREVOR CALLARMAN



Trevor Callarman is in his fourth season as the head volleyball coach at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore. This is his fifth season overall with the program.

The Hawks did not compete in the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the 2019 campaign, the Hawks claimed five victories prior to MEAC play beginning, which included a five set victory at the University of Hartford. Eastern Shore went 7-8 in conference play to finish fourth in the MEAC Northern Division. The highlight of conference play came when the team won three straight from Oct. 27-Nov. 8.

They fell in the MEAC Tournament quarterfinals to the No. 1 seed in the Southern Division, North Carolina A&T State, in four sets. Maryland Eastern Shore finished the season as the NCAA team leader in aces per set at 2.07. The squad was second in the MEAC in hitting percentage and blocks.

Two players earned All-MEAC honors after the season and six players were named to the conference All-Academic team.

In his first season as head coach in 2018, Eastern Shore battled through a challenging preseason with several Power 5 conference opponents and NCAA qualifiers to earn 10 victories. The Hawks went 7-3 in the MEAC to finish second in the Northern Division. One of the marquee wins was a victory over the eventual champion Howard on November 4 - the only defeat suffered by the Bison in conference.

As a team, The Shore finished second in the MEAC for aces per set and hitting percentage and fourth in blocks. Four players earned All-MEAC status at the end of the season, and seven earned All-Academic honors. The 2018 team was awarded the highest team GPA for any program at the 2019 Harry's award at the end of the school year.

As an assistant in 2017, Callarman helped guide the Hawks to a 27-9 record in 2017 with a MEAC Northern Division title and an appearance at the National Invitational Volleyball Championship.

Following the 2017 season, he ascended to the interim head coaching position following the departure of Toby Rens for Georgetown University. He became the full-time head coach after a nationwide search in March 2018.

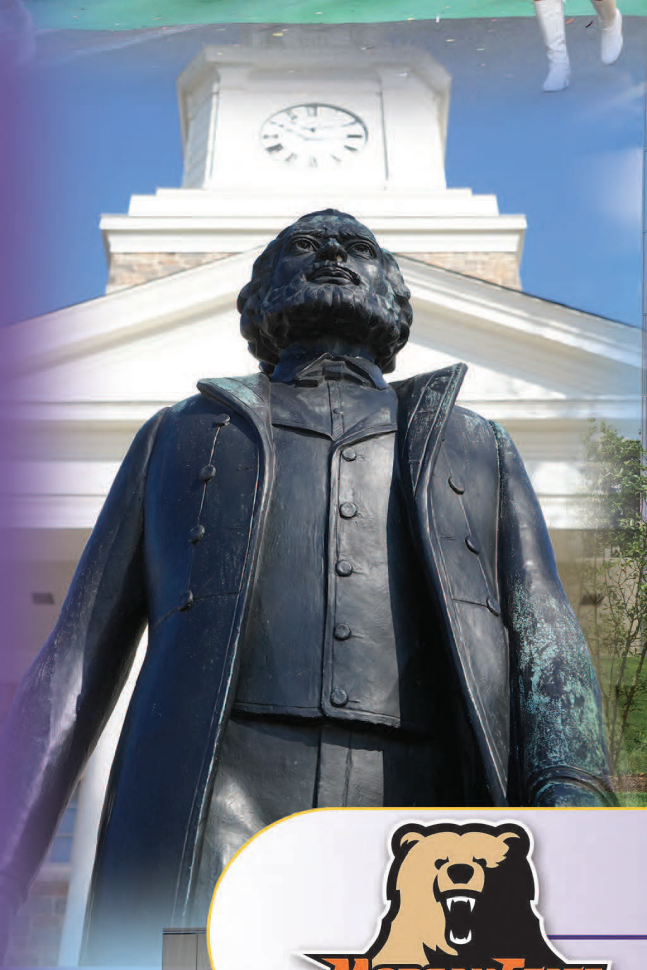

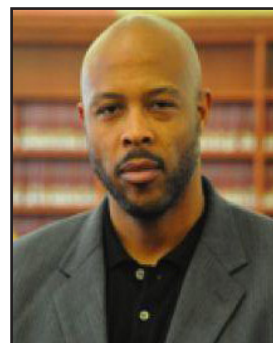

### HEAD COACH RAMONA RILEY-BOZIER



Entering her 34th season at the helm of the Lady Bears' program, head coach Ramona Riley-Bozier has come to define Morgan State volleyball.

Riley-Bozier is easily one of the most decorated coaches in the history of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) and is one of the most accomplished coaches in any sport in the history of Morgan State athletics.

Riley-Bozier, who is also the winningest coach at MSU (476), picked up milestone victory No. 400, following a 3-1 road win at Delaware State on Nov. 3, 2013 and career victory No. 450 on the road last season with a 3-1 defeat of Norfolk State on Sept. 30, 2018.

The 2019 season was one of Riley-Bozier's deepest and most talented teams in quite some time. Despite losing four seniors from 2018, the 2019 Lady Bears' team featured 12 letterwinners – including two seniors, four juniors and six sophomores, including the eventual MEAC Co-Player of the

Year in Zoe McBride.

The Bears advanced to the 2019 MEAC Championship title match, staging a five-set epic against Howard -- a match the Bison ultimately won for their fifth straight MEAC volleyball championship.

