• MEAC softball begins week six as conference play highlights the ledger in the Northern Division. The Southern Division will begin MEAC play next weekend.

• The Hampton Lady Pirates and the Florida A&M Lady Rattlers were predicted to win the MEAC softball Northern and Southern Divisions, respectively. Delaware State was picked to finish second behind the Lady Pirates in a tight race as they received 10 first-place votes and 153 total points. Pollsters predicted another showdown between FAMU and rival Bethune-Cookman as the Wildcats were picked second after receiving 10 first-place votes and 130 total points.

• Bethune-Cookman was on fire last week with a league-best 6-2 record while Hampton logged a 4-3 record including wins over Virginia of the ACC. Morgan State finished 3-1 while NCCU had a 2-0 mark.

• Morgan State's **Damali Young** leads the MEAC with a .491 average. Preseason Player of the Year **Ryan Jackson** of Bethune-Cookman has 31 hits, 27 runs, 23 RBIs and 10 home runs.

• **Courtney Mirabella** of North Carolina Central is obliterating opposing batters with 106 strikeouts 14 games played. Her 20 strikeouts in a 4-0 win over Maryland Eastern Shore was one strikeout shy of the NCAA Division I record for strikeouts in a regulation seven-inning game. Preseason Pitcher of the Year **Amy Begg** follows with 53.

• The 2018 MEAC Tournament takes place once again in Ormond Beach, Fla. as Bethune-Cookman will host the tournament.

MEAC Softball Weekly Honors

Bethune-Cookman's Ryan Jackson was selected as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Softball Player of the Week, the conference announced today. **North Carolina Central's Courtney Mirabella** was named Pitcher of the Week while **Victoria Guzman of Bethune-Cookman** earned Rookie of the Week honors.

Jackson (OF, So., Chino Hills, Calif.) led Bethune-Cookman's offense with a .435 average (10-of-23) while driving in 10 RBIs and scoring 10 runs. She also flexed her muscles at the plate with a total of five home runs en route to a 1.217 slugging percentage. Jackson also stole four bases as she finished with a .567 on-base percentage.

Mirabella (P, Sr., Bradenton, Fla.) tossed two complete-game shutouts with 34 combined strikeouts. Her 20 strikeouts in a 4-0 win over Maryland Eastern Shore was one strikeout shy of the NCAA Division I record for strikeouts in a regulation seven-inning game. She followed it up with 14 more strikeouts in a one-hit gem against Southern, a 3-0 victory.

Guzman (P, Fr., San Jose, Calif.) finished the week with a 2-0 record and 3.21 ERA while striking out a total of 13 batters. She picked up wins versus Holy Cross and Army in addition to a save versus South Dakota State. Opposing batters hit a total of .196 against Guzman as BCU finished with a 6-2 mark.

Other Top Performers (March 5-11)

Allison Babinsack (Hampton) picked up a win and save in a home doubleheader sweep over the University of Virginia. She combined for 10 strikeouts on the week.

Amy Begg (Morgan State) struck out 20 batters en route to a 2-1 record. She struck out 11 batters in an 8-1 win over Saint Peter's.

Alexis Bermudez (Bethune-Cookman) did not allow an earned run in BCU's eight-inning loss against San Diego State as she struck out five batters and scattered four hits with three unearned runs in the extra inning loss.

Nia Bowe (Coppin State) recorded a .375 average with seven total bases.

Kyaira Brown (Florida A&M) struck out 20 batters with a win in five appearances. Brown also combined for three hits on the offensive side of the plate.

Ava Dolan (North Carolina Central) extended her hit streak to eight games following a pair of wins over Maryland Eastern Shore and Southern.

Brooklyn Emory (Howard) hit a pair of home runs in contests versus New Mexico and St. Mary's.

Hunter Halford (Norfolk State) recorded 12 hits and two home runs while batting .414 and drawing seven walks.

Tuli Iosefa (Norfolk State) batted .300 while driving in five RBIs with nine hits.

Desiree Moreno (Delaware State) went 7-for-15 (.467) with two home runs and four RBIs while also scoring six runs.

Breanna Robinson (Howard) batted .273 with three hits, two runs and two RBI.

Alana VanDenberg (Hampton) finished the week with a .316 average while compiling seven RBI, six hits, three runs and two stolen bases.

Lauren Williams (Florida A&M) went 8-of-22 with three doubles and five RBIs. Finished 4-for-5 with a double and two RBI versus Radford.

Damali Young (Morgan State) led Morgan State to a 3-1 mark with a .615 average while recording eight hits, six runs and two RBI. Finished 4-for-4 in a shutout over St. Bonaventure.

MEAC ANNOUNCES SOFTBALL PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) has announced that Morgan State's Amy Begg has been selected as the conference's Preseason Pitcher of the Year while Bethune-Cookman's Ryan Jackson was tabbed Preseason Player of the Year. Ten institutions were represented on the team led by Bethune-Cookman's five selections. Delaware State, Florida A&M and Maryland Eastern Shore each had three selections while Hampton, Morgan State and North Carolina A&T State had two apiece.

All preseason honors were voted on by the conference's head coaches and sports information directors.

A senior from Christchurch, New Zealand, Begg led the MEAC with 179 strikeouts and 20 wins on the mound as she posted a 2.31 ERA in 2017. A five-time MEAC Pitcher of the Week, Begg also led the league with seven shutouts and finished second in opponent batting average (.227). In her three-year career at Morgan State, Begg has amassed a total of 389 strikeouts.

Jackson was named the MEAC's Player and Rookie of the Year in 2017 as she led the MEAC in batting average (.408), home runs (14), RBIs (47), total bases (118), on-base percentage (.483) and slugging percentage (.771). A three-time MEAC Player of the Week and two-time Rookie of the Week, the Chino Hills, Calif. native was also named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division I National Freshman of the Year Top 25.

The 2018 season begins on Friday, Feb. 9 with the first conference matchup scheduled for March 17. The MEAC Tournament returns to Ormond Beach, Fla. and begins on May 9.