Morgan State finished 2018 with a 13-15 overall mark. But once it got in MEAC play, it would be a tale of two halves for the Lady Bears. Morgan State would start out going 4-1 and was sitting in second-place in the league standings at the midway point. However, the squad would go just 1-4 during the second half stretch and fell to fourth in the northern division standings at 5-5, entering the league tournament.

Securing its fifth straight MEAC tournament appearance, Morgan State would face nemesis Florida A&M, the No. 1 seed out of the southern division in the quarterfinal round. The Lady Bears would give the Rattlers all they could handle, as Morgan State won the opening set and held a 2-1 lead after three sets played. But FAMU would hold off the Lady Bears, forcing a fifth set and thus ending their season with a 3-2 loss.

Riley-Bozier entered the 2017 campaign ranked 43rd in career victories (433) on the NCAA list of active coaches. The team would finish 8-18 with a 7-5 MEAC record and reached the MEAC quarterfinal, falling to FAMU in four sets.

### HEAD COACH KATHY BULLOCK



Kathy Bullock heads into her third season leading the Norfolk State volleyball program as head coach in 2021 and her 28th overall season as a head coach at the collegiate level. She arrived at NSU prior to the 2019 season with more than 20 years of head coaching experience at a pair of Division I HBCUs.

Bullock has led the Spartans the past two seasons, including during the 2020-21 academic year when the season was shifted to the spring but was cut short due to COVID-19 protocols after just six matches. NSU did secure an upset of George Mason at the start of the spring season, and Paola Matos was later named to the MEAC All-Rookie Team.

Before coming to NSU, Bullock spent the 2018 campaign at Winston-Salem State and the 2017 season at Greensboro College. She also led turnarounds as the head coach at Tennessee State for 13 seasons from 2004-16 and at her alma mater North Carolina A&T from 1994-2003.

WSSU went 16-15 overall and 14-4 in the CIAA during her one season there, advancing to the semifinals of the CIAA Championship. She coached a pair of All-CIAA performers. Bullock led Greensboro College to a 14-14 record during her one season there in 2017, coaching one USA South Athletic Conference All-East Division honoree.

Bullock is the all-time winningest coach at Tennessee State with 177 victories. She led the Tigers to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2007.

TSU captured its first-ever Ohio Valley Conference championship in 2007 after also leading the Tigers to the OVC regular season championship in 2005. She was named the OVC Coach of the Year in '05 after setting program records for most overall (22-11) and league wins (14-2).

Tennessee State finished with three 20-win seasons and seven overall winning seasons – the only seven in program history – during her time with the Tigers. Her second season with the program, when the Tigers went 22-11, marked a 17-win improvement from her first season. That stood as the largest turnaround in NCAA Division I that season. She also won 20 games in 2006 and '07.

Bullock's overall record in 27 seasons stands at 372-454, including 162 wins in 10 seasons at North Carolina A&T.

### HEAD COACH JODY BROWN



Jody Brown enters his sixth season as head women's volleyball coach at North Carolina Central University with the start of the fall 2021 season.

In his first season at NCCU, Brown returned the Lady Eagles to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Volleyball Championship after missing postseason the year before his arrival to Durham. The Lady Eagles have then qualified for the MEAC Championship tournament in each of his first five seasons at NCCU.

In 2019, Brown helped NCCU win its most matches since 2012. The seven victories in conference play that season is the most since the Lady Eagles joined

the MEAC in 2011.

He coached one CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree (Erika Ianova-le), three CoSIDA Academic All-District selections (Kelsey Murphy, Erika Ianova-le, Jessica Pilivi), one MEAC Player of the Week (Casey Curran), three

MEAC Setters of the Week (Paige Phillips, Celene Morris x2), two MEAC Defensive Specialists of the Week (Bree Simmons, Arlanda Faulkner) and five MEAC Rookies of the Week (Da'Nesha Miller, Christine Alcox, Arlanda Faulkner x2, Alyssa Pieh) to go along with 33 MEAC All-Academic honorees in his four seasons at NCCU.

Brown joined the NCCU athletics department with 17 years of Division I coaching experience at Florida Atlantic University, where he made three NCAA Tournament appearances. He brought 225 career wins to his credit and the Owls posted 10 or more victories in 14 of his 17 years at Florida Atlantic (NCCU has not had a 10-win season since 2007).

In his time at Florida Atlantic, Brown qualified for 11 postseason tournaments and won three conference championships. He has mentored two All-America honorees, three league players of the year, 33 all-conference selections and 140 academic all-conference student-athletes.

Brown was named Atlantic Sun Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after leading the Owls to a 29-3 record. Brown, who holds the all-time career coaching wins total at FAU, has been recognized by the AVCA for reaching the 200-career wins milestone mark.

Barnes comes to S.C. State after serving as head coach at Malcolm X Junior College (NJCAA Division I), prior to that she coached at Indiana University Northwest and Prairie State College in Chicago Heights, Ill., where she held the same position.

She spent three seasons at Chicago State University (CSU), on the Cougars' coaching staff, where Barnes served as the interim head coach for CSU in 2014

and won their first home tournament in the program's Division I history, while producing 10 Academic All-WAC selections.
